

Council Chamber Alliance O Dec 18. 1893

Council met in regular session with president Wilson presiding and the following members present. Buck Bush. Conger Cowan Crumbough Gable Defert. Absent Dairson Harris Lovr Williams. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Reading of bills  
and Passage of  
Claims Ordinance

A bill of W Conrad for \$80<sup>00</sup> as an estimate on the Rush Street Sewer and bills for a car load of slag and freight on same were read and Defert moved they be allowed as read and an Ordinance be prepared providing for their payment. Seconded by Buck and carried. The ordinance being prepared was read and Gable moved the same be placed on its passage. Seconded by Conger. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Bush Conger Cowan Crumbough Gable Defert Wilson Yeas 8 nays none and the ordinance was declared passed.

Report of Street  
Committee on Crossing  
on Union Ave

Buck of the street committee to whom had been referred the request for a crossing across Union Avenue at College Street reported that such crossing was a public necessity and recommended that the same be done at the expense of the city. report adopted.

Obstruction in Street  
on Arch & Main

Buck reported that the streets were obstructed at the intersection of Main and Arch by building material placed there in the construction of the new building by W. W. Webb and the matter was referred to the Street Committee.

Obstruction in Street  
on Linden Ave

Wilson reported the street being obstructed on Linden Avenue near the Keplinger house and the same was referred to the Street Committee with power to act.

To Repair  
Seneca Street

Bush reported the necessity of some repairs being made on the brick pavement on Seneca Street between Leigh and Oxford Street and moved the matter be referred to the Street committee with power to act seconded by Conger and carried Yeas 8 nays none

motion to repair  
crossings at  
Patterson & Freedom  
lost

Gabele reported that the crossings at the intersection of Patterson and North Freedom Streets were in bad condition and moved that the street committee be instructed to have cinders hauled and deposited on said crossings so as to make them passable in muddy weather seconded by Defert. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Bush Brown Gabele Defert Wilson Nays Conger Crubaugh yeas 6 Nays 2 and the motion was declared lost.

Gabele called attention to the fountain on the public square overflowing and the water running over the street and the matter was referred to the Water committee.

report of committee  
L. E. A & S R.R.  
raising their tracks

The committee to whom had been referred the matter of the R.R. Co raising their track and thereby changing the grade on North Freedom Street made the following report

"In your committee appointed with instructions to report the facts concerning the raising of the tracks of the L. E. A & S R.R. on Freedom Avenue find that the tracks have been raised (21) twenty one inches at that point above the grade established by ordinance".

On motion of Conger the report was accepted and Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. Be it resolved that it is the sense of this council that the L. E. A & S R.R. be required to comply with the ordinance granting them the franchise to construct and operate a single track R.R. over certain streets through the city (or village at the time it was granted) and that the City Clerk is hereby instructed to furnish the officials of said R.R. Co with a copy of this resolution. Conger seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Bush Conger Brown Gabele Defert Nays Crubaugh and Wilson yeas 6 nays 2 and the motion was declared lost.

Report of Platting Committee on closed streets and alleys

The platting committee submitted the following report. "In the committee appointed and known as the platting commission beg leave to report as follows: That the additions platted by J.B. York in the 6<sup>th</sup> ward, in the addition platted by J.B. Milner in the 6<sup>th</sup> ward J.B. Milner's addition in the 5<sup>th</sup> ward south of Oxford Street and west of Union Avenue. In Peters Lamborn & Co's addition in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ward The east end of Noble Street in Webb's addition also an alley in Webb's addition west of Webb Street and south of the corporation line are closed." signed C.H. Bush W.B. Crutbaugh on motion of Conger the report was accepted and Gabel moved that the platting committee be instructed to have the streets and alleys embraced in the above report thrown open. Seconded by Conger and carried Yeas 8 nays none.

On motion of Gabel seconded by Conger it was agreed that when council adjourn it be to meet Thursday evening Dec 21<sup>st</sup>

Platting Committee to report all streets and alleys not opened

On motion of Bush seconded by Buck the platting committee was instructed to report any other streets and alleys that are closed in addition to those already reported.

No further business on motion council adjourned
