The platting Committee to whom had been referred the petition from the Morgan Engineering Co reported as follows:

The platting Commission to whom was referred the petition from the Morgan Engineering Co praying for the vacation of certain platted lots. 67 in all and located within an enclosure by a high board fence and further known as the Manufacturing plant of the Morgan Engineering Co by leave to report favorably to granting the petition and would recommend that the same be granted" according to Law. signed L. on College St.

The Platting Committee to whom had been referred the communication from Mr Pearson relative to the locating of the line of West College Street reported as follows: "The Platting Committee to whom was referred the Matter of College Street in the sixth ward would respectfully report that an examination of the County Records shows that in 1861 when W. A. Nixon sold the first tract of land to Mt Union College he obligated himself his heirs and assigns to lay out and establish a public Street from Union Avenue to the

- to the west side of the College grounds where College street is now located. again in 1865 the College bought a second tract of land and in the deed they obligate themselves to lay out a street through the land then bought and in all the deeds made since that time for land bordering on that street the existence of a street at that point is clearly recognized and a committee of a former Council having this same question under consideration after giving the same careful study and examination gave a report locating the street at its present place. It has been so improved and we are of the opinion that it answers ~~all~~ ^{the} calls of all lots and grounds better in its present location than it would at any other point. If any change were made the evidence of the records would place the street further south rather than further north as the parties who have raised the question would desire to have it." Signed C. H. Mr Harris having arrived Love moved that the rules be suspended and the ordinance providing for the issue of \$9150 of bonds be read second time by title seconded by Goble The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Crumbaugh Davidson Goble Love Harris. Defert Williams Wilson Yeas nine nays 0. The rules were declared suspended. The ordinance was read the second time by title and Bush moved the rules be again suspended and the ordinance be read 3^d time. seconded by Williams. The yeas and nays were called resulting same as before yeas 9 nays 0. The rules were declared suspended. The ordinance was read Third time and Love moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Davidson The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Crumbaugh Davidson Goble Harris Love Defert Williams Wilson. Yeas 9 nays 0 and the ordinance was declared passed

Davidson called attention to the dangerous condition of Milner Street at its intersection with Liberty. Caused by the approach on Milner not being graded and moved that the same be done under the supervision of the Street Committee at the expense of the South Liberty Street improvement fund, seconded by Williams. Bush moved to amend by having Milner Street graded from Liberty Street to the first alley west of and parallel with Liberty Street and that said work be advertised for and included in the proposed Contract for grading of the approach to Milner on Liberty Street. Gable seconded the motion to amend which was carried. The yeas and nays were then called on the motion as amended resulting Yeas Bush, ^{Cumbarugh} Davidson Gable Harris Love Defert Williams Wilson Yeas 9 nays 0 and the same was declared carried.

On motion of Bush seconded by Williams the Street Commissioner was instructed to temporarily fix the approach from Milner Street to Liberty at a cost not to exceed three dollars.

Gable moved that the Street Committee proceed ^{at once} to have Noble Street put to grade in accordance with a former arrangement between the Street Committee and the Board of Education by which the said Board of Education was to haul the dirt away without expense to the City seconded by Defert. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Bush Cumbarugh Davidson Gable Harris Defert Williams Wilson Yeas 8 Nays 1 and the motion was declared carried.

Love of the Sewer Committee reported that the Sewer Committee and Sewer engineer Mr Chapin had been considering the changing of a portion of the plans adopted for a system of sewerage

and were of the opinion that a saving of several thousand dollars could be had and the same results obtained by having the sewer empty at a point above the Walnut Street bridge instead of below as first contemplated. and that before such plans could be amended it would be necessary to give notice by publication of the proposed plans. The sewer engineer having submitted plans in accordance with the proposed change and the same being on file in the Clerk's office. The following resolution was read. Resolved that the City Clerk be and is hereby authorized to and instructed to give ten days notice by publication in one or more newspapers of general circulation that the general plan of all sewers and all detail plats of sewers no 1 to 26 inclusive are on file in the office of the City Clerk for examination and inspection thereof." Love moved the adoption of the resolution seconded by Harris The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Bush Crubaugh Davidson Gabele Harris Love Sefert Williams Wilson Yeas 9 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. Resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that the Marshal of said City is hereby authorized and directed to notify Mr Benjamin J. Rickard to take down and remove the awning erected by him in front of the store now occupied by him in the Arlington Block on East Main Street in said city. and that on failure of the said Rickard to do so within 24 hours after said notice is given that the said Marshal is hereby authorized and directed to remove the same and the expense thereof shall be collected off of the said Benjamin J. Rickard.

Williams seconded the motion to adopt the Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Bush Bush Crumbaugh Davidson Gabelle Harris Defert Williams Wilson Nays Looe Yeas 9 nays 0. and the resolution was declared adopted.

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: Resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that the Marshal of said City is hereby authorized and directed to notify Mr George Fuhr to take down and remove the awning erected by him in front of the store room occupied by him on South Liberty Avenue in said City and that on failure of the said Fuhr to do so within 24 hours after said notice is given that said Marshal is hereby authorized and directed to remove the same and the expense thereof will be collected off of the said George Fuhr"

Williams seconded the motion to adopt the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Bush Corubough Davidson Gabele Harris Defert Williams Wilson Stay Low. Yeas 9 nays one. and the resolution was declared adopted.

Judiciary Committee prepare resolution to prevent obstruction of streets

Bush moved that the Judiciary Committee be instructed to prepare and report at next meeting a resolution or resolutions requiring the removal of all wooden awnings seconded by Williams. Love moved to amend by including all awnings now existing in violation of law seconded by Buck and Lost. The original motion was then carried.

On Motion of Bush seconded by Defert the matter of parties obstructing streets was referred to the Judiciary Committee with instructions to prepare an Ordinance to prevent same.
