

Council Chamber Alliance Ohio
November 6th 1893

Council met in regular session with President Wilson in the chair and the following members present Buck Bush, Conger Cowan Cornbough Davidson, Gable, Harris, Lovv, Siefert, Williams
Minutes of preceding meetings read and approved.

A communication from the Board of health was submitted which was as follows:

Communication from the Board of Health relative to the employment of W. W. Anderson

To the Council of the City of Alliance, Gentlemen. The Board of Health of said City have incurred expense in the performance of the duties required of them by law as follows: To William Anderson as Sanitary Policeman of said City from the 16th day of June 1893 to the 16th day of September 1893. in all three months at \$25⁰⁰ per month \$75⁰⁰. The said William Anderson having been elected to said office by said Board of Health and having served satisfactorily to said Board of Health all of said time. We request your honorable body to pass the necessary appropriating Ordinance to pay said expense so incurred.

Action of Council on the payment of Anderson's bill

Bush moved that the bill of Mr Anderson be allowed and be placed in the Claims Ordinance seconded by Conger. Harris of the finance Committee reported that there had been no levy made to provide for the above expenditure and that there was not sufficient money in the treasury to the credit of the Sanitary fund to pay this claim in addition to those already incurred. The yeas and nays were then called on the motion to pay the claim resulting yeas Bush, Conger, Cowan, Davidson, Dwyer, Buck, Cornbough, Harris, Lovv, Siefert, Williams, Wilson. Yeas 4 nays 7. and the motion was declared lost. and on motion of Bush seconded by Davidson the communication was ordered placed on file.

A number of bills against the City having been approved by the proper

Claims Ordinance

Committees were read by the clerk and Love moved the same be allowed as read and that an Ordinance be prepared providing for their payment seconded by Davidson and carried. The ordinance was then prepared and there not being sufficient money in certain funds to pay the appropriations provided for in said Ordinance Love moved that there be apportioned from any unappropriated money in the treasury to the fire fund \$155⁰⁰ and to the Street fund \$35⁰⁰ seconded by Harris and carried. The ordinance was then read and Love moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Conger. The yeas and nays were then called resulting Yeas Buck Bush Conger Cowan Combarugh Davidson Harris Love Defert Williams Wilson Yeas 11 nays 0

Bids for Grading
South Liberty Street
and awarding
same.

Bids having been received for the grading of South Liberty Street the same were submitted to council as follows: The bid of M Macaulay at 17½ cents per cubic yard. The bid of A Keiffner at 17½ cents per cubic yard. The bid of P.O. Michener at 12½ cents per cubic yard. Buck moved that the bid of P.O. Michener at 12½ cents per cubic yard be accepted seconded by Davidson and carried Yeas Buck Bush Conger Cowan Combarugh Davidson Harris Love Defert Williams Wilson Yeas 11 nays none and on motion of Bush seconded by Conger the Street committee and clerk was instructed to contract with the said Michener for said work the same to be completed by January 1st 1894

Love offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

Disposition of
Surplus in the
South Arch Street
fund

"Whereas there is a surplus of about \$900 remaining in the fund provided for the macadamizing of Arch Street between Milner and State Streets. Therefore be it resolved that the same be returned to the abutting property owners pro rata per foot front as provided by law and that the City clerk be directed to return the same to those that paid their

assessments in cash and that credit be given on assessments yet due to those paying in installments" Conger seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Bush Conger Cowan ~~Crumbaugh~~ Gabele Davidson Harris Love Sefert Williams Wilson. Yeas 12 nays none.

Fire Committee to Purchase stove for fire department

Conger moved that the fire Committee be instructed to purchase a hard coal burner stove suitable for heating the room occupied by the fire department and have the same put in as soon as possible. seconded by Sefert and carried Yeas Buck Bush Conger Cowan Crumbaugh Davidson Gabele Harris Love Sefert Williams Wilson. Yeas 12 nays none.

procuring right of way from Garrison for sewer

Love of the Sewer Committee reported having conferred with Mr Garrison relative to the City, acquiring the right of way across his property north of Keystone Street in which to construct the proposed sewer and that for the sum of \$125⁰⁰ and sewer privileges for his property abutting on the sewer and lying between Keystone street and the river Mr Garrison would grant the right of way to construct and maintain a sewer and waive all claims for damages. Love moved that Mr Garrison be allowed the sum of \$125⁰⁰ and the said privileges for such right of way seconded by Conger and carried. Yeas Buck Bush Conger Cowan, Davidson Gabele Harris Love Sefert Williams Wilson Crumbaugh. Yeas 12 nays none.

employment of additional inspector on sewer

Love reported that with the number of men now employed in the construction of the sewers being built the interests of the city required that there be an additional inspector employed. as one inspector could not look after all the work being done. and moved that Mr Daniel Joseph be employed at a cost not to exceed \$1⁵⁰ per day. seconded by Sefert Bush moved to amend by referring to the Sewer committee with power to act seconded by Conger and carried. The yeas and nays were then called on the motion as amended. resulting Yeas 12 nays none.
