Council met in regular session with President Bush presiding and the following members present. Conger Davidson Harris Key McLaney Siefert Trail. Absent. Buck Embrough Williams Wilson.

Trail of the permanent improvement committee reported that the jury in the case of the City vs Keyler and others in the appropriation case had awarded R. S. Keyler \$6250⁰⁰. Fred Keyler 275⁰⁰ and John Senn \$75⁰⁰. The committee also recommended that Oxford street be improved by making a fill for the approaches to the proposed bridge across the L. E. A. & S. R. R. a report of amount of excavation necessary to put certain streets to grade the dirt to be used in making the aforesaid fill on Oxford Street as follows. Broadway from east side of Linden Ave to west side of Seneca Street 2220 cubic yards Linden Avenue from south side of Broadway to south side Oxford Street 1270 cubic yards Freedom Street from north side of Columbia Street to north curb of High Street, 1280 cubic yds High Street from east side of Arch to east side of Freedom Ave 1400 cubic yards

Mechanic Street from south side of Oxford to north side of Cambridge Street 100 cubic yds

Oxford Street from Arch to Mechanic Streets 120 cubic yards and Oxford Street from west side of Park to west side of an alley 120 feet west 320 cubic yards. Harris moved the report be adopted seconded by Siefert and

A communication from L. E. Chapin
Sanitary Engineer reporting final estimate
on Sewers no 10 and 12 reporting the sewers in
good condition and recommending the acceptance
of the same was submitted and Davidson
moved that the report be adopted and that
Sewers no 10 and 12 be accepted, seconded by
Trail and carried.

to complete the culvert or sewer on North

to the Sewer Committee

A Petition from property
owners on the line of sewer no 14 asking
that Jno M. Evans be appointed as inspector
on said work was presented and Harris
moved the same be granted seconded by
Davidson and carried.

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The selection of an inspector
for sewer no 4 was taken up and ^{the names of} V. B. Leek
and Wm Brinker were proposed. Harris
and Kay were appointed tellers. a ballot
was taken and resulted Leek 6. Brinker 2
and Leek was declared appointed. a ballot
was then taken for inspector for sewer
no 27 resulting Brinker 8 and
Brinker was declared appointed

On motion of Kay the clerk was instructed to notify the Board of Health to have the Sanitary policeman to notify all persons having connections made with storm water sewers for sanitary purposes to disconnect the same at once.

Harris moved that the vote to instruct the Solicitor to prepare an Ordinance to prohibit the use of storm water sewers for sanitary purposes be reconsidered seconded by Kay and carried. The original motion with the original matter was lost.

Mr John Uran through Mr Harris tendered his resignation as member of the board of Health and on motion of Harris seconded by Trail the same was accepted and the members of Council from the first ward were instructed to report to Council at next meeting the name of some suitable person to fill the vacancy.

Letter from
Waring
A communication from Mr Geo E. Waring to Mr Kay was submitted in which Mr Waring claimed that there was due him from the city the sum of \$159.00 as sanitary engineer and on motion of Harris seconded by Trail the same was referred to the Finance Committee to investigate and report.
No further business Council adjourned
