

Alliance Ohio February 23rd 1898.

The Alliance City Council met in adjourned session in the City Hall at the usual hour.

President Morgan and Vice president Conger being absent the meeting was called to order by the Clerk.

King moved that Mr. Loe be elected to act as President Protem seconded by Scranton and carried.

The Roll was then called with the following members present Kay, King, Loe, Miller, Russell, Scott, Scranton, Trail & Williams.

The minutes of the two preceding meetings was read and approved.

Resolution to
Pave Main St.

A Resolution Declaring it necessary to improve Main Street from Arch Avenue to the Cleveland & Pittsburgh Railroad was read as follows.

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that it is hereby declared necessary to improve East Main Street from the west lot line of Arch Avenue to the west right of way line of the Cleveland & Pittsburgh Railroad by excavating and preparing the foundation and paving the roadway forty eight (48) feet wide with one of the following named materials (which material shall be adopted by the City Council and stipulated in an Ordinance hereafter to be passed) Vitrified street paving bricks, Asphalt blocks or Sheet Asphalt.

By providing new curb and constructing the necessary drainage in accordance with plans, profiles and specifications now on file in the Office of the City Civil Engineer.

The cost and expense of said improvement shall assessed per front foot upon the lots and lands abutting thereon.

Said assessments shall be payable in five annual installments.

And Bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause this resolution to be published for two weeks in a newspaper published and of general circulation in the

Corporation, and the City Marshal is hereby appointed to serve notice of the passage of this resolution upon the owners of property abutting upon said improvement or to the persons in whose names said property may be assessed for taxation upon the tax duplicate, who are residents of Stark County. Scott moved the adoption of the above resolution seconded by Williams the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Kay, King, Lorr, Miller, Russell, Scott, Scranton, Trail, Williams yeas 9 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Engineer's Report.

Engineer Fouts read a report giving an estimate of the cost of vitrified brick and asphalt block paving and on motion of King seconded by Trail the report was received and ordered placed on file.

Guarantee for 5 years
on St Paving.

Scott moved that a five year guarantee be required for either brick or asphalt pavements seconded by King the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Kay, King, Lorr, Miller, Russell, Scott, Scranton, Trail, Williams yeas 9 nays none and the motion was declared passed.

Sidewalk Resolution.

Scott offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio. that it is necessary, and that a sidewalk 6 feet wide, and of flagstone or brick shall be constructed along the east side of Lot No 714 to the established grade, and in accordance with the ordinances of this City. And the Mayor is hereby instructed to cause written notice to be served upon the owner of said premises of the passage of this resolution.

Trail seconded the motion to adopt the above resolution, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Kay, King, Lorr, Miller, Scott, Scranton, Russell, Trail, Williams yeas 9 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution on
Bramley Bill.

The following Resolution was read.
Resolved: That the Senator and Representatives from Stark County be and are hereby requested to support House Bill No. (Known as the Bramley Bill) And further that the Clerk be and is hereby directed to mail a copy of this resolution to the said Senator and Representatives. Trail moved

the adoption of the resolution seconded by Kay, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Kay, King, Miller, Scott, Scranton, Trail, Williams nays Lorr & Russell yeas 7 nays 2 and the resolution was declared adopted.

Cinders in 1st ward.

Russell moved that the Street Commissioner be instructed to haul cinders for two crossings in the first ward seconded by Trail and carried.

Repair Catch Basin.

On motion of Kay seconded by Trail the Street Commissioner was instructed to repair a Catch Basin near the Webb property on Main Street, the work to be done under the instructions of the City Civil Engineer.

On motion of Miller seconded by Williams Council adjourned.
