

Council Chamber Alliance Ohio April 30-1894

Council met in regular session with President Bush in the chair and the following members present. Bush Bucke Conger Davidson Harris Kay McLaney Siefert Trill Williams Wilson. Absent Crubaugh.

Minutes of meetings of April 24th 25th and 28th read and approved.

claim of rail-look damages

A claim for damages in favor of Isriell Cook in the sum of \$250⁰⁰ on account of the fill on Lincoln Avenue was presented and on motion of Wilson referred to the Committee on Streets and alleys.

contract with Telephone Co

A form of Contract with the Telephone Company for the Telephone at the residence of the marshal was presented and on motion of Wilson the Mayor and Clerk were instructed to sign the same on behalf of the City.

Report of Cemetery Committee

A report of the Cemetery Directors was presented showing that said Directors had organized on April 20th by electing Ira T Tullis President. W^m Speaker Treasurer and J K Alley Secy also the report of the Secy and Treasurer of said board for the three months ending March 31st 1894 showing the amount of cash on hand at that date to be \$2430.95. and on motion of Wilson the same was received and ordered placed on file

Petition for Light

A petition asking for an arc light to be placed at the intersection of Park and High Streets was read and referred to the Light Committee.

Report of inventory of tools

Davidson of the Street Committee of 1893. reported that the committee had taken an inventory of the tools belonging to the City in the hands of the Street Commissioner in accordance with instructions given at a former meeting and submitted the same which was on motion of Conger accepted and ordered placed on file

The Committee on rules submitted a set of rules which they had agreed upon

and on motion of Wilson seconded by Buck the same were adopted and on motion of Conger seconded by Williams the clerk was instructed to have the same printed.

Carr's alley

Buck called attention to some difference of opinion amongst interested property owners relative to the location of an alley - running east from South Arch Street and in the vicinity of Carr's Coal Bank and the matter was referred to the platting committee to report at next meeting.

Resolution for

A resolution providing for the construction of Lateral Sewer no 4 was read and on motion of Wilson seconded by Kay the same was laid on the table for one week.

Report of Judiciary
Committee on
Bd of Equalization

The Judiciary Committee to whom had been referred the petition from the taxpayers of the third ward asking that C. D. Bush be appointed as a member of the board of Equalization reported that under the provisions of section 1717 of the Revised Statutes and by the advice of the Solicitor they were of the opinion that members of Council were ineligible to membership on said board and on motion of Wilson seconded by Bush the report was accepted.

Water for Street
Sprinkling

Buck reported that the water works company objected to persons taking water for street sprinkling purposes except for Main Street and the same was referred to the Water Committee.

Kitzmiller's
Plat

Buck of the platting committee submitted a plat of Kitzmiller's allotment being a subdivision of out lots no 189 and 190 and lying north of South Street and east of South Freedom Avenue and moved the same be accepted seconded by Wilson. The plans and maps were called resulting. Yeas Buck Harris McLoney Wilson Kay Conger Davidson Kay Deft Trail Williams Bush. Yeas 4 nays 7 and the motion was declared lost.

Police Committee
and appointment
Police

The Police Committee submitted the following report: "The Police Committee would recommend that there be employed for the ensuing year three regular policemen at a salary of \$50.00 per month two of whom shall be on duty all night and one who shall be on duty ^{each day} from 12 o'clock noon until midnight and who shall perform the duties of and be known as ^{the} sanitary policeman and when not engaged in sanitary duty shall perform the same duties as the other policemen" signed Madison Trail. J.R. Williams.

Wilson moved the report be adopted seconded by Sefert. Conger moved to amend by striking out the words "all night" and substituting the words "from 6 o'clock P.M. until 6 o'clock A.M." seconded by Williams. Carried

Wilson moved to amend by striking out the word "three" and substituting the word "two" seconded by Buck. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck, Davidson, Harris, Wilson.

Stays Conger Kay Melaney Sefert Trail Williams Bush. Yeas 4 nays 7. and the motion was declared lost. The roll was then called on the motion to adopt the report resulting yeas

Conger Kay Melaney Sefert Trail Williams Bush. Stays Buck Davidson Harris Wilson Yeas 7 nays 4 and the report was declared adopted. The appointment of policemen

being in order Mayor Prescott nominated Mr James Bates. and Wilson moved that nomination be confirmed seconded by Kay. The yeas and nays were called resulting

The Mayor then nominated Grant Ogline and Wilson moved the same be confirmed seconded by Buck. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Conger Davidson Harris Kay Melaney Sefert Williams Wilson Bush. Yeas 11 nays none. and the nomination was declared confirmed

appointment of Board of Health

There being two vacancies in the board of health by reason of the terms of the members from the second and fourth wards having expired. Conger moved that Jacob Hartzell be appointed to fill the vacancy in the fourth ward seconded by Williams and carried. Sefert moved that Isaac N. Smith be appointed from the second ward seconded by Conger and carried.

Mayor to purchase Docket

The Mayor reported that he was in need of a Criminal Docket and on motion of Buck seconded by Davidson Yeas 11 nays none he was authorized to purchase the same.

1st reading of Ordinance to Regulate Saloons

An Ordinance to regulate all Beer and porter houses and other places where intoxicating liquors are sold at retail was read first time.

Ordinance to issue lateral Sewer bonds

An Ordinance to authorize the issue of the bonds of the City of Alliance Ohio in anticipation of the collection of a special assessment for the construction of lateral sewers was read first time and Wilson moved that the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read second time by title seconded by Conger. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Conger Davidson Harris Kay Melaney Sefert Trail Williams Wilson Bush Yeas 11 nays none. The rules were declared suspended. The ordinance was read second time by title and Conger moved that the rules be again suspended and the ordinance be read the third time

 Kay moved that the Ordinance to regulate all Beer and Porter houses be referred to the Judiciary and police Committee seconded by Wilson. Wilson moved to amend by striking out Police Committee seconded by Davidson and carried. The original motion as amended was then put and carried.

To purchase road scraper
 Trail moved that the proposition submitted ^{April 4, 1844} by the Fleming Mfg Co through their agent Mr Hersey to furnish the City with a road scraper be accepted seconded by Sefert. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Conger Davidson Harris Kay Melaney Sefert Trail Williams Wilson Bush Yeas 11 nays none.

Wilson moved that the Street Committee be instructed to enter into a contract with the said Fleming Mfg Co in accordance with the aforesaid proposition seconded by Williams. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Conger Davidson Harris Kay Melaney Sefert Trail Williams Wilson Bush Yeas 11 nays none and the motion was declared carried.
