June 4 1894

Council met in regular session with President Bush in the chair and the following members present. Buck Conger Davidson Kay Melaney Siefert Trail Williams

Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

The finance committee reported having approved a number of bills and the same were read by the Clerk and Kay moved that they be allowed as read and that there be an ordinance prepared providing for their payment seconded by Williams and carried

The Ordinance being prepared and there not being sufficient money to the credit of certain funds to pay the appropriations provided for. Kay moved that there be apportioned from any unapportioned money in the treasury to the general fund \$102<sup>00</sup>, to the Street fund \$90<sup>00</sup>, to the fire fund \$100<sup>00</sup> and to the Police Salary fund \$21<sup>00</sup>, seconded by Williams and carried. The ordinance was then read and Kay moved that the same be placed on its passage seconded by Buck the yeas and nays were called resulting, yeas, Buck Conger Davidson Kay Melaney Siefert Trail Williams Bush. Yeas 9 nays none and the ordinance was declared passed.

Be it resolved by the council of the City of Alliance  
Stark County Ohio that it is deemed necessary  
by and is hereby declared the intent of this council  
to appropriate to the use of said city the following  
described property viz. situated in the city of Alliance  
County of Stark and state of Ohio and known as  
out lot number one hundred and sixty five (165)  
owned by the Graham heirs. also a triangular  
piece of land bounded on the south by  
Main Street on the west by Liberty Street  
on the north and east by the Pittsburgh  
Fort Wayne and Chicago Railway Company's right  
of way. commonly known as the Kayler  
property. for the purpose of building a  
bridge over the Penna Company's tracks  
provided for by a resolution passed by  
this Council the 24<sup>th</sup> day of April 1844 commencing  
at Liberty Street at the north side of Main  
Street. thence eastward over said Kayler property  
thence northward over said lot no 165 to  
Patterson Street. The City Solicitor upon the  
passage of this resolution is hereby instructed  
to commence the proper proceedings in Court for  
an inquiry and assessment of damages for said  
appropriation. The payment of which together with  
the costs shall be paid out of the Street improvement  
fund. This resolution was laid over and the  
following resolution was offered. Be it resolved  
by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that the  
Mayor of said City be hereby directed to  
immediately cause written notice of the last  
mentioned resolution to be given to the owner  
or owners of the property described in said  
resolution or to his, her, or their authorized agents  
if the owner or owners are non residents of this  
County which notice shall be served  
by the Marshal of this city and return by  
him made thereof as provided by law. "

A resolution declaring it necessary to construct lateral sewer no 27 was read and on motion of Davidson the same was laid on the table.

Davidson moved that the engineer be instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of Market street by paving from Arch west to Union Avenue.

fence up sidewalk  
on Webb st

Buck reported that the sidewalk in front of the Mrs Feters property on north Webb Street was in a very bad condition and moved that the sidewalk Committee be instructed to have the same fenced up seconded by Melaney and carried.

Set Stakes on  
Franklin Street

On motion of Trail seconded by Davidson the engineer was instructed to set stakes for sidewalks on Franklin Avenue north of the school house and to have the bad walks along said street thrown out.

Sidewalk on  
N Freedom

Attention was called to the condition of the sidewalk at the corner of North Freedom and 5<sup>th</sup> street and the same was referred to the Sidewalk Committee.

Public Water  
Closet

Conger called attention to the necessity of having a public water closet and the matter was referred to the buildings and grounds Committee to report at next meeting an estimate of the cost of the same.

Remove Band  
Stand

The Street Committee submitted the following. Whereas farmers as well as quite a number of residents of the City have complained of the band stand on the public square as being dangerous on account of its being too close to the west line of hitching posts and Whereas the City has at present only

" a very limited space at best for hitching purposes therefore the undersigned members of the street committee recommend that it be removed from the square"

Trail moved the adoption of the report seconded by Siefert and Carried yeas 9 nays none

The Street Commissioner in accordance with instructions given at the preceding meeting submitted a list of street and alley crossings in different parts of the City which needs repairing or new crossings. and on motion of Davidson the same was received and ordered placed on file

An Ordinance to vacate part of an alley being the alley lying between Morgan and South Webb street and running from Cambridge street south to the first alley running east and west was read first time and Davidson moved the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read second time by title seconded by Williams The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Conger Davidson Kay Melaney Siefert Trail Williams Bush. yeas 9 nays none. The rules were declared suspended and the ordinance was read second time by title

An Ordinance to amend an ordinance to amend sec VIII of an ordinance to provide for the granting of licenses was read third time and Conger moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Trail. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Conger, Davidson, Kay, Melaney, Siefert, Trail, Williams, Bush, yeas 9 nays none. The ordinance was declared passed, and Council adjourned
