

Council Chamber Alliance 0 Sept 16. 1895

Council met in regular session with President Key in the chair and the following members present. Bush Embury Love Melaney Sept Trail. J.R. Williams J.Y. Williams. absent Buck Conyer and Wilson. Minutes of meetings of August 26. and Sept 2nd read and approved.

Protest against
Sewer Disposal

A Petition signed by Jacob Shaffer and a number of others protesting against the building of the proposed sewer disposal works on the Peck and Garrison properties was presented and on motion of Love seconded by Trail referred to the Committee on Buildings and grounds

Petition against
Street R.R

A Petition signed by T.A. Ballou and a number of others asking that Council take some action to compel the Street Railway Company to place their tracks in condition that it would be safe to drive horses over without being shocked by the electric current - was referred to the Street Committee with power to act.

Love of the finance Committee reported two bills: one in favor of Arthur Boston for \$225.⁰⁰ as an estimate on the College street improvement and one in favor of McCallum Bros for \$140⁰⁰ as balance due on the Market street Contract and moved that they be allowed and that an Ordinance be prepared providing for their payment seconded by Trail and carried. The ordinance being prepared was read and Bush moved the same be passed seconded by Love The Yeas and Nays were called resulting Yeas Bush Embury Love Melaney Trail J.R. Williams J.Y. Williams. Key. Geo S Key and the ordinance was declared passed

The Clerk reported that bids had been received on Sept 7th for the \$20,000 sewer disposal bonds and the \$4500 Mrs Campbell Judgment bonds and that the bid of Dietz, Denison & Pryor of Cleveland Ohio was the highest - viz: for the \$20,000. Sewer bonds a premium of \$629 ⁸⁵ for the \$4500. \$184 ⁹⁵ also on Sept 14th Ash street bonds in the sum of \$2450 to the same parties at a premium of \$76 ⁰⁰. and Love moved that the bids of Dietz Denison & Pryor be accepted and the bonds awarded to them seconded by Bush and carried yeas 8 nays none

Bush moved that the Clerk be instructed to notify the water works Co to repair Seneca street from Oxford street to High Street. they having put in water main on said street and it being left in bad condition seconded by J. R. Williams and carried.

Petition to improve S. Webb Street

A petition to improve South Webb Avenue from Ash Street south to the first alley south of and parallel with Ash Street signed by Jno. Klinger and August Greve was read and Bush moved the same be received and placed on file seconded by J. R. Williams and carried

Resolution to improve

A resolution declaring it necessary to improve South Webb Avenue in accordance with said petition was offered and on motion of Bush, laid on the table for one week.

Grade on Columbia St

President Kay reported that the property owners on ^{south side of} Columbia Street from Freedom to Seneca Street desired to lay sidewalks but that the street was above grade and if the sidewalks were put to grade they would be considerably below the street, and the matter was referred to the sidewalk committee to report at next meeting.
