The Alliance City Council met in regular session with president Wilson presiding and members all present except Devine who came in during the session.

The hour being late the reading of the minutes were on motion of Love dispensed with.

A petition asking for the vacation of an alley immediately north of the school property in the second ward was on motion of Bush referred to the platting committee

A petition signed by property owners on Main Street between Mechanic Street and Union Avenue asking council to take some action to prevent the Alliance Street R.R. Company from making any further extensions or running their cars on that portion of the street until said company would pay for the pavement occupied by their track was on motion ~~was~~ of Bush referred to the Judiciary Committee.

A remonstrance signed by property owners on Liberty Street against giving the Street Railway Company a franchise to construct and operate a street railway on said Liberty Street was read and on motion of Bush referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Report, May

The Mayor's report of fines and licenses to the amount of \$2406<sup>34</sup> having been collected during the month of May was on motion of Gabelle accepted and ordered placed on file.

Tax Levy  
Ordinance

An ordinance to levy taxes for municipal purposes for the year 1893 was read and Love moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Bush. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Bush Conyer Brown Crumbaugh Davidson Gabelle Harris Love Williams Wilson yeas 11 nays 0 and the ordinance was declared passed.

An Ordinance to levy a tax of one mill in addition to all other taxes under authority of an act of the

Special tax levy ordinance passed Feb 12<sup>th</sup> 1889 was read first time and Love moved the passage of the same seconded by Harris the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Bush Conger Cowan Crumbaugh Davidson Gabelle Harris Love Williams Wilson Yeas 11 nays 0 and the ordinance was declared passed.

approval of bills and payment of same

The finance Committee reported having approved a number of bills and presented the bills of Dan Joseph overruler on Ely street \$5<sup>00</sup> C. H. Bush and B. F. Wrybrecht expenses of trip to Columbus \$15<sup>00</sup> each and L. F. Cooper painting \$12.92 and asked Council to take action on the same. and on motion of Love the bill of Dan Joseph was allowed and ordered paid and on motion of ~~Davidson~~ Love seconded by Davidson the bills of Bush and Wrybrecht were allowed and ordered paid. and on motion of Love the bill of L. F. Cooper was referred to the fire committee

On motion of Love seconded by Harris there was apportioned from the unapportioned fund to the General fund \$330<sup>00</sup> and to the Police and Salary fund \$21<sup>00</sup>

The bills that were approved were read and Love moved they be allowed and that an ordinance be prepared providing for their payment. The Ordinance being prepared was read and Bush moved that the bills of J. W. Craine for \$35<sup>00</sup> and of W. H. Fogg for \$50<sup>00</sup> ~~be paid~~ on account of orders on the city given said Craine and Fogg by Nicholson & Co be allowed and placed in the ordinance along with the other bills that had been approved seconded by Conger and carried. The said bills were placed in the ordinance and Love moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Conger and carried Yeas Buck Bush Conger Cowan <sup>Crumbaugh</sup> Davidson Devine Gabelle Harris Love Williams Wilson Yeas 12 nays 0

Love offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. Be it resolved that there be appointed a standing Committee consisting of three members of Council to be known as the purchasing Committee whose duty it shall be to attend to the purchasing ~~of~~ all material and supplies for the city except as otherwise provided and all material or supplies shall be approved by such purchasing Committee before payment.

Bush seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas 12 nays 0 and the resolution was declared adopted.

fix main st  
at arch

Davidson of the Street Committee reported that a depression existed in main street at the intersection of Arch and should be raised and repaved at that point and moved the same be done under the supervision of the Street Committee seconded by Gable and carried.

fix walnut  
street

Attention was called to a ~~place~~ on north Walnut Street where water was coming to the surface and damaging the street and caused either by a leak in the water main or a spring and on motion of Davidson the Street Committee was instructed to attend to the same.

Road scraper

The question of purchasing a road scraper was referred to the street committee to report at next meeting.

Ash st

A Resolution declaring it necessary to improve Ash Street from the west side of the Cleveland and Pittsburgh railroad Company's right of way to the east side of South Liberty Avenue was read and Davidson moved the adoption of the same seconded by Buck. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Conger Cowan Crubaygh Davidson Gable Harris Williams Wilson Yeas 9 nays 0. (Bush Deome and Love having retired for consultation on other matters) and the resolution was declared adopted.

Grade  
Not st

On Motion of Gable the street committee was instructed to proceed to have noble street put to grade in

accordance with a former arrangement made with the school board.

Motion to Construct Crossing on Main Street

Bush reported the necessity of a crossing on the south side of <sup>west</sup> Main Street across Haines Avenue and moved the same by referred to the Street Committee with power to act, seconded by Williams. Devine moved to amend by including a crossing across North Freedom Avenue at its intersection with North Walnut. Seconded by Gabele. The yeas and nays were called on the amendment resulting Yeas Conger Cowan Davidson Devine Gabele Wilson, Nays Buck Bush Cornbaugh Harris Love Williams Yeas 6 nays 6. The amendment was declared lost and the yeas and nays called on the original motion resulting Yeas Bush Davidson Williams Wilson, Nays Buck Conger Cowan Cornbaugh Devine Gabele Harris Love Yeas 4 nays 8 and the motion was declared lost.

repair Bush Street

Devine called attention to a bad place in the street near Murphy's foundry and the same was referred to the Street Committee

Clerk notify Street Commissioner

On motion of Love, the Clerk was instructed to notify the Street Commissioner to comply with the ordinance governing said office

Sidewalk on Vine Street

Gabele referred to the sidewalk on Vine Street across the run near the cemetery as needing some attention and the same was referred to the sidewalk committee

Throw out sidewalks

On motion of Bush the sidewalks on the north side of Columbia Street and East of Liberty, in front of the properties of E. H. Brosius and Ben Paterson also the walk near the run south of the school house on North Park Street were referred to the sidewalk committee with instructions to have the same either repaired or thrown out

Grade for  
Jersey st

Bush called attention to the necessity of having a grade established on Jersey Street and the same was referred to the Grade Committee

Devine of The Sewer Committee to whom had been referred the matter of extending the so-called Funk Sewer to arch Street reported that they had received a number of bids for the sewer work and after investigating the same would recommend the acceptance of the bid of Tolerton & Son for furnishing the tile and the bid of O Shidler for doing the digging laying of tile and back filling and submitted the bids for the same as follows: Bid of J Y Tolerton for tile
