

Alliance Ohio Sept 5 1892

Council met in regular session with President Wilson in the chair and the following members present. Brinker Buck Bush Cowan Crumbaugh Devine Kayler Love Wilson. Absent Earley Goble Jenkins.

The Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved. A petition from residents of the 6th ward asking for the location of a fire hydrant at the corner of Arch and State Streets was referred to the Street Committee with instructions to report at next meeting.

A Petition signed by property owners on Ely Street between Park Street and the west corporation line asking that Council reconsider their action taken with reference to the macadamizing of said Ely Street between said points and to defer such improvement until such time as the street can be paved. was presented and on motion of Brinker seconded by Bush the same was referred to the Street Committee with instructions to report at next meeting.

On motion of Brinker seconded by Bush it was agreed that when Council adjourns it be to meet on Wednesday evening Sept 7th

A number of bills against the City having been approved by the proper Committees were read and Brinker moved that there be an Ordinance prepared providing for their payment and the same be read. Seconded by Kayler and Carried.

Reading of

passage of
Claims ordinance

On Motion of Brinker seconded by Bush there was apportioned from unapportioned money in the Treasury to the General fund the sum of \$45⁰⁰ and to the Street fund \$100⁰⁰

The Claims ordinance being prepared was read and Brinker moved the final passage of the same seconded by Kayler and Carried. Yeas Brinker Buck Bush Cowan Crumbaugh Devine Kayler Love Wilson. Yeas 9 nays 0. and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Attention was called to the bad condition

on N. Freedom

of the sidewalk on north Freedom Street
near the intersection of Freedom and
Walnut Street and on motion of Brinker
seconded by Kayler the matter was
referred to the Street and Sidewalk Committees

Pertaining to
Cleaning up the
City as a sanitary
measure

Attention was then called
to the necessity of cleaning up the streets
and alleys of the city as a sanitary measure
in anticipation of the threatened Cholera Epidemic
and on motion of Brinker seconded by
Bush the matter was referred to the Street
Committee with instructions to give the
same immediate attention and to report at
next meeting an estimate of the amount of
money necessary to do the work.

" DeWine moved that there be a
Committee of three ^{members of Council} appointed to act with the
Board of Health in having the entire city
cleaned up and placed in a good sanitary
condition seconded by Brinker and carried
and President Wilson appointed DeWine, Love
and Lowan as said Committee.

" and on motion of Brinker the committee was
instructed to report ^{or recommend} at next meeting any
legislation they found necessary by council to
assist them in their work.

" And on motion of Brinker the above committee
was instructed to consider the propriety of
employing a sanitary policeman and
if thought necessary to so report at next
meeting and to suggest some suitable person
to act as such and the price at which to
be employed.

No further business Council adjourned
