

Alliance Ohio May 16<sup>th</sup> 1898

City Council met in regular session with President Morgan in the chair and the following members present Conger, Gilson, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman.

Minutes of the preceding meeting read and approved.

Report of  
Bond Sale.

City Clerk reported to the Council that the New First National Bank of Columbus, Ohio, was the highest bidder on the \$28,000. Sewer and Street Improvement Bonds, their bid being \$435<sup>00</sup> Premium.

King moved that the Bid of the New First National Bank of Columbus, Ohio be accepted and that the Bonds be awarded to said Bank, seconded by Gilson the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, <sup>Morgan</sup> yeas 11 nays none and the Bid was declared accepted and Bonds awarded.

Tax Levy  
Ordinance

An Ordinance to levy taxes for Municipal purposes was read as follows:

Section 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that there be levied for Corporate purposes for the year 1898, on each and every dollar of Valuation of taxable property, real and personal in said Corporation the sum of nine (9) mills and that said levy be apportioned as follows:

For the General Fund	.3	mills
" " Sinking	2.5	"
" " Street	.7	"
" " Police & Salary	.6	"
" " Light	1.2	"
" " Water	2.	"
" " Fire	.8	"
" " Sewer	.3	"
" " Bridge	.5	"
" " Sanitary	.1	"

Section 11. That the City Clerk is hereby directed to certify the above levy to the Auditor of Stark County, Ohio, to be placed on the tax duplicate

for collection as provided by law.  
This Ordinance to take effect and be in force  
from and after its passage.

King moved that the foregoing Ordinance be placed  
on its final passage seconded by Scott the yeas  
and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson,  
King, Katzenstein, Lov, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson,  
Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 11 nays none and the Ordinance  
was declared passed.

The following Ordinance was read.

An Ordinance to levy a special tax of one  
mill in addition to all other taxes levied for municipal  
purposes in pursuance of the special authority therein  
set forth.

Whereas the general assembly of the State of  
Ohio by an act entitled an act to authorize the City  
of Alliance, Ohio, to borrow money and issue bonds  
therefor to pay the outstanding indebtedness of said City  
passed February 12<sup>th</sup> 1889, did authorize the Council of  
said City to issue bonds in any sum not exceeding  
\$15,000.00 and to levy a special tax on all the taxable  
property in said City not exceeding one mill on each  
and every dollar of valuation in any one year for the  
purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon,  
and whereas in pursuance of said authority the Council  
of said City did on March 18<sup>th</sup> 1889, authorize the issue of  
said bonds in the sum of \$14,000.00 in accordance with  
the provisions of said act of the general assembly.

Therefore be it ordained and enacted by the Council  
of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that for the purpose of  
paying said bonds and the interest thereon as the  
same shall become due, a tax is hereby levied on  
all the taxable property in said City, except the  
sixth ward (formerly Mt Union) of one mill on each  
and every dollar for the year 1898, in addition to the  
taxes now authorized by law. which levy the Clerk  
of said City is hereby directed to certify to the Auditor  
of Stark County to be placed on the tax duplicate and  
collected as other taxes.

Section 11. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in  
force from and after its passage.

 Mr Berrys Proposition, Wilson moved that President  
 Morgan appoint a special committee to investigate  
 and make a report at our next meeting on the St  
 Railway question seconded by Scott and carried.

President Morgan appointed to serve on the above mentioned  
 special committee The Judiciary Committee, Mr Loe,  
 Mr Conger and the City Engineer.

On motion of Wilson seconded by Loe, Pres Morgan  
 was made Chairman of the above named special Com.

Wilson Chairman of Building & Grounds Com  
 stated to the Council that he had made an investigation  
 as to the repairs needed on the City Hall, and it was  
 his opinion that the cost to make the repairs would  
 not exceed from \$75.<sup>00</sup> to \$100.<sup>00</sup>

On motion of Scott seconded by King the report  
 was accepted.

Scott moved that the Building and Grounds Com be  
 instructed to have the necessary repairs made on  
 the City Hall seconded by King and carried.

King moved that when Council adjourns it be to meet  
 on Monday evening May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1898 at the usual hour  
 seconded by Conger and carried.

On motion of Conger seconded by Wilson  
 Davis & Caldwell were granted permission to sit  
 their Stone Crusher on the City Lot.

On motion of King seconded by Miller  
 Council adjourned.
