Market st

The report of Geo McFarland city Marshal of having served notice on property owners on Market Street of the passage by Council of resolution to improve said Market Street was submitted as follows:

State of Ohio Stark County S.S.
I, George McFarland being duly sworn say that I have served on each of the persons named below the following notice Viz: To ——— you are hereby notified that a resolution was adopted by the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio on the first day of August 1892 declaring it necessary to improve Market Street from Arch avenue to Union Avenue by grading the same paving the roadway with paving brick or other suitable material setting curb and gutter stones and constructing the necessary culverts and drains in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the office of the City Clerk at an estimated cost of Three dollars and ten cents (\$3.10) per foot front. The cost and expense of said improvement to be assessed per foot front upon the lots and lands abutting on said improvement payable in five annual installments.

The following resolution was then read Resolved that the City Clerk be and is hereby instructed to give ten days notice by publication in one or more newspapers of general circulation that the general plans of all sewers and the detail plats of sewers no 1 to 26 inclusive are on file in the office of the City Clerk for examination and inspection thereof. Love moved the adoption of the resolution seconded by Harris and carried yeas Bush Buck Bush Leuger Cowan Crumbach Davidson Devine Gubell Love Harris Williams Wilson Yeas 12 nays 0.

Passage

An Ordinance to issue \$20,000.00 of sewer bonds. was read first time and Bush moved the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read second time seconded by Harris the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Buck Bush Leuger Cowan Crumbach Davidson Devine Gubell Harris Love Williams Wilson Yeas 12 nays 0. The rules were declared suspended the ordinance was read second time and Leuger moved that the rules be again suspended and the ordinance be read third time seconded by Devine. The yeas and nays were called resulting same as before yeas 12 nays 0. The rules were declared suspended the ordinance was read third time and Devine moved the passage of the same seconded by Bush. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Buck Bush Leuger Cowan Crumbach Davidson Devine Gubell Harris Love Williams Wilson Yeas 12 nays 0 and the ordinance was declared passed

Light in 2nd ward

Devine called attention to the necessity of a Light being placed north of the water works in the second ward. and moved the same be referred to the Light Committee. seconded by Buck and carried.

Street R R
Ordinance

An Ordinance Granting the Alliance Street Railroad Company the right to extend its lines upon certain Streets in the City of Alliance Ohio and prescribing the manner terms and conditions upon ~~the~~ which the same shall be done" was read first time. and referred to the Judiciary and Street Committees.

Vote on Repeal
of Prohibitory
Ordinance

An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance to repeal an ordinance to prohibit all Beer and Porter houses and other places where intoxicating Liquors are sold at retail. was read third time and Conger moved the same be placed on its final passage seconded by Gabelle The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Conger Cowan Devine Gabelle Williams. Nays Buck Cornburgh Davidson Harris Love Wilson. Yeas 6 nays 6 and the passage of the ordinance was declared lost.

Motion to
Submit repeal
to people

Bush moved that the question of the repeal of the Prohibitory Ordinance be submitted to the people. seconded by Williams. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Conger Cowan Devine Gabelle Williams. Nays. Buck. Cornburgh Davidson Harris Love Wilson. Yeas 6 nays 6 and the motion was declared lost.
