

Alliance Ohio December 17th 1894

Council met in regular session with president Bush in the Chair and the following members present Buck Harris Kay McLaney Trail Williams, and Davidson arriving during the session.

Minutes of preceding meetings read and approved.

Bill of John Senn reported a bill of \$51⁰⁰ in favor of John Senn Jr. for costs and attorney fees in the Kayler appropriation case. The said John Senn having been a tenant in the Kayler property and the jury having awarded him \$75⁰⁰ damages, and he agreeing to settle the claim for \$51⁰⁰. Kay moved the bill be allowed and that an ordinance be prepared providing for the payment of the same, seconded by Buck and carried. The ordinance being prepared was read and Kay moved the same be passed, seconded by Williams and carried. Yeas Buck Harris Kay McLaney Trail Williams Bush. Yeas 7 nays none and the ordinance was declared passed.

Repair Catch

Buck reported that the Catch Basin on Rush street needed some repairs and moved that the street Commissioner be instructed to make the necessary repairs, seconded by Trail and carried.

Berlin & Middleton

College Street

Mr Geo Middleton asked Council
for instructions relative to the finishing of
the work of the College Street improvement.
stating that the work was about all done except
setting the curbing and that some of the
property owners desired that part of the work
delayed until spring, while they (the Contractors)
would like to complete the work at once,
and Trail moved that the Contractors
Berlin and Middleton be allowed to proceed
and complete the work recorded by Harris
and carried, and on motion of Harris
the engineer was instructed to notify Mr
Early the contractor for the graveling of said
College Street to proceed with his work.

Davidson moved that the street
Commissioner be instructed to construct
a brick crossing at the first alley north of
the Union Avenue bridge on the East side
of Union Avenue seconded by Trail and
carried Yeas Buck Davidson Harris Kay

Davidson reported that the sidewalks on Washington Street was in bad condition and moved that the Clerk be instructed to notify the owners of property to fill their walks with cinders seconded by Melaney and carried.

Repair Crossing

Bush reported an alley crossing on South Webb Street near Broadway needing some repairs and on motion of Trail the Street Commissioner was instructed to repair the same.

Buck reported the necessity of some kind of a street crossing on North Webb Street at Keystone Street and the same was referred to the Street Committee to report at next meeting.

Harris reported that the case of Harrell against the city had been assigned for trial in the Common Pleas Court on Wednesday the 19th and moved that there be appropriated the sum of \$150⁰⁰ and the same be placed in the hands of the Clerk to defray the expenses of said trial seconded by Davidson and carried ^{yes & noys none}

Mr Robert Auld Contractor for Lateral Sewer no 19, asked that Council take action formally accepting the same and Trail moved that the Sewer Committee be instructed to report on the same at next meeting seconded by Williams and carried.

Harris moved that the Street Committee and engineer be instructed to make a written report on Mr Auld's contract for grading on Linden and High Streets seconded by Trail and carried

Petition for
light

A Petition asking for a light at the intersection of North Liberty and Noble Streets was referred to the Light Committee.

Harris offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

to discontinue
ringing bell

"Whereas: the frequent ringing of the bell in the city building is annoying to many persons in the vicinity of the building. Resolved that the city Marshal be directed to see that ringing of the bell except for purposes of fire or in case extraordinary emergencies be suspended from and after Dec 19th and that he give proper notice through the city papers tomorrow that the ringing of the bell is to be discontinued except for the purposes named." Kay seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Dues Davidson Harris Kay Melaney Trail Williams Bush. Yeas 8 nays none and the resolution was adopted.

Appoint Committee
to inspect buildings

Buck moved that the chairman appoint a Committee of three to inspect buildings and to determine as to their safety seconded by Davidson and carried.
