

Council Chamber Alliance Ohio Dec 19, 1892

Council met in regular session
The President and Vice President both being
absent. The Clerk called Council to order and
on Motion of Brinker seconded by Love
Mr Jenkins was chosen Chairman Protem.
The roll was called and the following members
answered to their names. Brinker Bush
Cowan Cruborough Jenkins Kayler Love.
Bush and Gable arriving after the
reading of the minutes.

Remonstrance
against Vacating
Highland Park add.

A remonstrance against the vacation
of streets and alleys in Highland Park
addition as petitioned for August 22nd 1892
and signed by Anna H. A W and
St. St. Wagh and Arthur Wright was
read and on motion of Brinker
seconded by Cruborough the same was
received and ordered placed on file.

Clerk Collect
\$300 from trustees

Bush moved that the Clerk
be authorized to receive the Three Hundred
dollars from the township trustees which
the said trustees had agreed to pay the
city to be expended in improving South
Liberty Avenue. and place the same
to the Credit of the Liberty Avenue improvement
fund no 3. seconded by Kayler and
Carried

To reconsider
Vote on Noble
at grade.

Bush moved that the vote on
the resolution authorizing the Street Committee
to arrange with the School Board for the
grading of Noble Street (which was adopted
Oct 21, 1892) be reconsidered seconded
by Kayler and lost.

in regard to
sidewalks on
S. Arch at

Bush offered the following
resolution as an amendment to the resolution
offered at the previous meeting. with reference
to the location of sidewalks on South
Arch Avenue. Resolved by the council
of the city of Alliance that all sidewalks
hereafter laid on South Arch Avenue between
Milner and State Streets be placed

at a uniform distance of two feet from the property line.
 " Biick moved the adoption of the amendment seconded by Brunker ^{The yeas and nays were called resulting} ~~and Carried~~ Yeas Brunker Buck Cowan Crumbaugh Jenkins Love. Nays Bush Gabel Kayler. Yeas 6 nays 3. and the amendment was declared adopted.
 " The yeas and nays were ^{then} called on the original resolution as amended resulting Yeas Brunker Buck Cowan Crumbaugh Jenkins Love. Nays Bush Gabel Kayler. Yeas 6 nays 3 and the resolution was declared adopted.

A resolution requiring the owners of lot # 84 @ Peters addition. Newm 566, to construct a sidewalk on the east side of said lot was read and Bush moved the adoption of the same seconded by Gabel and Carried Yeas Brunker Buck Bush Cowan Crumbaugh Gabel Jenkins Kayler Love. Yeas 9 nays 0.

Brunker moved that the Clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for street lighting to commence April 1st 1893. bids to be received for a three years also bids for five years for such number of arc lights of a nominal two thousand candle power and as many as the city council may see fit to order the said lights to be lighted for six months each year twenty nights per month commencing April first and run until Oct first and from Oct 1st to April 1st to be lighted every night. all lights to be lighted from dusk to midnight and bids to be received until one o'clock p M Jan 16. 1893.

seconded by Buck Bush moved to amend by having a committee of three appointed to prepare plans and specifications upon which to receive said bids. seconded by Kayler and Carried

The roll was then called on the motion as amended resulting Yeas. Buck Bush Gabel Jenkins Kayler Love Nays Brunker Crumbaugh Cowan. Yeas 6 nays 3. and the motion as amended was declared Carried

Brunker moved that the light committee be instructed to notify the street RR Co to discontinue all street lights which they are unable to keep burning in accordance

with the contract. seconded by Bush and Carried.

Repair lights
in Mayor's office

On Motion of Bush seconded by Brinker the Clerk was instructed to notify the Street R.R. Co to have the incandescent lights in the city hall put in good order.

Petition against
indecent show
bills

A Petition from the W.C.T.U. and Lucy Hayes Union of Sixth Ward signed by Mrs Marion King and Mrs R. N. Rice as presidents of said associations asking Council to take the necessary steps to suppress the posting of indecent show bills and posters ^{in the city} was presented and on Motion of Bush seconded by Kayser the same was referred to the Judiciary Committee and Solicitor to prepare an Ordinance in compliance with the request of the petitioners.

Location of
Stable

Love Moved that the vote on the Motion to locate a stable for the horse used by the fire Dept at the South end of the city Hall be reconsidered seconded by Brinker and Carried. Love then moved that the motion be so amended that the stable be located on the west side of the city Hall. seconded by Labell and Carried.

Cemetery Vault

Bush moved that the Cemetery Committee be instructed to confer with the Cemetery Trustees as to the practicability of building a receiving Vault in the Cemetery and suggest plans and specifications and report result of conclusions to Council.
