

Alliance Ohio June 29th 1896

Council met in regular session with President May presiding and the following members present. Conger Love Russell Scranton Trail. Defert J.R. Williams J.G. Williams. Absent Crumbaugh Morgan Scott. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Mr F.W. Gustill being present asked that Council take some action relative to his proposition to lease city lots for the purpose of building an opera house. and on motion of Conger the matter was referred to the Buildings and Grounds Committee to report at next meeting.

Russell reported that Mr Rice had taken up some of the brick pavement in front of his property on Market Street and the Clerk was instructed to notify him to replace them.

Scranton called attention to the condition of a sewer west of Arch street and South of Rosenberry. Stating that the contents were running out on Rosenberry Street and creating a nuisance. and moved the same be referred to the Street Committee with power to act. seconded by J.G. Williams and lost.

Russell called attention to the condition of the alley running from Main street to Ash street between the bridge and Les Atkins property and moved the same be referred to the street committee with power to act. seconded by Trail

Scranton moved to amend by referring to the Street Committee to report an estimate of the cost of repairing same at next meeting seconded by Trail and carried

Love reported that the Sewer Disposal works were now ready for use and that it was necessary to have some chemicals and stated that Mr Chapin of

of Conston had offered to furnish enough to get the works started at cost. The city to pay the expense of freight and drayage, and moved that the Clerk be instructed to order four barrels of same, seconded by Conger and carried.

Love moved that the matter of securing lime for the disposal works be referred to the Sewer committee seconded by J. R. Williams and carried.

Love moved that the Engineer be instructed and authorized to issue permits for tapping the Sanitary sewers, and that the Clerk give notice of same in the papers seconded by J. R. Williams and carried.

The engineer submitted an estimate of the cost of lateral sewers no 16-17-18-21-24 and 25. and on motion of Love seconded by Conger. The Clerk was instructed to advertise for bids for the construction of the said sewers.

"An Ordinance to authorize the issue of the bonds of the City of Alliance Ohio in anticipation of the collection of a special assessment for the construction of 'Lateral Sewers'" was read first time and Love moved the rules be suspended and the Ordinance be read second time by title seconded by J. G. Williams. The Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Conger Love Russell Scranton Defert Trail J. R. Williams J. G. Williams Kay Yeas 9 nays none. The rules were declared suspended. The Ordinance was read second time by title and Conger moved the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance be read third time by title seconded by Trail. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Conger Love Russell Scranton Defert Trail J. R. Williams

J. G. Williams. Kay. Yeas 9 nays none. The rules were declared suspended the ordinance was read third time and Conger moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Trail. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas. Conger Love Russell Scranton Seft-Trail J. R. Williams. J. G. Williams Kay. Yeas 9 nays none and the ordinance was declared passed.

An Ordinance entitled
 An Ordinance to provide for the issuing of the bonds of the City of Alliance Ohio for the purpose of extending the time of payment of certain indebtedness which from its limits of taxation said city is unable to pay at maturity was read first time and Love moved that the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read second time by title seconded by Conger ^{the yeas and nays were called resulting} and carried Yeas Conger Love Russell Scranton Seft-Trail J. R. Williams J. G. Williams Kay Yeas 9 nays none. The rules were declared suspended. The ordinance was read second time by title and Scranton moved the rules be again suspended and the ordinance read third time by title. seconded by J. G. Williams the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger Love Russell. Scranton Seft-Trail J. R. Williams J. G. Williams Kay. Yeas 9 nays none. The rules were declared suspended. The Ordinance was read third time by title. and Conger moved the same be placed on its passage seconded by Trail. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger Love Russell Scranton Seft-Trail J. R. Williams. J. G. Williams Kay Yeas 9 nays none and the ordinance was declared passed.

J. G. Williams called attention to the necessity of connecting the vaults of the City Prison with the sanitary sewer and moved the matter be referred to the

Sewer Committee to report at next meeting. seconded by Trail and Carried. Love reported that as the sewer disposal works were now about ready for use it would be necessary to employ some one to take charge of same and Conger moved that Council retire to the Clerk's office and hold a caucus and select some one of the applicants for the position. seconded by Trail and Carried. Council then adjourned to the Clerk's office and upon returning were called to order and Love moved that the salary of the person employed to run the disposal works be fixed at \$40⁰⁰ per month and in addition thereto be given house rent and fuel (it being understood that the house to be furnished is the one now located on the sewer disposal ground) seconded by Trail. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger. Love Russell Scranton Supt. Trail. J. R. Williams J. G. Williams Key. Yeas 9 nays none and the motion was declared Carried.

J. G. Williams placed in nomination for Milton English and moved the nomination be confirmed seconded by Scranton The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger. Love Russell. Scranton Supt Trail J. R. Williams J. G. Williams Key. Yeas 9 nays none and the appointment was declared confirmed.

J. G. Williams offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that it is necessary and that a sidewalk 6 feet wide and of Flag stone or brick shall be constructed along the south side and west end of lot no 207 to the established grade and in accordance with the Ordinances

of this city. And the Mayor is hereby instructed to cause written notice to be served upon the owner of said premises of the passage of this resolution. Conger seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger Love Russell. Seranton Defert Trail J.R. Williams J.G. Williams Kay Yeas 9 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

The following resolution was offered: "Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that it is necessary and that a sidewalk 6 feet wide and of Flag Stone or brick shall be constructed along the west end of out lot no 206 to the established grade and in accordance with the ordinances of this city and the Mayor is hereby instructed to cause written notice to be served upon the owner of said premises of the passage of this resolution" J.R. Williams moved the adoption of the resolution seconded by Conger. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger Love Russell. Seranton Defert Trail J.R. Williams J.G. Williams Kay Yeas 9 nays none.

A similar resolution requiring the owner of out lot no 205 to construct a sidewalk along the west end of said lot was offered and Conger moved the same be adopted seconded by Defert. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger Love Defert Trail Russell J.R. Williams J.G. Williams Kay Yeas 9 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

The Judiciary Committee to whom was referred the question of the closed alley near Mr James Sloans property reported that in examining the records they found that an alley had been platted as claimed by Mr Sloane but that it was now closed. And on motion of Love seconded by Conger the report was

received and the committee instructed to have the alley opened.

J. G. Williams called attention to the filthy condition of the basement of the city hall and the entrance thereto and moved that the Marshal be ordered to have the same cleaned, and take the necessary steps to apprehend any one committing nuisances at that place.

On Motion Council adjourned
