

Council Chamber Alliance Ohio Dec 2nd 1895

Council met in regular session with president Kay presiding and the following members present: Lovv, Defert, Trail, J. R. Williams, J. G. Williams, Wilson, absent Buck, Bush, Conger, Corubaugh, Melaney. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Communication
from Pres of
Akron Council

President Kay submitted a communication from A. H. Palmer, President of the Akron City Council asking this Council to lend their influence toward having spring elections abolished and to have such elections held in November at the same time as state elections.

Payment of bills

The Finance Committee reported having approved a number of bills and asked that they be read. The bills were then read by the clerk and Lovv moved that they be allowed as read and that an Ordinance be prepared providing for their payment seconded by Defert and carried. The Ordinance being prepared and there not being sufficient money in certain funds to pay the appropriations contained therein Lovv moved that there be apportioned from the unapportioned fund to the Street fund the sum of \$90⁰⁰ and to the Fire fund \$142⁰⁰ seconded by J. G. Williams and carried. The Ordinance was then read and Lovv moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Trail. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Lovv, Defert, Trail, J. R. Williams, J. G. Williams, Wilson, Kay. Yeas 7 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

\$3⁸⁰ turned over
by Cantine

Lovv reported that Mr W. W. Cantine had turned over to the finance committee \$3⁸⁰ fees paid him as a witness in the Campbell case

requesting that the same be turned into the city treasury, and moved the same be accepted seconded by Wilson and Curried.

Wilson reported that a street crossing was needed on Union Avenue at College Street and stated that if the City would furnish the brick on the ground for such crossing that the parties in the 6th ward interested would construct the same without cost to the City and moved that the Street Commissioner be instructed to haul and place on the ground sufficient brick for a crossing at that point seconded by J. R. Williams and lost.

Trail of the Bridge Committee to whom had been referred the proposition of C. A. Beeson to place an advertisement on the Main Street bridge reported that the Committee were not in favor of allowing any signs or advertisements on the bridge.

To extend Storm
water sewer

Deput of the Sewer Committee reported that in his opinion it would be advisable to extend the storm water sewer now built across North Webb Street, west to and across North Liberty Street by continuing the tile to that point and covering them, and Wilson moved that the Sewer Committee be instructed to purchase sufficient tile to make such extension and have them placed as contemplated in the report - seconded by Trail

The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas. Deput. Trail, J. R. Williams & Williams Wilson Kay. Yeas 6 nays none and the motion was declared carried

Resolution to
abolish spring
elections

Wilson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: Be it resolved by the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio that it is the sense of this Council that all spring elections be abolished in this state and that the elections heretofore held in the spring be held in november at the time of holding state elections and that the representatives of this county and senatorial district be requested to support such a law at the coming session of the legislature and that the Mayor be instructed to send duly Certified copies of this resolution to said representations and A. H. Palmer of Akron Ohio"

Trail seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 7 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

To locate a

Trail reported that Mr Cantine of the Mutual Light Co desired to locate the light on the Main Street bridge and if allowed to do so and upon trial it did not prove to be in the right place that he would remove it to any point on the bridge that Council might designate. and moved that he be granted the privilege of locating said light - seconded by Siefert and carried.

The Clerk reported that it was necessary to procure a book to record sewer assessments. and on Motion of Love he was instructed to procure the same

On motion of Wilson the Clerk was instructed to notify the Manager of the Street Railway Co to remove the old rails from Arch street which had been thrown out and left lying on the Street.

It was reported that in relaying the brick on Arch street where the street Railway was being laid that

legal rate and recommend that a
contract at said rates be entered into

and nays were called resulting

Wilson Kay. nays J. B. Williams
yeas 6 nays 1 and the report was
declared adopted.
