

Council Chamber Alliance Ohio May 15<sup>th</sup> 1843

Council met in regular session with President Wilson in the Chair. The Clerk being absent. Mr Davidson was chosen Clerk pro tem. The roll was called and the following members answered to their names. Buck Bush Conyer Leabough Davidson Devine Harris Love Williams Wilson. Absent Cowan Gabele.

On Motion of Devine the reading of the minutes was dispensed with

Grade on  
Washington st

A petition from property owners on Washington Street asking for sidewalk grade was on motion of Bush referred to the grade committee

for Light  
on Union Ave

A petition from residents of the first ward asking for a light at the intersection of Union Avenue and Vine Street was referred to the Light committee.

report on  
alley at alley

Davidson reported as to the condition of the alley between Patterson and Noble streets being in filthy condition and that some of the buildings were on the alley and on motion of Love the matter was referred to the street committee

Throw out  
sidewalks

Bush reported bad condition of the sidewalks on Linden Avenue south of Oxford and on his motion they were ordered thrown out in front of two lots and on Motion of Harris the walk in front of the Salvation Army Barracks on Broadway was ordered thrown out.

Frank sewer

The Sewer Committee made the following report: "We the committee to whom was referred the matter pertaining to the Frank sewer beg leave to report that the sewer be continued to Arch Street and that there be four catch basins placed thereon at an estimated cost not to exceed Two Hundred dollars" signed J. C. Devine C. H. Bush A. B. Love. On Motion of Love yes 10 nays 0 the report was adopted and on motion of Bush the Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the extension of said sewer in accordance with the report

The Police committee made the following report: To the Council We the

Report of Police  
Committee on  
Sanitary Police

Police Committee to whom was referred the matter of Sanitary Policeman by leave to report  
 1<sup>st</sup> That we do not with the present condition of the City's finances deem it expedient to employ a special Sanitary Policeman. 2<sup>nd</sup> That we favor making it a part of the duty of the regular Police force, by additional ordinances if necessary to report the violations of sanitary regulations, and to assist in their enforcement. To this end we favor if necessary excusing some member of the police force from regular police duty a portion of the time. 3<sup>d</sup> We further favor calling on all citizens of Alliance through the city press to report to the Board of Health any nuisances or violations of sanitary regulations that may come under their notice. Signed H W Harris J W Buck  
 Police Committee. On motion of Bush the report was adopted and on motion of Harris the Clerk was instructed to notify the Sanitary policeman Mr Anderson that his services as such Policeman would be dispensed with from and after May 17<sup>th</sup> 1893.

Report of Printing  
Committee.

The Printing Committee submitted the following report: "The printing committee desire to report as follows in the matter of the city printery: We favor the acceptance of the following proposition made to your committee in writing by the Standard Review Publishing Co: Alliance May 15<sup>th</sup> 1893  
 Printing Committee Alliance City Council Gentlemen. We hereby agree to publish all legal enactments of your body for the ensuing year at seven-tenths of the rate authorized by law. We will publish all Ordinances sales of bonds etc in the Daily without charge and when desired will call attention in the local columns to the sale of bonds advertising for bids etc. Respectfully submitted".

 Printing Committee". Bush moved the adoption  
 of the report the yeas and nays were called  
 resulting yeas Buck Bush Conger Crubaugh  
 Harris Love Williams Wilson Gray Davidson  
 Devine. yeas 8 nays 2 and the resolution  
 was declared adopted.

Passage of  
 ordinance to  
 protect wires

An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance  
 to protect Police Patrol and fire Alarm boxes, wire  
 poles and apparatus and and other wires  
 Erected and maintained by the authority of  
 Council" was read first time and under a  
 suspension of the rules yeas 10 nays 0 the ordinance  
 was read second and third times. Love called  
 attention to the provisions of section four of the  
 ordinance relating to the removal of wires for  
 the purpose of moving buildings and on motion  
 of Bush that portion of said section which provides  
 that the party moving a building shall be at the  
 expense of the removal of such wire was stricken  
 out. The yeas and nays were called on the passage  
 of the ordinance as amended by striking out  
 said clause resulting yeas Buck Bush  
 Conger Davidson Devine Harris Love Williams  
 Wilson Gray Crubaugh. yeas 9 nays 1  
 and the ordinance was declared passed.

It was then agreed that when Council  
 adjourns it be to meet Monday evening  
 May 22.

Jenkins Add

Bush presented a plat of Jenkins  
 proposed addition to the city lying in the third  
 ward, <sup>to which</sup> attention had been called at the preceding  
 meeting. and on motion of Harris the same was  
 accepted. and on motion of Bush the Salicitor  
 was instructed to prepare an ordinance for the same.

Flag

Bush offered the following resolution which was adopted  
 "Be it resolved that it is the sense of this Council that the flag and streamer  
 recently presented to the city by the Men of War Alliance be placed in care  
 of the Grand Army part of Alliance and by them taken care of subject  
 to the orders of the City Council". Council then adjourned to meet  
 Monday evening May 22"
