Council met in regular session with President Wilson in the Chair and members all present except Carley. The minutes of preceding meetings were read and approved. The Mayor's report of fines and licenses to the amount of \$918<sup>00</sup> collected during the month of March was read and on motion of Brinker accepted and ordered placed on file.

Brinker of the Finance Committee reported a bill of \$84<sup>00</sup> in favor of the County Board of Elections <sup>for tickets and Ball books for April Election</sup> and reported that in his opinion the amount was excessive and the bill was referred to the Judiciary Committee

A number of bills against the city having been approved by the proper Committees were read and Brinker moved that the bills as read be allowed and paid and that an Ordinance providing for their payment be prepared. seconded by Goble and carried

On motion of Brinker seconded by Goble there was apportioned from any unapportioned money in the Treasury to the Salary fund \$65<sup>00</sup> and to the Street fund \$31<sup>00</sup>

The bills ordinance being prepared was read and Bush moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Buck. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Brinker Buck Bush Brown Kern bough Drove Goble Jenkins Snyder Love Wilson Yeas 11 nays 0. and the ordinance was declared passed

 be instructed to report all grade Ordinances  
 that have been ordered up to this date.

 and nays were called resulting yeas 11 nays 0

Proposition  
 of L. E. Chapin

A communication having been received  
 from Mr. L. E. Chapin Civil Engineer  
 modifying his proposition to superintend the  
 construction of the proposed system of Sewerage  
 to read as follows: "One hundred and thirty five  
 dollars per month time to commence when  
 the first contract is let and to terminate at  
 any time thereafter on ten days notice from  
 your honorable City Council" This being the  
 modification asked by Council at a former  
 meeting no further objection was raised and  
 the proposition was considered accepted as provided  
 by a resolution adopted March 22"

Bridges  
Committee

and the resolution was declared adopted  
Brinker moved that there be a  
committee appointed look after the question  
of the proposed bridges for which the city voted  
to issue bonds seconded by Gabele and carried  
and President Wilson appointed as said committee

Ordinance  
to prohibit  
indecent  
show bills

An Ordinance to prohibit the posting of indecent  
show bills. was read second time and Jenkins  
moved the rules be suspended and the ordinance  
be read third seconded by Brinker and carried  
Yeas 11 nays 0. The ordinance was read third time  
and the yeas and nays called on the final passage  
resulting yeas Brinker Buck Bush Cowan  
Crubough Devine Gabele Jenkins Gabele Love  
Wilson Yeas 11 nays 0 and the Ordinance was  
declared passed.

The Street committee to whom had been  
referred the question of the franchise for the extension  
of the Street Railway reported as follows:

To the Council of the City of Alliance  
Ohio Gentlemen we your committee  
to whom was referred the petition of the

Sciama Street R R Co for the grant of  
a franchise for the extension of their  
line on certain streets in the City beg  
leave to report as follows:

That we would recommend that the franchise  
be granted subject to the same terms and  
conditions contained in an ordinance passed  
July 31<sup>st</sup> 1888. granting said Street R R Co  
a franchise for the use of certain streets except  
that the City shall be at no expense for grading  
any street until the necessary legislation is had  
for the improvement of such street by the city  
and that all such extensions shall be completed  
and in full operation within one year from the  
time the franchise for the same is granted.

That said R.R. Co be granted the privilege  
to replace the rails now laid on its line with  
a girder rail to be laid in a good and  
workmanlike manner to the satisfaction of the  
street committee of Council. and further  
that said <sup>Street</sup> R.R. Co shall enter into a good  
and sufficient bond in the sum of \$500000  
for the faithful performance of the provisions  
of said franchise." On Motion of

Lova seconded by Jenkins the report was adopted  
and on motion of Brinker seconded  
by Kayler the Street Committee was instructed  
to prepare an ordinance providing for the  
granting of said franchise and report the  
same at next meeting.

The Clerk reported the result of the  
election on April 3. on the proposition submitted  
to issue bonds for street improvements as follows:

A Petition signed by Rachel L  
 Amernman and M. S. Shimp asking that Council  
 take the necessary steps to open the alley between  
 lots #. 2103 and 2104 on Union Avenue leading  
 east from Union Avenue to an alley and so much  
 of the latter alley as lies between the section line  
 alley and the first mentioned alley. was presented  
 and referred to the Street Committee

We the undersigned property holders of South Seneca  
 Avenue Alliance Ohio thinking it necessary that  
 said street be improved between Grant and  
 Milner Streets do hereby petition that aforesaid part  
 of said street be put to grade as soon as  
 possible. This petition is signed on the following  
 conditions:- 1<sup>st</sup> That we be allowed to pay for said  
 improvement in two equal annual payments  
 2<sup>nd</sup> That the grade at present established be maintained  
 3<sup>rd</sup> That the cost of said grading shall not exceed  
 twenty (20) cents per foot front

4<sup>th</sup> That the City pay for Street and alley crossings  
 and for constructing the necessary culverts.

Weybrecht to  
build Coal  
Vault

On Motion of Bush seconded by Kayler  
 J. T. Weybrecht was granted permission to  
 occupy the sidewalk in front of his  
 property on East Main Street for building

Reeves Bros granted permit to construct switch  
 a coal vault. On motion of Love seconded by Jenkins. Reeves Bros were granted permission to construct a sidetrack or switch across Rush Street to their proposed works. and on motion of Kayler seconded by Devine the Street Committee was instructed to prepare an ordinance providing for the granting of the same.

Williams granted permit to grade west Grant st  
 Brinker moved that Mr Williams be granted permission to put west Grant Street to grade for a distance of 200 feet west of Union Avenue and have the dirt under the supervision of the Street Committee. seconded by Bush and carried.

Report of Committee on Street R.R. franchise  
 Bush of the Street Committee to whom had been referred the matter of granting the Street R.R. an extension of franchise reported that to conform to the law on the subject it would be necessary for the city to advertise for bids for such franchise and moved that the Clerk and Solicitor be instructed to advertise for same as provided by law seconded by Brinker and carried Yeas 11 nays 0.

Report of Cemetery Committee  
 Isabelle of the Cemetery Committee reported that the books of the trustees had been examined and straightened up as far as possible and recommended that the necessary steps be taken to have a vault built, and that hereafter the Cemetery trustees be required to be more accurate and to conduct their affairs according to law and the ordinance governing them.

Committee to examine Gygolz building  
 Bush reported that the building on East Main Street known as the Gygolz building was in bad condition the east wall being in danger of falling and moved that a committee of three be appointed to investigate and report at next meeting seconded by Devine and carried.  
 West Wilson appointed as said Committee Bush Bush and Isabelle

This being the last meeting of the present Council  
 the minutes were read and approved and  
 after remarks by the retiring members and  
 president Wilson expressing thanks to the members  
 for courteous treatment &c. Devine moved a  
 vote of thanks be tendered President Wilson  
 seconded by Buck and carried.
