

Alliance Ohio. Feb 13th 1893

City Council met pursuant to adjournment with President Wilson in the chair and Members all present.

The committee to whom had been referred the sewerage question submitted the following report:

Report of Sewer
Committee

To the city Council. We your committee to whom was referred the sewer question met with the sewer commission consisting of Messrs Jany, Leantine, and Parthe and jointly offer the following: Whereas the sanitary conditions of our city are such ^{that} we deem it advisable to construct a system of sanitary sewerage. Therefore be it resolved that we adopt a sanitary system of sewerage for the city and recommend that a special election be called for March 11th 1893 for the purpose of voting on the question of issuing sewer bonds to the amount of thirty thousand dollars in accordance with an act passed by the 69th general assembly no 1771 and only such amount of bonds to be sold as we recommended by the sewer commission to construct the main sewers signed A B Love, J. C. Drvine, C H Bush.

Love moved the adoption of the above report seconded by Jenkins. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Brinker, Buck, Bush, Cowan, Lambough, Drvine, Jenkins, Kayler, Love, Wilson, Stays Early, Yeas 10 nays 0 and the report was declared adopted.

Brinker moved that the clerk be instructed to prepare an ordinance providing for the payment of the balance due said water works company viz \$673⁷⁵ seconded by Buck. The yeas and nays were called on the motion resulting yeas Brinker Buck Cornbough Drvine Jenkins Love Wilson. Nays Bush Leowan Early Gabel Kayler. Yeas 7 nays 5

The motion was declared carried and the ordinance being prepared was read and Brinker moved that the same be placed on its passage seconded by Buck. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Brinker Buck Cornbough Drvine Jenkins Love Wilson Nays Bush Leowan Early Gabel Kayler. Yeas 7 nays 5 and the ordinance was declared adopted

a levy for the payment of the sewer
bonds and the interest thereon should the
same be issued.

Brinker moved that there be
a committee appointed to investigate and
report the manner in which the
special election to vote on the sewer
question shall be held so as to make
it legal seconded by Buck and carried.
