

Council Chamber Alliance Ohio  
June 25<sup>th</sup> 1894

Council met in regular session with President Bush in the chair and the following members present. Buck Conger Harris Kay Melaney Sefer Trail Williams Wilson absent Embaryk and Davidson Minutes of Meeting of June 18<sup>th</sup> read and approved.

Petition to improve  
College street

A petition signed by property owners on College street between Arch and Union Avenue asking for the improvement of said College street between said points by grading the same setting curb and gutter stones and constructing the necessary culverts and drains was presented and referred to the committee on permanent improvements

To repair Catch  
Basin

Melaney reported a catch basin on Seneca Street near Oxford that needed repairs and on motion of Conger seconded by Wilson Yeas 9 nays none the same was referred to the Street Committee with instructions to have the same repaired at a cost not to exceed six dollars.

Street Crossings

Wilson reported two dangerous Street Crossings on west State Street and Harris reported one on South Union Avenue near the Old Cemetery in the 6<sup>th</sup> ward and on motion of Conger the Street Commissioner was instructed to have said Crossings thrown out.

Hitching Posts

Attention was called to the necessity of providing more hitching places at the Cemetery and the matter was referred to the Cemetery committee

bridge resolution The aforesaid resolution which was offered on June 4<sup>th</sup> and is found recorded on page 107. This record was then read and Conger moved the adoption of the same. Seconded by Trail. The Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Conger Harris Kay Melaney Trail Williams Wilson Bush. Yeas 9 nays none. and the resolution was declared adopted.

Passage of Ordinance to regulate Sewers An Ordinance regulating the construction and use of sanitary Sewers and <sup>for</sup> the disposal of sewerage in the City of Alliance Ohio" was read first time and Conger moved the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read second time by title seconded by Trail. The Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Conger Harris Kay Melaney Siefert Trail Williams Wilson Bush. Yeas 10 nays none. The rules were declared suspended. The ordinance was read second time by title and Conger moved the rules be again suspended and the ordinance be read third time by title. Seconded by Kay. The Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Conger Harris Kay Melaney Siefert Trail Williams Wilson Bush. Yeas 10 nays 0. The rules were declared suspended. The ordinance was read third time by title and Wilson moved the same be placed on its final passage seconded by Conger. The Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Conger Harris Kay Melaney Siefert Trail Williams Wilson Bush. Yeas 10 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

reconsider Vote on sewer no 4

Conger moved that the vote on the resolution to construct lateral sewer no 4 be reconsidered seconded by Trail and carried. The resolution was read and Kay moved the same be adopted seconded by Conger. The Yeas and nays

were called resulting Yeas Conger Harris  
 Kay Melaney Seft Trail Williams  
 Wilson Bush. Nays. Buck. Yeas 9  
 nays 1. and the resolution was declared  
 adopted.

Damages Case of  
 Mary Miller

Solicitor Craine reported that  
 one Mary Miller had brought an action  
 against the city claiming damages in the  
 sum of twenty thousand dollars. and  
 asked Council for instructions and Harris  
 moved that the Solicitor be instructed  
 to file the proper answer in the Common  
 Pleas Court in said case seconded by Trail  
 and carried Yeas 10 nays none.

Passage of resolution  
 for sewers no 27

Conger moved that the  
 resolution to construct lateral Sewer  
 no 27. (which was tabled June 4<sup>th</sup>) be  
 taken from the table seconded by Wilson  
 and carried. Conger then moved the adoption  
 of the same seconded by Trail. The Yeas  
 and nays were called resulting Yeas  
 Buck Conger Harris Kay Melaney Seft  
 Trail Williams Wilson Bush. Yeas  
 10 nays 0. and the resolution was  
 declared adopted.

Damages Case  
 of J. Cook

J. D. Lewis being present  
 called attention of Council to the Claim  
 of Israel Cook against the City for damages  
 which he had presented on April 30<sup>th</sup>  
 and asked that Council take some action  
 in the matter. The aforesaid claim having  
 been referred to the Street Committee. at the  
 time it was presented. Buck moved that the  
 Judiciary Committee be instructed  
 to act with the Street Committee in  
 reporting on the same. seconded by  
 Conger and carried.

Kay moved that the Clerk  
 be instructed to issue an order to the  
 Water works company to extend the  
 water main south on Park Street to

extend water  
main on Park at

High Street seconded by Conger. The Yeas  
and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck  
Conger Harris. Kay. Melaney Siefert Trail  
Williams Wilson Bush. Yeas 10 nays none  
and the motion was declared carried

engineer prepare  
plans for  
Main Street

Harris moved that the engineer  
be instructed to prepare plans and specifications  
and an estimate of the cost for the repairing of  
Main Street from the C & P R.R. west to Arch  
street. seconded by Kay. The Yeas and nays  
were called resulting Yeas Buck Conger  
Harris Kay Melaney Siefert Trail Williams  
Wilson Bush Yeas 10 nays none and the motion  
was declared carried.

employment of  
sewer inspectors

President Bush called attention of  
Council to the necessity of employing some one to  
superintend and inspect the construction of the lateral  
sewers about to be built. and Wilson moved that Mr  
Ross Rine and Robert Auld be employed as such  
inspectors at \$2<sup>00</sup> per day and that the matter  
of assigning <sup>them</sup> to their respective work be placed  
in the hands of the Sewer Committee seconded by  
Trail. The Yeas and nays were called resulting  
Yeas Buck Conger Harris Kay Melaney Siefert  
Trail Williams Wilson Bush. Yeas 10 nays  
none. and the motion was declared carried

Harris moved that the Sewer  
committee be instructed to prepare  
rules and regulations prescribing the  
duties and governing said inspectors  
seconded by Wilson and carried.
