Kay offered the following, and moved its adoption. 1st That in the opinion of this Council it is necessary to erect upon the grounds of the Alliance Cemetery Association a building to consist of one waiting room and one room for the use of the sexton employed by said Cemetery Association.

2nd That the Cemetery Committee be instructed to have plans and specifications prepared for said building subject to the approval of Council Harris seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas 9 nays none.

An Ordinance to Vacate portion of an Alley (being that part of an alley lying between Lots 2586 and 2587 in the second ward known as the School property) was read first time and Conger moved the rules be suspended and the Ordinance be read second time by title seconded by Williams the Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Conger Davidson Harris Kay Melaney Sefer Trail Williams Bush. Yeas 9 nays none. The rules were declared suspended the Ordinance was read second time by title and Harris moved the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance be read third time seconded by Williams

the tracks of the Penna R R Co. beginning near
the intersection of Main and Liberty Streets
and ending on Patterson Street at a point at
the north end of lot no 165 known as the
Graham property in accordance with plans
and profiles relating to said improvement
on file in the office of the city clerk. The costs
and expense of said improvement to be paid
out of the Street improvement fund of the
Corporation and the clerk is hereby directed to
cause this resolution to be published for two
weeks in a news paper published and of
general circulation in the Corporation. and
the city marshal is hereby appointed to serve
notice of the passage of this resolution upon
the owners of abutting ^{on said improvement} property who are residents
of Stark County. Conger moved the
adoption of the resolution seconded by Seft

Council Chamber Alliance Ohio April 25th 1894

Council met in special session upon call of the Mayor for the purpose of considering the propriety of changing the plan of Main Sewer no 2. or east side main sewer. President Bush in the Chair and the following members present - Conger Davidson Kay Melaney ~~and~~ Siefert Trail Crumbaugh Williams Wilson absent Harris.

The following resolution was read. Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that the plans of the East side Main Sewer no 2 as shown on the plans adopted by Council be so changed as to run across the C & P R.R. Tracks in a westerly direction to intersect with the East End of Main Street thence west on the line of the Main Street lateral sewer as shown on the plans for lateral sewer no 10. to the first alley west of the C & P. R.R. thence south in said alley to Ash Street to intersect with the Ash Street lateral sewer as shown on the plans thence east in Ash Street on the line of the Ash Street lateral sewer to Webb Street to the terminus of said Main Sewer as shown on the plans instead of crossing the C & P tracks diagonally and along the west side of said C & P R.R. to Ash Street as shown on the plans adopted. The cost of said change in route to be done at the same price per foot as the original contract price. Conger moved the adoption of the above resolution seconded by Davidson and carried Yeas Buck Conger Crumbaugh Davidson Kay Melaney Siefert Trail Williams ^{Wilson} Bush. 11-0. Wilson moved that the Contractors be allowed pay for the taking up and relaying the pavement on Main Street made necessary by the change in the route seconded by Melaney and carried Yeas 11 nays 0. On Motion of Wilson the Clerk was instructed to notify the engineer of the action of Council in making the said change. adjourned.
