

Albion Ohio Oct 7. 1895

Council met in regular session with President Kay in the Chair and members all present. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved

Payment of bills.

The finance Committee reported having approved a number of bills, stating that they were in the hands of the clerk and asked that they be read. The bills were read and Love moved that they be allowed ~~and~~ read and that an ordinance be prepared providing for their payment, with the understanding that the bills of N W Anson for the balance due on sewers no 11 & 12, be not paid until the street and sewer committees reported all settlements along the line of the sewers repaired and the bill of D Beck for land for sewer disposal when clear title furnished for said land. seconded by Trail and Carried. The Ordinance being prepared was read and Love moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Trail. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Buck Bush Conyer Embaugh Love Melaney Siefert Trail J.R. Williams J.G. Williams Wilson Kay Yeas 12 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed

Bill of G W Schooley was referred to the Police Committee and bills of the Water Works Company were referred to the Water Committee

Repair Union Ave

Attention was called to the necessity of repairing the macadamizing on Union Avenue and J.G. Williams moved that the street Committee be instructed to have placed thereon gravel to protect the flag where necessary at a cost not to exceed \$100⁰⁰ seconded by Wilson. Love moved to amend by referring the matter to the street Committee to report at next meeting and

estimate of the cost of the necessary repairs seconded by Trail and Carried The Original motion as amended was then put and carried.

Repair Patterson street,

Conger reported that some filling was necessary to be done on Patterson street near Joseph Miller's property and moved that the street committee be instructed to do the same seconded by Wilson and carried.

Engineer to report on Waugh Coal mine

Report was made that the parties operating the Waugh coal mines were taking the coal out from under the streets and alleys in the vicinity of the Waugh property and Conger moved that the matter be referred to the engineer to report at next meeting seconded by Trail and Carried.

Open drain on Broadway

On motion of Bush the street committee was instructed to have the ditch on the south side of Broadway between Arch and Linden Avenue opened.

Repair Alley

On motion of Bush the street committee was instructed to have the alley on the east side of Rockhill's Livery stable repaired.

Clean Gutters on Ely street

On motion of Conger the street Commissioner was instructed to clean the gutters on Ely street.

Repair alley

The matter of repairs to the first alley south of Market street was on a motion of Bush referred to the street committee with power to act.

The Chairman of the Special Committee to whom had been referred the petition of property owners along the street Railway line protesting against the measures

To the honorable Council City of Alliance, Gentlemen. Whereas under resolution of Council a special Committee of three was appointed at a meeting held Sept 30th with power to act in the manner in which the Alliance Street Ry Co were constructing their tracks on the line of State Street and Arch Avenue and upon careful investigation of the work, resolution and franchise under which the same was being done find no cause of complaint and recommend that the Company be permitted to go forward with the reconstruction of their track as contemplated by resolution of Council

Mr J. Y. Williams then submitted the following as the majority report of the Committee:

To the Council of the City of Alliance We beg leave to make the following report: That we have carefully examined the work referred to us and find that the Street Railway Co is not laying its track in accordance with its franchise and we on the 2nd day of October made the ~~fact~~ attached Report to the Mayor with instructions to serve the same upon the Manager of the Street Railway Company.

The report to the Manager of the Street R R Co attached to the foregoing report was as follows: Whereas representation by petition having been made to the City Council of Alliance that the franchise and

and resolutions under which you are now constructing your track in said City are being violated by your Company and at a regular meeting of the city Council of Alliance held in the city hall Sept 30 1898 a committee of three was appointed under resolution of Council to investigate the same with power to act and upon careful examination on the part of said Committee we find that in our judgment the representations set forth by said petitioners are substantially correct. Therefore you are hereby required to place the top of the ties used in said construction on Arch Ave from State to Milner streets at least twelve inches below the surface of the street filling the excavation above the ties with stone or other suitable material as provided for under section 3 of said franchise and that you proceed no further with said improvement until that part of the track between State and Milner streets now laid be made to conform to said franchise.

Signed J. G. Williams. A. B. Love
Love moved that the majority report be substituted for the minority report recorded by J. G. Williams and lost. The motion to adopt the minority report was then put and carried.

Wilson moved that the Finance Committee and Clerk purchase a car load of buck for Street Crossings recorded by Conger and carried.

J. G. Williams moved that Council tender to J. C. Garrison and others interested in the property the sum of \$250 for the land sought to be appropriated for sewer disposal purposes recorded by Love

The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 12 nays none and the motion was declared carried

The street Commissioner was instructed to open up all catch in the city

Ashes & Cinders

Complaint was made that refuse ashes &c was being thrown out upon the streets and alleys in different parts of the city and on motion of Bush the matter was referred to the street Committee with power to act

Resolution to
repair Main st

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: "Be it resolved by the City Council of the city of Alliance Ohio that it is hereby declared necessary to repair Main Street from its terminus at the Union depot west to Arch Ave."

J. R. Williams seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Boyer Love Melaney Deput Trail J. R. Williams J. G. Williams Wilson Kay. Gray. Combough yeas 10 nays one (Bush not voting) and the resolution was declared adopted.

To purchase
fire Dept

The fire Committee submitted the following report: "We the undersigned members of the fire Committee beg leave to report that we fully realize the necessity of more and better facilities for fighting fire. but first of all it is the opinion of your Committee that any and all of the apparatus belonging to the fire department should be owned by the city and your Committee respectfully recommend the same" signed. C. H. Bush F. J. Melaney M. Trail. Wilson moved the

adoption of the report seconded by
J. R. Williams and carried.

Wilson reported that on
frequent occasions the water works
Company pumped the stand pipe
full and to overflowing thereby
causing damage to the street and
to adjoining property and on his
motion the Clerk was instructed to notify
the company of the same

Bush reported that
some repairs were needed on sidewalks
on North Union Ave near the bridge
and the same was referred to the
sidewalk Committee

Bush reported that there
were three new sidewalks ready to be laid
on North Webb Street and moved that
they be allowed to be laid in a line to
conform to the sidewalks already laid on
that street, seconded by Trail and carried

Siefert reported that Mr
S. Joliet had agreed to give \$200⁰⁰
for the stone in the Webb street
Culvert and Wilson moved that
the proposition be accepted seconded
by Bush and carried.
