Council met in regular session with President Bush presiding and the following members present

Mayor's report
for Dec

The Mayor's report for the month of December showing fines and Licenses collected to the amount of \$32⁵⁵/₁₀₀ was presented and on motion of Wilson the same was accepted and ordered placed on file

Petition for Light

A petition asking that a light be placed at the intersection of South Morgan and East Summit Streets was referred to the Light Committee.

A petition for a crosswalk across Ely Street at Lincoln Avenue was referred to the Street committee to report at next meeting and on motion of Davidson the street committee was also instructed to report on the necessity of a crosswalk on west Main Street. (Mr. Harris at this time retired)

Payment of bills

This being the time for the payment of claims. The finance committee reported having approved a number of bills and asked that they be read. The bills were read and Kay moved they be allowed as read and that an ordinance be prepared providing for their payment seconded by Conger and carried. The ordinance being prepared was read and Kay moved the same be passed seconded by Conger. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Conger Davidson Kay Melaney Trail Williams Wilson Bush Yeas 8 nays none and the ordinance was declared passed.

Appointment of
Building examiners

In accordance with the action of

of unsafe buildings. Wilson moved the appoint-
ments be confirmed seconded by Davidson
The Yeas and nays were called resulting: Yeas

the appointments were declared confirmed.

To Contract with
Berlin & Middleton
on Colley's street

A resolution to accept bid of and
to contract with Berlin & Middleton for the
improvement of Colley's street was read by
the Clerk as follows: Be it resolved by the
Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that the bid
of Berlin & Middleton for the improvement of
Colley's Street from Arch Street West to Union
Avenue be accepted the same being the lowest
in the aggregate for said work and that the
Mayor and Clerk be authorized to enter
into a contract on behalf of the City
with said Berlin & Middleton for doing said
work at the following prices to wit

The ~~Street~~^{Sanitary} Committee and Engineer submitted the following report:

"We your committee to whom was assigned the supervision of the construction of the brick Arch Culvert on Union Avenue at the Railroad bridge by Berger & Mucanley beg to report the work completed according to the plans and specifications and to our entire satisfaction and we recommend that the same be approved and accepted by Council" signed G.R. Tyler J.W. Seibert O.B. Conger Wilson moved for adoption of the report seconded by Trail and Carried.

The Street Committee submitted the following report: "We the Street Committee of the Council under whose supervision the grading on Linden Avenue and High Street was done by Robert Auld and the grading on Freedom Avenue and Broadway was done by C. Osborn have to report said grading completed by said contractors to the entire satisfaction of the committee and in accordance with our instructions and we ask that the same be approved and accepted by the Council.

Wilson moved the adoption of the report seconded by Davidson and Carried.

Telephone for
City Engineer

Kay offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: Resolved that the City Engineer be requested to have a telephone placed in his residence at his own expense for rental and he is hereby authorized to sign a contract with the telephone Company for the same at the City's Contract price." Trail seconded the motion to adopt, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 9 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Violation of
License Ordinance

The Mayor called attention of Council to an action having been brought against Mr Hoffman for a violation of the license ordinance, by peddling meat without a license, which case was pending being set for hearing on the 8th inst, and stated that several members of Council had expressed themselves to him as being opposed to the prosecution of the case, and he asked whether Council desired to take any action in the matter, and Buck moved that the solicitor be instructed to nolle the case, seconded by Conger and Carried, and an motion of Wilson seconded by Conger the matter of amending the License Ordinance was referred to the Judiciary Committee to report at next meeting.
