Protect Vine
& Park streets

Bush called attention to the dangerous conditions existing at the corner of Vine and Park Street and moved that the Street Committee be instructed to provide the necessary protection at that point to prevent accidents. seconded by Conger and Carriegl

fill at Gastill
street bridge

Trail reported that the County Commissioners had recently built an abutment at the west end of the bridge on Gastill Street, and had left the same in a dangerous condition on account of the fill not being made and moved that the street commissioner be instructed to make said fill at once. seconded by Conger.

There being some difference of opinion as to whose duty it was to make the fill Love moved to amend by referring the matter to the Street Committee with power to act. seconded by Conger and Carried

Lower corner
stone

President Kay reported that at the intersection of Grant Street and Union Avenue, a corner stone projected above the ^{surface of the} street to such an extent as to cause an obstruction and on motion of Conger the Engineer was instructed to have the same lowered

College St
Gravel

In the matter of putting the gravel on College Street. Trail moved that Mr Boston whose bid was accepted be given until October 1st to complete the same. seconded by J. G. Williams and Carried Yeas 8 nays 0

There not being sufficient money in the College Street ^{fund} to allow council to enter into

a contract with Mr Boston. Love moved that he be allowed to proceed with the work without a contract - if he so desired and at his own risk seconded by Conger and carried

Union av

Mr D. Fording called attention of Council to the necessity of repairs on Union Avenue. and on motion of Bush the same was referred to the Street Committee to report at next meeting.

Arch street

Buck moved that the street committee investigate the condition of South Arch Street macadam and report at next meeting seconded by J. Y. Williams and carried

Purchase of
Reck Property

Love of the sewer committee to whom had been referred the matter of securing an option on land for a sewer disposal plant. reported that the committee had obtained an option on the David Reck property on Keystone Street at the sum of \$1650⁰⁰. and Bush moved that the committee be instructed to contract for the same at the price named seconded by Conger and carried Yeas 8 nays none.

J. H. Allen's
sidewalk

Mr J. H. Allen stated to Council that he had been notified to lay a sidewalk in front of his property on South Liberty Street and that the sidewalk now laid was in good condition and that he did not think it necessary to tear it up and lay a new one. and on motion of Conger the matter was referred to the sidewalk committee to report at next meeting

Motion to
Lower Sidewalk

J. Y. Williams moved that the street commissioners be instructed to lower the sidewalks ^{to the present grade.} on both the east and west sides of Park Street between Market and Main Streets at the expense of the city. seconded by Buck.

There being some difference of opinion

as to the City being liable for any change of grade necessitating the lowering of said walks Bush moved the matter be referred to the sidewalk committee and solicitor to report at next meeting seconded by J. Y. Williams and carried.

An Ordinance to amend the grade on High street was read first time.

On motion of Bush the Clerk was instructed to notify the Printing Committee to make a report on the matter of city printing. No further business council adjourned.
