

Council Chamber Alliance O'Aug. 5th 1898

Council met in regular session with President Kay presiding and the following members present: Buck Bush Love, Melaney, Sept Trail, J. Y. Williams. Absent Conger, Crumbrough, J. R. Williams, Wilson

Love moved that the reading of the minutes be dispensed with and that the order of business be so changed as to have the sewer committee heard. seconded by Bush and carried. Love then reported that the sewer committee had plans prepared for a sewer disposal plant. ~~by~~ by Engineer Chapin. Mr Chapin being present submitted a report on the matter of sewer disposal by chemical precipitation giving the method of operation and an estimate of the cost with a general outline of the system and on motion of Bush seconded by Melaney the report was accepted and ordered placed on file. The plans of the proposed plant were then submitted and Love moved that Engineer Chapin be instructed to submit said plans to the State Board of Health for their approval, seconded by Trail and carried.

Bush moved that when Council adjourn it be to meet on Wednesday evening Aug 7th seconded by J. Y. Williams and carried.

Bush moved that the clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for the construction of the sewer disposal works, seconded by Trail and carried.

Love reported that the finance committee had met and approved a number of bills but that there were several bills that she knew nothing about and asked that Council take action on them. Viz. bill of J. T. Maybacht & sons for Lumber was referred to the sidewalk committee. Bill of Robt Auld

 for their payment seconded by Trail and carried
 The Ordinance being prepared ~~was read~~ and there
 not being sufficient money in the water fund
 to pay the appropriation contained therein Love
 moved that there be apportioned from any
 unapportioned money in the treasury to the
 water fund the sum of \$32⁰⁰, seconded by Trail
 and carried. The Ordinance was then read and

 for Sanitary policeman be stricken out seconded
 by Melaney and lost.

Bush moved that the bill of Robert
 Leammouth for \$40²⁵ for extra work on sewer no 27
 be stricken out seconded by Trail and lost.

Melaney moved that the bill of Geo
 R. Gyger for \$43²⁵ for surveying at Main Street
 bridge be stricken out seconded by Bush and lost

Love then moved the passage of the
 Ordinance seconded by Bush The yeas and
 nays were called resulting Yeas Bush
 Love Sept Trail J. Y. Williams Kay. Nays
 Bush, Melaney Yeas 6 nays 2 and the motion
 was declared lost.
