

Council Chamber Alliance O June 17. 1895

Council met in regular session with President Key presiding and the following members present: Buck Bush lawyer Cornbaugh, Lovv, Melaney, Trail J. R. Williams, J. G. Williams, absent Siefert and Wilson. Minutes of preceding meetings read and approved.

Petition for
Light on
W Main st

A Petition from residents of west main street asking that there be two electric lights placed on said west main street was presented and referred to the light committee.

Procure tile
for Grant st

Bush moved that the street committee be instructed to procure the tile necessary for a culvert across Grant street at its intersection with Seneca street and have Grant street graded from Linden Avenue to Liberty street seconded by J. R. Williams and carried yeas 9 nays none.

Grade Warehouse
street

Bush moved that sufficient dirt be taken from Warehouse street to make the fill to the north approach to the bridge over the P. F. W. & C. R. R. seconded by Melaney and carried.

dirt for
Simpson Street

Buck moved that Mr. H. E. Judd be authorized to place 400 loads of dirt on Simpson Street at a cost not to exceed \$7500 seconded by Trail. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Cornbaugh, Key, Buck, Lovv, Lovv, Melaney, Trail, J. R. Williams, J. G. Williams, Key. yeas 2 nays 8, and the motion was declared lost.

Notices on
Ash street

The clerk read the Marshal's return of having served notice on the property owners on Ash street of the passage of a resolution to improve the same. Mr. Ogline who owned property on said Ash street being present asked that certain changes be made in the plans

and specifications adopted. Stating that a number of the property owners on the north side of the street desired that curbing be set on that side of the street and that they wished to lay their own sidewalks. Bush then moved that all legislation heretofore had pertaining to the improvement of Ash street be annulled. seconded by J.R. Williams The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas. Buck Bush Conger Combaugh Lorr Melaney Trail. J.R. Williams J.Y. Williams. Nays. Yeas 10 nays none and the motion was declared Carried.

Prepare plans
for ash st

Bush then moved that the street Committee and Engineer be instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of Ash street. seconded by Melaney and carried.

Complete fill
at Oxford st
bridge

Bush moved that the street Committee be authorized to procure the dirt necessary to complete the approaches to the Oxford street bridge at a cost not to exceed ten cents per cubic yard. seconded by J.R. Williams and carried Yeas 10 nays none.

Lorr moved that the dirt be measured in place and that \$100⁰⁰ be appropriated from the street fund to pay for the same. seconded by Trail The yeas and nays were called resulting. Yeas. Buck Bush Conger Combaugh Lorr Trail J.R. Williams Kay. Nays Melaney. J.Y. Williams. Yeas 8 nays 2 and the motion was declared Carried

Union ave

Bush moved that the street Committee and Engineer prepare plans and specifications for the further improvement of Union avenue between the

railroad bridge and City street. seconded by
Coryer and carried.

College street

The following ^{on the College street improvement} report was submitted

curbing between Arch and Union Avenue
beg to report that the contractors, Berlin
& Middleton have completed their part of
the improvement according to contract
and to our satisfaction. signed

city engineer. Bush moved the report
be adopted seconded by Coryer. The yeas
and nays were called resulting Yeas

Kay. Yeas 10 nays none. and the report was
declared adopted.

An Ordinance to provide for
the issuing of the bonds of the city of Alliance Ohio
for the purpose of extending the time of payment
of certain indebtedness which from its limits
of taxation said city is unable to pay at
maturity was read first time and Coryer
moved that the rules be suspended and
the ordinance be read second time by title
seconded by J. Y. Williams. The yeas and nays
were called resulting Yeas Buck Bush Coryer
Crubaugh Lovv Melaney Trail J. R. Williams
J. Y. Williams Kay. Yeas 10 nays none
The rules were declared suspended. The ordinance
was read second time and Bush moved that
the rules be again suspended and the ordinance
be read third time seconded by J. Y. Williams
The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas

Jos. Y. Williams moved that the question of determining whose duty it is to extend the culvert on Grant street near the railroad across the sidewalk whether the city or the owner of the abutting property be referred to the Judiciary Committee and solicitor seconded by Buck and lost.
