Council met in adjourned session. President Wilson presiding and the following members present Buck Bush Davidson Gabele Harris Love Sefert Williams.

Report of Cemetery Trustees

The report of the Clerk and Treasurer of the cemetery trustees for the quarter ending Sept. 30th showing cash on hand \$1948⁰⁰ was read and on motion of Gabele accepted and ordered placed on file.

Bush and carried. President Wilson appointed as said committee Love Davidson and Gabele.

Davidson presented an outline of plan for improving North Union Avenue at the P. F. W. Bridge by extending the sewer at that point and an estimate of the cost of the same being \$297.00 and moved the adoption of the same seconded by Gabele and carried yeas Buck Bush Davidson Gabele Defert Williams Wilson nays Love Harris.

On motion of Love seconded by Bush yeas 9 nays none the engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for said work. ^{Bush offered the following resolution and in its adoption} Be it resolved that it is the sense of this council that the city clerk be authorized to order one car R. M. Slag to be placed on State Street by the Street Commissioner wherever needed in repairs." Williams seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 9 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Bush moved that the resolution relative to opening Summit Street which was laid on the table at the preceding meeting be taken up seconded by Williams. It being ^{stated that} if the money should not be in fund when needed to pay damages the property owners directly interested would advance the money until such time as the city could reimburse them. The yeas and nays were called on the adoption of the resolution resulting yeas Buck Bush Davidson Gabele Harris Love Defert Williams Wilson yeas 9 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Buck called attention to the necessity of Grading the approach to Grant Street on the north side at the first alley west of Arch the recent grading of Grant Street having left the alley considerably higher than the street and on motion of Bush Mr. Auld was authorized to do such grading with the understanding that it was to be without cost to the city. The dirt so excavated to be taken as payment.

Railing needed at
Bridge on Broadway

Love reported the necessity of a railing along the sidewalk on Broadway at the bridge over the L. E. A. & S. R. and the matter was referred to the sidewalk committee.

To Repair sidewalk

Attention was called also to the conditions of the sidewalk over the run on North Park Street near the school house and on motion of Buck the sidewalk committee was instructed to have same repaired at a cost not to exceed \$300.

Harris called attention to the unsatisfactory condition of the incandescent lamps in the Council room and on motion of Bush the Clerk was instructed to notify the Mutual Light Company of the same.
