

Meeting of March 4<sup>th</sup> 1895

Council met in regular session with President Bush presiding and the following members present. Buck Conger Crumbach Davidson Kay Defert Trail Williams Wilson. Absent- Harris, Melaney on motion of Wilson the reading of the minutes was dispensed with.

The finance committee reported having approved a number of bills. and reported to Council three bills. one in favor of Mrs W<sup>m</sup> Ainsat and two in favor of Ault & Heer which the committee asked for instruction concerning the liability of the City to pay and on motion of Kay seconded by Trail they were referred to the clerk to look up the records and report whether any authority had been given for them. Kay then moved that the bills approved be read and that an ordinance be prepared providing for their payment seconded by Trail and carried. The bills were read and an ordinance prepared and read and Wilson moved the same be passed seconded Trail. The yeas and nays were called resulting Buck Conger Crumbach Davidson Kay Defert Trail Williams Wilson Kay Bush. Yeas 9 nays 1 and the ordinance was declared passed.

Conger reported the necessity of a street crossing across Cely Street at Lincoln Avenue also the Crossing at the corner of Park and Perry Streets needing repairs and moved that the street commissioner be instructed to do said work seconded by Davidson and carried Yeas 10 nays none.

Buck reported that on South Seneca Street a sewer was being emptied out on the surface of the street causing a nuisance and moved that the matter be referred to the street committee to take the necessary steps to abate the same.

Davidson reported that the recent rains had caused the water to overflow the street and sidewalks at the Union Avenue bridge. Causing some damage and that the culvert required some work and moved that on condition that the Penna R R Co would furnish the material that the city do the work seconded by Conger. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Conger Davidson Kay Siefert Wilson. Nays Burch Cornbough Trail Williams Bush. Yeas 5 nays 5 and the motion was declared lost.

Wilson reported that one John Stamp of the sixth ward was occupying a portion of the street and sidewalk adjoining his property <sup>with</sup> old wagons and farming implements &c to the annoyance of the public and on motion of Trail seconded by Conger the Marshal was instructed to order the said Stamp to remove all such obstructions and keep the street and sidewalk free from any further obstruction
