Providing for, and fixing the rate of Taxation and the distribution of the same for the year 1883

Section 1st Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance O That there be levied for the year 1883 on the Real and Personal property in said Corporation Eight Mills on Each and every dollar of said property as it stands valued on the Tax duplicate

Sec 2nd That the Clerk of the Village be and he is hereby authorized to Certify to the Auditor of Stark County Ohio, on or before the 1st Monday in June 1883 the percentage of the Levy as authorized by the first Section of this ordinance.

Sec 3rd That the Tax authorized by the first Section of this ordinance be and the same hereby is distributed among the several funds of said Village as follows
For the General Fund 13 Mills
For the Sinking Fund 13/4 Mills
For the Street and Sanitary Fund 1/2
For the Gas Fund 1 2/3 Mills
For the Police and Salary Fund 1 3/4 Mills
For the Fire Department Fund 1/2 Mill
For the Water Fund 1 1/2 Mills

Sec 4th That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication

Establishing a grade on Alliance Street between
 the east side of N^o Union Street and the Cleveland
 and Pittsburgh Rail Road

Section 1 - Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of
 the Incorporated Village of Alliance O. That the Grade
 on Alliance Street between the east side of N^o Union Street
 and the Cleveland & Pittsburgh Rail Road, be
 and the same is hereby established as follows
 viz: Commencing at the east side of N^o Union
 Street on the Center of Alliance Street at an
 elevation 108.25 feet; thence east by an even grade
 540 feet to an elevation of 102.50 feet; thence east 300
 feet to an elevation of 93.75 feet; thence level to the
 east side of West Street; thence east by an even
 grade to the Center of Arch Street to an elevation
 of 93.57 feet; thence east to the Center of Linden
 Avenue to an elevation of 97 feet; thence
 east to the Center of Freedom Street to an elevation
 of 100.5 feet; thence east 225 feet to an elevation
 of 100 feet; thence east to the Center of Fifth Street
 to an elevation of 96.9 feet; thence east 105 feet
 to an elevation of 94.24 feet; thence east to the
 Cleveland & Pittsburgh Rail Road to an elevation
 of 80 feet. The above Elevations to apply to
 the Center of said Street and having reference
 to a plane 100 feet below the City benchmark
 as established by ordinance.

The Side walk on the North side of the
 Street shall be six inches below the Center
 of the Street, and on the South side of
 six inches above the Center of the Street

Except from a point 225 feet East of the Center of Freedom Street to the Center of Fifth Street, the North walk shall run up and the South walk down to the same elevation as the Center of the Street; And from thence to the Cleveland + Pittsburgh ~~Street~~ Rail Road the side walks on each side of the Street shall be at the same elevation as the Center of the Street; And the gutters shall be not less than nine inches below the top of the Curb Stones through out the entire length of said Street.

An Ordinance

Naming certain streets in this village

Section 1

Be it ordained and enacted by The Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Ohio, That the street passing East & West through the central part of The Town plat of Williamsport, shall hereafter be known as Mill Street.

Mill St

The street passing southwesterly from the north line of the Corporation and crossing the Mahoning river, and after passing Kirk's Mill turning easterly and passing through the south part of Williamsport, shall be hereafter known as Gaskell Street.

Gaskell

The street passing north from the east end of Gaskell Street to the east end of Beach Street shall be hereafter known as Apple Street.

Vine

The street on the section line running east & west past the cemetery shall be hereafter known as Vine Street.

Perry

The street in that part of town known as Freedom, and next south of and parallel to Vine Street, shall be hereafter known as Perry Street.

Keystone

The street in Freedom second south of and parallel to Vine Street, and heretofore known as Market or Fifth Street shall be known hereafter as Keystone Street.

Wayne

The third street south of & parallel to Vine Street shall be called Wayne Street.

Harrison

The fifth street south of & parallel to Vine Street, and which extends from McKinley Street to Hester Street, shall be called Harrison St.

Noble

The street in Noble's addition, heretofore known as Second Street, is hereby changed to Noble Street.

Pike

The street in Noble's addition heretofore known as Third Street, is hereby changed to Pike Street.

Reed

The street in Noble's addition heretofore known as Fourth Street is hereby changed to Reed Street.

Garwood

The street leading from Patterson Street to Fifth Street, between the C & P. railroad & Freedom Street shall be known hereafter as Bond St.

South

The first street south of & parallel to Grant Street and extending West from Liberty St. shall be called Garwood Street.

Noble

The street running east and west, a short distance north of the McKinley Corporation line, is hereby named South Street.

The street in McKinley's 2d addition first north of and parallel to South Street shall be called Maple St.

Concluded

The street in Melner's 2d addition second west and parallel to Mt Union street is hereby named Orange street - The street parallel to and next west of Liberty street, and which is now known as Fifth street, shall be known hereafter as Seneca st. The st. parallel to and next east of Liberty st. and now known as Station st. shall be known hereafter as South Mt st. The street parallel to second east of Liberty street is hereby named Morgan street. The street on the County line is hereby named Mahoning street - The street in Melner's addition now known as Mahoning street is hereby changed to Franklin street. The street in T. L. Co's addition next west of & parallel to Mahoning street shall be known hereafter as Willow street. The second street west of and parallel to Mahoning street is hereby named Meadow street. The short street parallel to & next south of Main st. extending east from Liberty street shall be known as Ash st. The street running east & west and now known as South street is hereby changed to Fulton st. The principal business thoroughfare of the town is hereby changed from Alliance street to Main street.

Establishing a grade on Grant street.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the incorporated village of Alliance Ohio That the grade on Grant street between the center of Arch street and the center of Mt. Union street be and the same hereby is established as follows, viz:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the center of Grant street with the center of Arch street at an elevation of 156.55 feet; thence west with the center of said Grant street 182 feet to an elevation of 159.50 feet; thence west 195 feet to east curb of Mechanic street; thence across said street level to the west curb of said street to an elevation of 160.50 feet; thence west by an even grade 226 feet to an elevation 151 feet; thence west by an even grade a distance of 191 feet to the center of the railroad to an elevation of 148.27 feet; thence west by an even grade 59 feet to an elevation of 146.29 feet; thence west by an even grade a distance of 60 feet to an elevation of 145.89 feet; thence east by an even grade a distance of 40 feet to an elevation of 145.89 feet; thence west by an even grade 175 feet to an elevation of 132 feet; thence west by an even grade a distance of about 75 feet to meet the grade of Mt. Union street. The above elevations having reference to a plane 100 feet below the city benchmark as established by ordinance.

An Ordinance.

To prevent and punish fast driving or riding of animals, or fast driving or propelling of vehicles through the public highways.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Ohio, That it shall be unlawful for any person to drive or ride any animal, or drive or propel any vehicle through any of the public highways of this village at a rate of speed exceeding eight miles an hour, except in cases of actual necessity.

Sec. 2. Any person violating any of the foregoing sections shall, on conviction thereof, before the Mayor or Police Justice, be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars, or imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the Magistrate.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

An Ordinance

To prevent the running at large or being loose within the corporation of certain animals therein named

Sec. 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Ohio, That it shall be unlawful for the owner or owners of any animals of the horse, mule, cattle, sheep, swine, goose or goat kind, and for any person having any such animal or animals in charge to suffer or permit the same to run loose or be at large in or upon any street, alley, common or public or enclosed ground within this village.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any animal named in the first section of this ordinance, and for any person having charge of any such animal or animals, to lead the same in or upon any street, alley, common, public or enclosed ground within this village, unless such animal is securely fastened or some proper person be with the same in charge thereof; but no person shall suffer or permit any animal of the horse or mule kind to be loose upon any street, alley or enclosed ground within this village, whether any person or persons be with the same in charge thereof or not.

Sec. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof, for the first offense be fined in any sum not exceeding twenty five dollars, and for each subsequent offense

shall be fined in any sum not exceeding any sum fifty dollars, or imprisoned ~~and~~ not exceeding thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the court.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in ^{force} ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

An Ordinance

To Regulate and restrain ale, beer and Porter houses and places of habitual resort for tippling and intemperance.

Sec 1 Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance Ohio, That it shall be unlawful for any person within the Corporation limits to sell, or offer to sell, or give away any intoxicating liquor or Ale, beer, porter, wine or Cider on the first day of the week commonly called Sunday or at any time during the week between the hours of Nine O'clock P.M. and Six O'clock A.M. of the following day and it shall be unlawful for the owner or person having ~~in~~ charge of any room, house or place where Ale, beer, or porter is usually sold or exposed for sale to allow any such room, house or place to be open, or remain open on the first day of the ^{week} commonly called Sunday or at any time during the week between the hours of Nine O'clock P.M. and Six O'clock A.M.

Sec 2 Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall on conviction there of be fined in any sum not exceeding Fifty Dollars or imprisoned not exceeding Thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the Court.

To prohibit loafing or loitering in or about public buildings.

- Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Ohio, That it shall be unlawful for any person to loaf or loiter in or about any hall, stairway, vestibule, entrance or passage leading to any public building or room during or immediately after or before the time of holding any meeting or public gathering in such building or room.
- Sec. 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, on conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars for a first offense, and for any subsequent offense shall be fined in any sum not less than five, nor more than fifty dollars, or imprisoned not more than thirty days or both at the discretion of the court.
- Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.
