Council met in regular session with President Bush in the chair and the following members present. Conger Kay Melaney Defert Trail Williams Wilson Absent Buck Crumbaugh Davidson Harris. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved

The Mayor's report for the month of June showing fines and licenses collected to the amount of \$102.75 was read accepted and ordered placed on file

The following communication from the Board of Health was read.

Communication from Board of Health

To the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio Gentlemen: The Board of Health of said City of Alliance have incurred expenses in the performance of the duties required of them by law as follows: by employing Daniel Joseph as sanitary policeman for the term of five months from May 3^d 1894 at \$50.00 per month and the employment of P. H. Walker as health officer for the term of one year from May 1st 1894 at a salary of \$150.00 per year. and we request your honorable body to pass the necessary appropriating ordinances to pay the expense so incurred" By order of the Board of Health Thomas Connelum Clerk

On motion of Conger action on the above bids was deferred for one week in which to give the Sewer Committee time to report on ^{the} petition to have a portion of this work deferred.

Conger reported that on account of the ditch on the south side of Patterson Street and along the property of G. M. Yant being filled up with rubbish and shavings from Yant's planing mill the recent heavy rains had caused the street to overflow and run into Mr. Tamer's cellar and moved that the Street Commissioner be instructed to open the ditch and the Marshal notify Mr. Yant to keep it open secured by Kay and Currier.

The permanent improvement committee to whom was referred the the petition for the improvement of College Street by grading, curbing &c between Arch Street and Union Avenue which was presented at the preceding meeting, reported in favor of granting the request of the petitioners and on motion of Wilson seconded by Conger the report was adopted. and on motion of Wilson seconded by Trail the Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for said improvement

Plans and specifications
for main street

The Engineer submitted plans and specifications for the repaving of Main Street between the C & P R.R. and Arch Street and on motion of Conger seconded by Williams the same were referred to the permanent improvement committee to report at next meeting.

Phyllis well

Agent reported that in the construction of Main sewer no 2 the excavation done drained the water from the well of one Mr Phyllis who requested that the city provide him with water from the water main on account thereof and the matter was referred to the water committee

regulations for
sewer inspectors

The Sewer Committee submitted the following: To the Council. Allcance & Gentlemen In the Sewer Committee to whom was referred the matter of providing regulations and instructions to govern sewer inspectors would respectfully submit the following: That any person employed by the City to inspect the construction of any sewer shall thoroughly acquaint himself with the plans, specifications and Contract under which such sewer is being built and see that the same are strictly complied with and upon the refusal or neglect of any contractor to comply with any of the terms of said specifications or Contract it shall be the duty of the inspector to at once notify the sewer committee. He shall see that the requisite number of Cps or house connections

" are laid and that they be so placed as to best accommodate the abutting property. He shall keep an accurate record of the location of all such house connections in such manner that they can be found at any future time which record shall be immediately delivered to the City Clerk upon the completion of the sewer. he shall also insist upon the prompt removal of all rejected material and rubbish of all kinds and perform such other duties as the Sewer Committee may from time to time direct." Wilson moved the report be adopted seconded by Williams and carried

Payment of
Hersey

An Ordinance to pay a certain claim therein described, and providing for the payment to E. D. & W. S. Hersey of \$1579.25 being the amount of money due them at this time for the Contract for Sewers no 2 & 3. according to the final Estimate of the engineer. was read and Kay moved the passage of the Ordinance. seconded by Williams The Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Conger Kay McLaney Seft Trail Williams Wilson Bush Yeas 8 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Nuisances

Bush reported a nuisance on South Freedom Street at the first alley south of Market Street caused by sewerage running out on the top of the ground and Wilson reported the same condition existing in the 6th ward and the matter was referred to the Sewer Committee to report at next meeting.

Resolution to
Contract

A resolution to Contract with Burger & Macauley for the construction of lateral sewer no 10 was read and on motion of Seft referred to the Judiciary Committee

On motion of Wilson the Clerk was instructed to ascertain the financial standing of the parties offered by Mr Anson as bondsmen for his Contract for sewer no 12

The Fire Committee reported having visited East Liverpool to inspect the working of an aerial hook and ladder truck

and reported being well pleased with the machine it giving entire satisfaction where in use. and giving the opinion that they were a necessity in cities of this size. and on motion of Conger the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

sidewalks

Trail reported a list of lots - that need new sidewalks and the Clerk was instructed to have resolutions for same prepared at next meeting.

Throw out walks

On Motion of Wilson seconded by Conger. the Street Commissioner was instructed to have the board sidewalks on the east side of Franklin Street and north of the school house thrown out and the Clerk ordered to have resolutions prepared for sidewalks in front of said lots.

Platting Committee

The Platting Committee submitted an adverse report on the petition to open a street in the 6th Ward from College to State Street between Union Avenue and Arch and on motion of Kay the report was referred back to the Platting Committee.

The Platting Committee to whom had been referred the petition to open West Grant Street reported that they were unable at this time to recommend the opening of said street and that at the request of a part of the petitioners recommended that the matter be referred to the Street Committee and on motion of Conger the report was adopted.

On motion of Conger Council adjourned.
