Mayor's report
for August

The Mayor's report for the month of August reportary fines collected during the month and turned over to the County Treasurer \$5⁰⁰ and to the City Clerk \$576⁴⁰ was presented and on motion of Davidson accepted and ordered placed on file

from E. Fawcett

A Communication from E. Fawcett calling attention of Council to bad condition of Third Street near the Industrial Works caused by the C P R R tracks being raised thereby causing the grade to be raised at that point also to the dangerous condition of the sidewalk and the same was referred to the Street and Sidewalk Committee.

A Petition for the extension of the Water Main on North Union Avenue and Wayne Street was referred to the water committee

W H Peck

A communication from the W H Peck company of Cleveland making a proposition to purchase the second class hose belonging to the City was referred to the fire Committee with Power to act.

From Penna Co
relative to
Bridges

A communication, ^{was read} from Mr Jos Wood of the Penna R R Co relative to overhead crossings and submitting a proposition to cooperate with the City in building overhead crossings across their tracks at the foot of Main Street and at Lincoln Avenue The said proposition being in substance the same as verbally agreed upon between the bridge committee and Mr Wood. Gable moved that the bridge committee so modify the proposition submitted to the R R Co by the City as to conform to the one now submitted by said company. seconded by Davidson and Carried Yeas Conger Cowan Cruborough Davidson Gable Harris Love Defert Williams Wilson Nay Bush Yeas 10 nays 1.

The report of the finance committee being called for. Love presented

Bill of W. W. Anderson

a bill of W. W. Anderson for \$62⁵⁰ for services as sanitary Policeman from June 15 to Sept 1st which he asked the Council to say whether should be allowed or not, and moved the bill be allowed there being no second to the motion the matter was ~~dropped~~.

Reading of Bills

The finance committee reported having approved a number of bills and asked that they be read. The bills were read, and Love moved they be allowed and an ordinance be prepared for their payment and the same be read, seconded by Davidson. Bush moved that a separate vote be taken on the bill of J. L.

Bill of Clippinger

Clippinger (the same being a bill for services as extra policeman) Love moved to amend by including in the separate vote the bills of the two regular policemen and the Marshal, seconded by Harris.

The yeas and nays were called on the motion to amend, resulting Yeas Corbrough Davidson ~~Davidson~~ Harris, Love, Wilson Nays Bush Conger Cowan Gabelle Defert Williams, Yeas 5 nays 6. The motion to amend was declared lost.

The yeas and nays were then called on Love's motion to have the bills allowed as read and placed in the claims ordinance and the same read, resulting Yeas Corbrough Davidson Harris Love Wilson Nays Bush Conger Cowan Gabelle Defert Williams, Yeas 5 nays 6 and the motion was declared lost.

Engineer to
prepare Grade

On Motion of Davidson seconded by Conger Yeas 10 nays none. The engineer was instructed to report a grade ordinance for Washington Street.

Motion to
repair Streets
lost.

Davidson reported that Market Street, Ash Street and Vine Street needed some repairs and moved that the Street Commissioner be instructed to repair the same at a cost not to exceed \$15⁰⁰ seconded by Harris. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Cowan Davidson Harris Defert Williams Wilson, Nays Bush Conger Corbrough Gabelle Love, Yeas 6 nays 5 and the motion was declared lost.

Motion to
repair catch
basin lost

Davidson reported the catch basin at the corner of Arch and Summit Streets filled up, and that it would require about 90 feet of tile laid to relieve the difficulty, and moved that the catch basin be cleaned and a tile sewer be extended 90 feet east to drain the same. *no second.*

Buck Street
Sewer referred

Gabell called attention to the necessity of having something done with the Buck Street Sewer and the same was referred to the Sewer Committee.

1st and 2nd
reading of
Jersey Street
Grade

An Ordinance to establish a grade on Jersey street was read first time and on motion of Bush seconded by Gabell Yeas 11 nays none the rules were suspended and the ordinance read second time by title

Resolution to
accept Contract
with Water Works Co

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption "Be it resolved that it is the sense of this council that the Contract entered into by the Water Works Co and the city December 9th 1891 be and is hereby accepted as signed by and agreed to by the Water Works Co"

Levyer seconded the motion to adopt, the yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Bush Levyer Cowan Crutbaugh Davidson Gabell Harris Love Siefert Williams Wilson Yeas 11 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Lincoln Ave
Grade

The Ordinance to establish a grade on Lincoln Avenue was read second time, on motion of Bush it was agreed that when Council adjourn it be to meet in one week.
