

Council Chamber Alliance O. Feb 6" 1893

Council met in regular session with President Wilson in the Chair and the following members present. Brinker Buck Bush Cowan Kernbough Devine Early Gabel Kayler Love Absent Junkins.

Minutes of preceding meetings read and approved.

Light bids

Bids for Lighting the streets of the city having been received this day were submitted as follows:

Bid of Mutual Electric Light Co for 2000 Candle power Lamps 54 or more Lamps to be Lighted at dusk and burn until midnight each and every night during the year for the sum of six dollars per month each

6 or more 2000 candle power arcs from dusk until daylight for ten dollars per month each.

Second Proposition for 2000 Candle power arc Lights.

54 or more 2000 candle power Lamps to be Lighted from dusk until midnight from April 1<sup>st</sup> until Oct 1<sup>st</sup> Each year 20 nights per month at \$5<sup>00</sup> per month each and from Oct 1<sup>st</sup> until April 1<sup>st</sup> Each year for six dollars per month to be lighted each and every Night until midnight.

All night and every night lights at \$10<sup>00</sup> per month each All night and every night for 20 nights per month \$6<sup>00</sup> each This proposition for a period of five years

Proposition 1200 candle power arc Lights For those lighted at dusk and run until ~~midnight~~ daylight each and every night \$8<sup>00</sup> per month.

For those lighted at dusk and run until midnight each and every night \$5<sup>00</sup> per month

For those lighted at dusk and run until midnight 20 nights each night month \$4<sup>00</sup> per month.

" 34 more or less 2000 c.p. arc lights to burn from dark until midnight 20 nights per month. price per lamp per month \$5<sup>00</sup>

Brinker moved that the above bids be referred to a special committee of three to report on same at next meeting seconded by Bush and carried. President Wilson appointed as said committee Brinker Divine and Lernbaugh.

Report of expenses

The clerk reported as having expended for witness fees and expenses in the trial of Mrs Campbell against the city the sum of \$62 <sup>40</sup>/<sub>100</sub> and presented an itemized account of same and that there remained in his hands the sum of \$37<sup>60</sup> of the \$100<sup>00</sup> appropriated for that purpose. Brinker moved the report be accepted and that the balance be allowed to remain in the hands of the clerk to defray expenses in the Waithrow trial. seconded by Buck and carried.

The Mayor reported fines and licenses collected during the month of January to the amount of \$143<sup>45</sup> and on motion of Gable seconded by Divine the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Ordinances

A number of bills against the city having been approved by the proper committees were read and Brinker moved that they be allowed as read and that an Ordinance be prepared providing for their payment seconded by Kayler and carried

Brinker moved that there be apportioned from any unapportioned money in the treasury to the Police and Salary fund \$80<sup>00</sup> and to the general fund \$10<sup>00</sup> seconded by Love and Carried

The Ordinance for the payment of the bills being prepared was read and Brinker moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Kayler and Carried. Yeas Brinker Buck Bush Cowan Crumbaugh Devine Earley Goble Kayler Love Wilson Yeas 11 nays 0

Bills referred

A bill of Geo McFarland for burying dogs was referred to the Police Committee and one for bounding prisoners to the Judiciary Committee and a bill for repairs to the lock up to the Buildings and Grounds Committee

Repair Sidewalks

Attention was called to bad Sidewalks one on north Freedom Street near the R.R. Crossing and one at the corner of Keystone and North Walnut Street and the same was referred to the Sidewalk Committee with power to act. and the necessity of having a crossing on Union Avenue at the intersection of College Street was referred to the Street Committee to report at next meeting.

Brinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

Be it resolved by the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio. that the Street Committee be instructed to build a catch basin at the intersection of Milner Street and the alley just west of Arch Street and repair the alley so as to keep the water from washing out the same and that there be apportioned \$25<sup>00</sup> from the unapportioned to pay the same. Buck seconded the resolution to adopt. Devine moved to amend

seconded by Early. The yeas and nays  
were called on the motion to amend  
resulting Yeas Brinker, Buck, Bush, Cowan,  
Carrubagh, Devine, Early, Gable, Kayler,  
Love, Wilson. Yeas 11 nays 0. The motion  
to amend was declared carried and  
the yeas and nays called on the  
resolution as amended resulting yeas  
Brinker, Buck, Bush, Cowan, Carrubagh,  
Devine, Kayler, Wilson. Nays Early,  
Gable, Love. Yeas 8 Nays 3. and the resolution  
as amended was declared adopted.

Devine moved that the Mayor be

seconded by Brinker and carried.

Resignation of

A communication from F. M. Stanley

fire Dept. to take effect March 1<sup>st</sup> was  
presented and on motion of Kayler seconded  
by Brinker the same was accepted.  
and the matter of securing a man to  
fill the vacancy was referred to the fire  
committee.

Kayler reported that Mr Stanley  
desired to sell the horse now used in the  
fire Dept. and the question of purchasing  
was on motion of Love referred to the fire  
committee.

Report of Water

The Water Committee made the

water works company as being completed beg  
leave to report that it is the opinion of your  
committee that the work of the extension  
has not been satisfactorily completed  
inasmuch as sec. second. sec. third  
sec. fifth and sixth of the contract  
have not been complied with

to have the sidewalks in front of the two school  
houses on Broadway cleaned of snow and ice.
