Council met in regular session with President Kay presiding and members all present.

Minutes of preceeding meeting read and approved

Pfouts declines to accept for one month

A communication from O.W. Pfouts who had at the preceeding meeting been elected city engineer for one month, declining to accept the office was read by the clerk and on motion of J.Y. Williams the same was ordered placed on file

Communication from Cemetery Directors

A Communication from the Cemetery Directors asking council to levy $\frac{1}{10}$ mill to be set apart for the purpose of building a receiving Vault in the cemetery was presented and on motion of Conger referred to the cemetery and finance committees

Selection of City Clerk

J.Y. Williams moved that Council retire and go into caucus for the purpose of selecting a candidate for City Clerk. to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of the present clerk which had been tendered at the preceeding meeting seconded by Trail and carried. The Council then retired and upon returning Russell placed in nomination for City Clerk Joseph H. McConnell, ^{and moved the same be confirmed} Trail seconded the nomination. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Conger, Carubaugh, Love Morgan Russell Scott Scrauton, Sefer, Trail, J.R. Williams J.Y. Williams Kay. Yeas 12 nays none, and the nomination was declared confirmed.

Board of Health Equalization

This bring the time for the appointment of members of the Board of Equalization, and there bring vacancies existing in the fourth and fifth wards caused by the expiration of the terms of the members from said wards. Love moved that Dr S.T. Mcandles be appointed from the fourth ward, seconded by Sefer. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas 12 nays none and Mr Mcandles was declared elected

J.Y. Williams placed in nomination for the fifth ward

Mr J. D. Wood, seconded by Conger
 Sefert nominated B. F. Prescott, seconded
 by Russell. President Kay appointed as tellers
 Conger and Scranton and ordered a Ballot
 which was taken and the result announced
 Prescott 9 Wood 2, and Prescott was declared
 Elected.

Board of
 Health

There being several vacancies in the
 Board of Health the appointment of members
 for said board was called for, and Sefert
 nominated King Sheckler for member from the
~~first~~ ^{second} ward. Seconded by Trail. J. G. Williams
 nominated Frank Miller. President Kay announced
 that the same tellers appointed to take ballot for
 Board of Equalization would act in this. a ballot
 was taken resulting. Sheckler 7. Miller 5 and
 Sheckler was declared elected.

Russell nominated A. W. Green for member
 from the first ward seconded by Conger there
 being no other nominations the roll was
 called on the confirmation resulting yeas 12
 nays none and Green was declared elected.

Morgan placed in nomination for
 member from the third ward Wm Shidler
 there being no other nominations the roll was
 called resulting yeas 12 nays none and
 Shidler was declared elected.

Scott placed in nomination Wm Hoiles
 for member from the sixth ward. Trail
 seconded the nomination. The yeas and
 nays were called resulting yeas 12 nays
 none and the nomination was declared
 confirmed.

A resolution to Construct Sewer
 no 16. was read by the Clerk as follows:
 Be it resolved by the Council of the City of
 Alliance Ohio that it is hereby declared
 necessary to make a public improvement
 by extending the construction of the present
 Sewer System by excavating and laying
 the necessary tile according to the plans

specifications and profiles now on file in the city Clerk's office for the construction of sewer no 16 along the following streets and alleys: Commencing at Main sewer no 3 at the intersection of Mechanic street and the first alley running east and west south of and parallel with Main Street, thence west along said alley to Union Avenue thence south along Union Avenue to Grant Street.

The cost and expense of said improvement shall be assessed per foot front according to the laws and ordinances on the subject of assessments upon the lots and lands abutting on said improvement and payable in three annual installments and bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessments. The Clerk is hereby instructed to cause notice of the passage of this resolution by publishing the same for two consecutive weeks in some newspaper of general circulation in the corporation.

Loos moved the adoption of the resolution seconded by Seft. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Conger, Crumbaugh Loos Morgan Russell Scott Scranton Seft Trail J. R. Williams J. Y. Williams Kay. Yeas 12 nays 0 and the resolution was declared adopted.

A resolution to construct sewer no 21, was offered as follows:

Sewer no 21

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio that it is hereby declared necessary to make a public improvement by extending the construction of the present sewer system by excavating, laying the necessary tile and connecting the same for sewer no 21 according to the plans, specifications and profiles now on file in the city Clerk's office, along the following streets and alleys of said city: Commencing at the manhole in the first alley running east and west parallel with and south of Oxford Street between Liberty and Seneca avenues thence west along said alley to the first alley running north and south, thence south along said alley to Grant Street. Also a portion of sewer no 19 commencing at said manhole thence west along said alley to the center of said Seneca Avenue. The cost and expense of said improvement shall be assessed per front foot according to the laws and ordinances

- 11 on the subject of assessments on the lots and lands bounding and abutting on said improvement and shall be payable in three annual installments and bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessments and the clerk is hereby directed to ~~cause~~ give notice of the passage of this resolution by having the same published in some newspaper of general circulation in the corporation for two consecutive weeks.

11 J.R. Williams moved the adoption of the resolution recorded by Morgan the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas: Conyer Crumbugh Lorr Russell Morgan Scott Scranton Siefert Trail J.R. Williams J.G. Williams Kay yeas 12 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted

Sewer no 25'

A resolution to construct Sewer no 25' was offered as follows: Be it resolved by the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio that it is hereby declared necessary to extend the construction of the present sewer system by constructing sewer no 25' according to the plans specifications and profiles now on file in the city clerk's office for the same along the following streets and alleys of said city of Alliance commencing at the manhole on South Webb Avenue at its intersection with Columbia Street between lots no 799 and 806 thence west along Columbia Street to the first alley running north and south east of and parallel with South Liberty Avenue thence south along said alley to a spot designated for termination between lots no 851 and 854 situated on Broadway in said city; The cost and expense of said ~~city~~ improvement shall be assessed per front foot upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting on said improvement according to the laws and ordinances on the subject of assessments. Bonds of the city shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessment. The City Clerk is hereby directed to give notice of the passage of this resolution by having the same published in a newspaper of general circulation in said city for two consecutive weeks.

11 Morgan moved the adoption of the resolution recorded

by J.R. Williams the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Crubaugh, Love, Russell, Morgan, Scott, Scranton, Siefert, Trail, J.R. Williams, J.Y. Williams, Kay yeas 12 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

A resolution to construct sewer no 24 was offered as follows: Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio that it is hereby declared necessary to extend the construction of the present sewer system by constructing sewer no 24 according to plans specifications and profiles now on file in the City Clerk's office along the following streets and alleys of said City of Alliance: commencing at the manhole on South Webb Avenue at its intersection with Fulton Street thence west along Fulton Street to the first alley west of Liberty Avenue running north and south. Thence south along said alley to the first alley north of Broadway running ^{east} south and ^{west} south thence west along said alley to a point designated for termination between lots no 776 and 880 on Freedom Avenue in said city. The cost and expense of said improvement shall be assessed per front foot upon the lots and lands abutting on said improvement according to the laws and ordinances on the subject of assessments and shall be payable in three annual installments. Bonds of the city shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessment and the city Clerk is hereby directed to give notice of the passage of this resolution by having the same published in some newspaper of general circulation in the Corporation". J. R. Williams moved the adoption of the resolution seconded by Siefert, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Crubaugh, Love, Russell, Morgan, Scott, Scranton, Siefert, Trail, J. R. Williams, J. Y. Williams, Kay yeas 12 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

sidewalk resolution

Russell offered a resolution declaring it necessary, and requiring the owner of lot no 681 to construct a sidewalk in front of said lot on north Union Avenue, and moved its adoption seconded by Scott and Carriell yeas Conger, Crubaugh, Love, Russell, Morgan, Scott, Scranton, Siefert, Trail, J.R. Williams, J.Y. Williams, Kay yeas 0

Repair Crossing
Cruiger reported on alley crossing on Mechanic Street north of Main in bad condition and the same was referred to the Street Committee.

Palerton to repair sidewalk

On motion of Trail, Mr J. G. Palerton was ordered to construct sidewalks in front of his property on North Liberty Street.

To Change light

Russell reported in favor of changing the location of an electric light on Prospect Street and moved the light committee be instructed to have same changed and on motion of Scranton the motion was amended by referring to the Light Committee to report at next meeting.

Light on Ely Street

Russell reported that there was no light on Ely Street west of Union Avenue and moved that the matter be referred to the Light Committee with power to act seconded by Trail Love moved to amend by referring to the Light Committee to report at next meeting, seconded by J. G. Williams and carried.

Lights on South Union Ave

Scott reported that there were two electric lights on South Union Avenue that would be of more service if the location was changed to a more public place and moved that the matter be referred to the light Committee to investigate and report at next meeting, seconded by J. G. Williams and carried.

City Printing

The motion relative to the city printing which was tabled at the preceding meeting was taken up, put, and lost. The Printing Committee then submitted the following report: "To the City Council Gentlemen, as a compromise measure we beg leave to offer the following report: We respectfully recommend that the contract for the city's legal advertising as now existing be renewed for one year." signed R. M. Scranton W. B. Leubough J. R. Williams. Morgan moved the adoption of the report seconded by Defert. Scott moved to amend by specifying the "Post" in place of the Alliance Printing Co seconded by J. G. Williams and lost.

The original motion to adopt the report was there put and carried.

Claim of
S. G. Well

J. G. Williams reported that in grading Grant Street west of Arch that quite a cut had been made in front of S. G. Wells property. which he (Mr Well) claimed caused him some damage. and on motion of J. G. Williams seconded by Scranton the matter was referred to the grade committee.
