

Council Chamber. Alliance Ohio May 22. 1893

Council met in adjourned session with president Wilson presiding and the following members present. Buck Bush Conger Cowan Crubaugh Devine Gabele Harris Love Williams Absent Davidson. Minutes of preceding meetings read and approved.

Engineers
report on the
Funk Sewer

The report of the engineer on the extension of the so called Funk Sewer showing plan and estimated cost of same said cost being estimated at three hundred and ten dollars was presented and on motion of Devine seconded by Gabele was ordered placed on file and on motion of Devine seconded by Gabele the Sewer Committee was instructed to advertise for bids for such extension in accordance with said plan.

report of Light
Committee

The Light Committee to whom had been referred the petition for a light at the intersection of North Union Avenue and Vine Street reported that owing to the condition of the finances of the light fund it would be impossible to grant the request of the petitioners at this time and on motion of Buck the report was adopted.

engineer set
sidewalk stakes

On motion of Gabele the engineer was instructed to give H. C. McQuire the grade for sidewalk in front of his property on South Freedom Avenue.

Petition for grade
on Lincoln Ave

A Petition signed by residents of the first ward asking that there be a grade established on ~~City~~ Lincoln Avenue from Ely Street to Vine Street was referred to the Grade Committee to report an Ordinance for same.

Marshal to
serve notices
on Market st

On Motion of Love seconded by Harris the Marshal was instructed to serve notice on property owners on Market Street between Arch and Union Avenues of the passage by Council of a resolution to improve said Market Street between said points.

furnish numbers
of lots

On Motion of Devine the Platting Committee was instructed to furnish the Clerk with the numbers of lots in new additions which were not shown on the map.

repair
Beech Street

Devine referred to certain property on Beech Street being damaged by water from the street and the matter was referred to the Street Committee.

Bid of Street
R.R. Co for
franchise

The city having advertised for bids for the granting of a franchise for the constructing and operating a street railway on certain streets throughout the city, the Alliance Street R.R. Company having petitioned for the same, and the said Alliance Street R.R. Co having submitted a bid for such franchise the same was read, and Mr Hazzard president of said Company being present, stated that in presenting their petition or application for franchise certain requirements had been omitted and asked permission to withdraw their application and also their bid for franchise, and on motion of Bush seconded by Conger the permission to withdraw said application and bid was granted.

On motion of Bush seconded by Conger it was agreed that when council adjourns it be to meet Monday evening May 29th

To scrape
streets

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption "Be it resolved that it is the sense of this Council that the Street Commissioner be and is hereby instructed to scrape and otherwise put in good ~~shape~~ passable condition for travel the road to the cemetery viz: Union Avenue from Main to Wayne Streets, Wayne to Lincoln Avenue, Lincoln Avenue to the Cemetery. The work to be done on or before the 29th" Devine seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 11 nays 0, and the resolution was declared adopted.

appointment
of committee
in Kaggy
Case

Bush offered the following and moved its adoption: "Be it resolved that it is the sense of this Council that a committee of three be appointed to look after the interest of the city in the case of Mrs Kaggy vs the city" Devine seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 11 nays 0. The resolution was declared adopted, and president Wilson appointed as said committee Bush, Crabung and Gabel.

Invitation of
G. A. R.

Mayor Excell reported to Council that the G. A. R. had authorized him to extend an invitation to Council to march with them in the procession on Decoration Day. and on motion of Devine seconded by Harris the invitation was accepted.

Sidewalk in
front of W. W. Webb's
property referred

Bush reported the bad condition of the sidewalk in front of W. W. Webb's property at the corner of Main and Arch Streets and moved the same be referred to the sidewalk committee seconded by Devine and carried

Devine moved that council adjourn seconded by Conger the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Conger Cowan Devine Gabelle Williams. Nays Buck Crutbaugh Harris Love Wilson. Yeas 6 nays 5. and President Wilson declared Council adjourned
