

Council Chamber, Alliance of June 10-1898
 Council met in regular session with President Kay presiding and the following members present: Buck Conger, Lambough, Love, Melaney, Trail, J. G. Williams. Absent: Bush, Defert, J. R. Williams, Wilson.

On motion of Melaney the reading of the minutes was dispensed with.

Petition to extend
 water main

A petition signed by J. F. Matchett and 12 others asking that the water main be extended on Noble street was referred to the water committee.

Payment of
 Sewer Estimates

The following bills were presented: Bill of G. D. + W. S. Kersey for \$509²⁸ being the balance due on Main Sewer no 2 & 3. Bill of Berger & Macauley for \$758⁸⁷/₁₀₀ final estimate on Sewer no 4 and bills of Robert Learmonth of \$160³² for estimate on Sewer no 27 and \$116⁸⁰ for extension of sewer no 27 across the C & P R R.

Love moved that the bills be approved and allowed as read and that an Ordinance be prepared providing for their payment seconded by Conger and carried.

The ordinance being prepared was read and Conger moved the same be passed seconded by Melaney. The Yeas and Nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Conger, Lambough, Love, Melaney, Trail, J. G. Williams, Kay. Yeas & nays none and the ordinance was declared passed.

extend time of
 Payment of bonds

The Clerk reported that bonds to the amount of \$2000⁰⁰ would mature June 15th the same being Lateral Sewer bonds and as no assessments had been collected to meet them on account of the injunction restraining the city from using the sewers it would be necessary to refund the bonds and that inasmuch as other bonds would mature in a short time

" which it would be necessary to refund. Buck moved that the clerk be instructed to negotiate a temporary loan to meet the bonds coming due June 15th until such time as other bonds mature, so that they could all be refunded at the same time. seconded by Trail and carried Yeas 8 nays none

Grant Street
Grading

The street committee submitted the following report: To the committee to whom was referred the Grant Street case by leave to make the following report: We would advise that the street be put in passable condition between Freedom and Seneca streets and we can see no reason why the west end of the street cannot remain as it is for the present as we have no money to do any work on streets except what is absolutely necessary to keep the city out of litigation" signed F. J. Melaney O. C. Conyer L. H. Bush Conyer moved the adoption of the report seconded by Trail and carried.

Committee to
go to Canton
relative to bridge

Mr W. W. Cantine being present stated to Council that the iron work of the overhead bridge at the east end of Main Street was about ready to put up and that as now planned it was of such pattern as would present a very unsightly appearance. and Love moved that there be a committee of three appointed to go to Canton, in company with Mr Cantine and S. J. Williams (who volunteered their services) to confer with the County Commissioners relative to having the same changed. seconded by J. Y. Williams and carried and the Chairman appointed Love, J. Y. Williams and Conyer

 over the Mahoning river; thence north $74^{\circ} 30' E$
 184.8 feet; thence north $5^{\circ} E$ 264 feet thence north
 $24^{\circ} 30' W$ 412.50 feet; thence north $18^{\circ} 15' E$ 264 feet;
 thence north $30^{\circ} 30'$ 198 feet; thence north $29^{\circ} 30' W$
 346.5 feet; thence north 84.48 feet to north
 line of said quarter thence East 264 feet to
 place of beginning. Containing about
 $13 \frac{1}{100}$ acres (excepting therefrom the building
 known as "Mill" and the real estate on which
 the same is situated lying 60 feet on Walnut
 street and 200 feet on Gastkill Street) all
 of said property lying north of Gastkill Street
 and west of Walnut Street and the solicitor
 is hereby authorized and directed to apply to a
 competent Court of Jurisdiction in the County for
 impaneling a jury to make inquiry into
 and assess the compensation to be paid for such
 property. The costs and expense of said appropriation
 to be paid out of the Sewer fund

Love moved that the resolution passed June 3rd relating to the appropriation of land for sewer disposal plant be rescinded seconded by McLaney and carried

Love then offered the following resolution ~~and seconded it~~: Be it resolved by the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio that the Mayor of this city is hereby notified to give written notice to The Alliance Water Works Company and Daniel Rankle of the pendency of the resolution introduced in Council June 10th 1895. to appropriate land lying north of Gastill and west of Walnut Streets for the purpose of constructing a disposal works. That Thomas R. Jones marshal is hereby appointed to serve said notice. and in case either of said parties cannot be found in this County; then the Mayor shall give notice by publication for such one not found in the County as provided by law"

Conger moved the adoption of the above resolution seconded by Love the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Buck Conger Love McLaney Trail J. G. Williams Crumbaugh Kay. Yeas 8 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted

Buck moved that there be a special Committee of three appointed to investigate the conduct of the fire department at the Main street fire June 4th seconded by Conger and carried and chairman Kay appointed as said Committee Buck J. G. Williams & Conger

Bids for the construction of the Park street culvert having been received on June 7th the same were submitted as follows:
 G. W. Middleton \$187⁰⁰. Jno Wilson \$183.30
 Robert Auld \$150⁰⁰. on motion of Conger seconded Trail the bid of Robert Auld was accepted. and on motion of Buck seconded by Conger Yeas 8 nays none. The street Committee was instructed to contract with Mr Auld for doing said work according to the plans and specifications therefor

Set grade stakes

On motion of J. Y. Williams seconded by Trail the Engineer was instructed to set the grade stakes for the grade on Beaman Street between Arch Street and the railroad

Mayor to prohibit Shows on city lot

Love moved that the Mayor be forever prohibited from granting license to any show or merry go round on the city lot recorded by Trail and Carried.

Copleys street

Trail reported that the improvement of Copleys street had been completed and ^{moved} the acceptance of the work seconded by J. Y. Williams.

There being no report from the Engineer or Committee. Trail moved that the matter be deferred for one week and that the Engineer report on the work at that time. seconded by Melaney and Carried.

Summit St
Grade Ordinance

An Ordinance to establish a grade on Summit Street was read first time. and there being no further business Council adjourned
