Council Chamber, Alliance, Ohio July 31st, 1893.

Council met in adjourned session with President Wilson in the chair and the following members present, Buck Bush Crubaugh, Conger Davidson, Gabele Harris, Love Williams, Absent Cowan and Sefert. Minutes of July 17 and 24th read and approved.

**Communication from Fire Chief.** A communication from the Chief of the Fire Department asking Council to take some action toward increasing the efficiency of the Fire and Patrol System by adding some men and another house and patrol wagon was on motion of Marris referred to the Fire Committee.

**Proposition of City to Railroad Co. Overhead Bridge.** The Bridge Committee to whom had been referred the proposition of the Railway Company to the City relative to over-head crossings submitted the following answer to the same.

1st. Main Street Crossing.

It is proposed that a bridge and approaches be made on the lines as shown on the blueprint hereto attached, marked Exhibit A.

2nd. That part of the bridge over the Railway property shall in no place be less than twenty feet above the top of the rail.

3rd. The Railway Company to build an iron superstructure with roadway 22 feet wide and sidewalk 6 feet wide across its property and tracks from "6" to "F" as shown on the plan except that the sidewalk shall be 6 feet wide.

4th. The Railway Company to provide the abutment or support at the north end at letter "E" and the City the abutment or support at the south end of letter "F".

5th. The Railway Company to build stairway at the point "A" and the footwalk "A" "B" from the south approach to the bridge to the stairway "A". This footwalk crosses the C & P R.R. and runs approximately east and west as shown on the plans.

6th. The Railway Company to build a stairway at point "C" and to give the right of way for an approach from the point "D" as shown on the plan.

7th. The City to build all the remaining parts of the Viaduct and the approaches and to assume all property damages.

8th. The Railway Company to maintain the Viaduct and the City the approaches.

9th. The Railway Company to maintain the stairway at "C".

10th. The Railway Company to maintain the stairway and footwalk at "A" "B".

11th. The Railway Company shall fence its property and the City of Alliance will pass an Ordinance making it a penal offence to cross the Railway tracks or trespass on the Railway grounds at this point.

**From Penna. Company, relative to Bridges.**

A communication was read from Mr. Jos. Wood of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company relative to over-head crossings and submitting a proposition to co-operate with the City in building over-head crossings across their tracks at the foot of Main Street and at Lincoln Avenue. The said proposition being in substance the same as verbally agreed upon between the Bridge Committee and Mr. Wood. Gabele moved that the Bridge Committee so modify the proposition submitted to the Railroad Company by the City as to conform to the one now submitted by said Company seconded by Davidson and carried, Yeas, Conger, Cowan, Crubaugh, Davidson, Gabele, Harris, Love, Sefert, Williams, Wilson. Nays, Bush.

Nuisance in  
first ward

The matter of the nuisance in the first ward caused by ~~sewerage~~ being emptied into the open ditch or stream known as Beck's run was taken up and discussed and Harris moved that when Council adjourn it be to meet on Wednesday evening Aug 29 and the Solicitor be instructed to prepare an Ordinance to prohibit the connection of sanitary sewerage with storm water sewers. seconded by Mellaney and Carried

Paint roof  
of City prison

Davidson reported that the roof of the fire Dept stable needed painting also the gutters on the city prison and moved that the Buildings and grounds Committee have the necessary painting done at a cost not to exceed ten dollars. seconded by Conger and Carried Yes 10 nays none.

Repair well  
curb

Davidson reported that the well at the corner of Main and Seneca Street needed a new top or curb also a drain to carry away the waste water. and moved that the Buildings and grounds Committee have the same done at a cost not to exceed \$125 seconded by Conger and Carried Yes 10 nays none.

Public water  
Closet

On Motion of Conger seconded by Harris the matter of providing a public water Closet was referred to the Buildings and grounds Committee to report at next meeting.

Thilson of the printing committee to whom had been referred the proposition of Sub Hartzell to publish the sewer regulatory ordinance reported unfavorably on the same and moved that three hundred copies be published by the City at a cost not to exceed \$500 seconded by Trail. and on motion of Davidson seconded by Conger the motion was laid on the table for one week.
