

Alliance Ohio November 21 1892

Council met in regular session with President Wilson in the chair and the following members present. Brinker Buck Leowan Kumbough Devine Jenkins Earley Gabele Love. Absent. Bush and Kayler. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Remonstrance  
against Vacating  
Harrison Street

A Remonstrance against the proposed vacation of ten feet of the north side of Harrison Street signed by Geo Harrison R. W. Teters and J. J. Melany was read and on motion of Brinker seconded by Gabele the same was received and ordered placed on file.

Proposition  
from Mrs  
Weaver.

A Communication from Lucy S. Weaver owner of Lot # 895. at the North East corner of Linden ave and Broadway, asking that Council lower the sidewalk along the east side of said lot to the established grade transplant the shade trees and grade and sod the bank along the east lot line, and in consideration of the same being done agreeing to relinquish any and all claims for <sup>and</sup> damages she might have on account of the changing of the grade on said Linden avenue in the improvement of the same. was read and on motion of Love seconded by Brinker the same was referred to <sup>Special</sup> a committee of three, which was appointed by president Wilson consisting of Love Gabele and Jenkins.

Submission

add.

A proposed plat of an addition to the city by A. H. Clark consisting of certain land lying on the west side of Union Avenue and immediately south of Rudy's addition was presented to Council and on motion of Gabele seconded by Earley was referred to the platting Commission.

On motion of Devine, Earley was added to the committee appointed to look after the city's interest in the case of Merrick against the city.

Report of  
Finance Com

Report of Finance Committee called for and Brinker presented a bill for \$165<sup>00</sup> for expenses incurred by W<sup>m</sup> Brinker, W<sup>m</sup> Crumbaugh and J. W. Hull in defending an action against them, <sup>as Councilmen</sup> in the Common Pleas Court by Howard Patterson, in which it was alleged by said Patterson that said Brinker, Crumbaugh and Hull had made a certain contract with him in violation of law, and Brinker stated that the said Court had held that they had violated no law, and asked that Council pay the bill, and moved the same be allowed. Seconded by Buck. The Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Brinker Buck Crumbaugh Jenkins Love. Nays Cowan Devine Early Gable and Wilson. Yeas 5 nays 5 and the motion was declared lost.

A bill of Kelly and Daylor of Canton Ohio for \$120<sup>00</sup> for attorneys fees in the cases of Laughlin against the city, and the city against Pearsall, being for \$60<sup>00</sup> in each case was referred to the committees having said cases in charge.

A number of bills against the city having been approved by the proper committees were read and Brinker moved the same be allowed as read and that an Ordinance be prepared providing for their payment seconded by Devine and carried.

The Ordinance being prepared and there not being sufficient money in certain funds to pay the appropriations contained therein, Brinker moved that there be apportioned from any unapportioned money in the treasury to the General fund the sum of \$250<sup>00</sup>, to the Police and Salary fund \$100<sup>00</sup>, to the Street fund \$30<sup>00</sup> and to the Sanitary fund \$20<sup>00</sup>, seconded by Love and carried.

The Ordinance was then read and Brinker moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Jenkins the Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Brinker Buck Cowan Crumbaugh Devine Early Gable Jenkins Love Wilson. Yeas 10 nays 0, and the ordinance was declared passed.

Brinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. Resolved by the Council that all work on the streets be stopped for this

season unless by express order from the Council and that the clerk be instructed to notify the Street Commissioner of the passage of this resolution!" seconded by Love and carried yeas 10 nays 0.

Solicitor to

Brinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: "Resolved by The Council of the city of Alliance Ohio that the Solicitor be and he is hereby instructed to bring suit on two bonds in favor of the city one against Jacob Stohl and Wm Rommell and the other against Mrs Halm and Joseph Oyster". Buck seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 10 nays 0. and the same was declared adopted.

Illegal tax  
levied by  
Trustees

Brinker reported that the statement of the County Treasurer of the tax rate for 1842 showed a levy by the trustees of Lexington Tp of one mill in the city for township purposes which if correct was without warrant of law and on motion of Love the same was referred to the Solicitor to investigate and report.

Widen South  
Arch Street

The matter of widening South Arch Avenue at the fill along the property of R. F. Larr was on motion of Brinker referred to a committee of three and President Wilson appointed as said committee Brinker, Cornbough and Quinn.

Street Committee

Brinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. "Be it resolved that the street committee be instructed to repair and place gravel on South Union Avenue south of State Street to the corporation line and that there be apportioned from the unapportioned fund \$4000 to pay for the same." Yabell seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 10 nays 0 and the resolution was declared adopted.

Love offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. "Whereas it is the sense of the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio that the public

by the Council of said city of Alliance that the  
Commissioner of Railroads of the State of Ohio be

avenue. and that the Clerk be authorized and  
directed to certify a copy of this resolution to  
said Railroad Commissioner." Brinker  
seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays  
were called resulting yeas 10 nays 0. and the resolution  
was declared adopted.

Jenkins offered a similar resolution for the crossing

adoption. seconded by Buck and carried yeas 10 nays 0

The Judiciary Committee to  
whom had been referred the matter of repairing

in their opinion \$2500 would properly expended  
would place the same in passable condition  
and Brinker offered the following resolution  
and moved its adoption "Resolved that the  
Street Committee be instructed to repair  
East State Street East of Arch Street and that  
there be apportioned from the unapportioned fund  
\$2500 to pay the same." seconded by Buck  
and carried yeas 10 nays 0.

and the motion was declared lost.

C. P. Coffey
