Petition to change
College Street
improvement

A Petition asking for a change to be made in the College Street improvement was presented as follows: Hon City Council Alliance. O We the property owners on College Street between Arch and Union Ave request that the improvement petitioned for by us be so amended and the plan ^{of said improvement} changed that eight inches of said street be excavated below grade and the same be filled with good coarse gravel and that we be assessed for the same and that we waive further notice and publication of the same. Estimated Cost of
Above Change

The Engineer reported the estimated cost of the change as contemplated by the petitioners as follows: Total improvement of College Street as now provided, that is Grading Curbing and draining will cost based on Berlin & Middleton's bid \$1540⁰⁰, Bonds will be sold for \$1800⁰⁰ running three years which will leave a surplus of about \$210⁰⁰ To excavate 8 inches deeper will cost about \$209⁰⁰ additional and to fill with 8 inches of gravel suitable for wearing surface will cost about \$820⁰⁰ additional making total cost of improvement with 8 inches of gravel about \$2620⁰⁰

A Communication from L. C. Chapin
 Relative to Sewer Consulting Engineer on Sewers. Calling attention

 no 4 used by Berger and Macaulay on Lateral Sewer
 no 4 was not double strength pipe as
 required in the specifications for said Sewer

 Davidson seconded by Siefert the same was
 received and ordered placed on file

 of sewers the specifications were to govern
 in every respect both as to work and
 material.

estimate of the cost of a culvert across Oxford Street at the fill now being made. The estimate for a tile sewer being \$250⁰⁰ a brick arch culvert \$350⁰⁰ and riveted steel pipe \$400⁰⁰ and Harris moved that the plan of a tile culvert be adopted seconded by Kay. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Harris Kay Melaney Seft Trail Williams Kay Davidson Bush. Yeas 6 nays 2 and the motion was declared lost.

Keplinger home

Harris offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: "Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance that in the house connection to the sewer in front of the Keplinger Hotel a six inch connection be permitted". Kay seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Harris, Kay Melaney Sefert Trail Williams Bush Yeas 7 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Water Main on
Willow Ave

The following resolution was offered: "Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that the extension of the water main lately ordered on Willow Avenue be laid with reference to the established grades on the following streets: Broadway Cambridge and Summit". Williams moved the adoption of the same seconded by Trail and carried Yeas 7 nays none.

Oxford Street
Culvert

Harris called attention to the necessity of immediate action relative to the construction of the culvert across Oxford street near the railroad and moved that the same be referred to the Street and Sewer Committees and Chairman of Council with power to act seconded by Williams and carried. Yeas Harris Kay Melaney Sefert Trail Williams Wilson. Yeas 7 nays none.
