City Council met in regular session with President Morgan in the chair and the following members present. Conger, Gilson, Gabler, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman. Absent King.

The Minutes of the two preceding meetings read and approved.

The following communication from the Board of Health was read.

Communication  
from Board of  
Health.

To the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

At a regular meeting of the Board of Health of the City of Alliance the following Resolution was unanimously adopted. "Resolved that the Board of Health in meeting assembled July 26<sup>th</sup>, 1898, insist that Columbia street, between Union Avenue and Park street be put to grade immediately to prevent surface water from interfering with property owners on the north side of the street. Said surface water causing nuisances dangerous to life and health.

A communication from the Mutual Light Co was read with reference to Street lights, and on motion of Conger seconded by Love the same was referred to the Light and Judiciary committees.

Mayor Dresslers report for the month of July 1898, was presented and read showing fines and Licenses collected to the amount of Twenty dollars and on motion of Wilson seconded by Conger the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Conger moved that the Bill of the Mutual Light Co for the month of July 1898, be referred to the Light and Judiciary committees to report on the same at the next regular meeting, seconded by Love and carried.

Scott of the Finance Committee reported that the committee had met and approved a number of claims against the City, and asked the Clerk to read

the Ordinance for the payment of the claims. The Ordinance was read and Love moved that it be placed on its passage seconded by Scott the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 11 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Contract with  
John Duff

A. Resolution to accept bid and contract with John Duff for the Improvement of East Broadway Street in Alliance, Ohio was read as follows.

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio, that the bid of John Duff for the improvement of East Broadway Street in said City of Alliance, Ohio from the East line of Arch Avenue to the west line of South West Avenue be accepted, the same being the lowest bid, in the aggregate, for said work. And the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with said John Duff with W. C. Barber and Henry Attkisson as his sureties for doing said work according to the plans and specifications therefor at the rates as contained in said bid, therefore now on file in the office of the City Clerk. Amount to be paid in the aggregate \$7352.66

I hereby certify that the money required for the above mentioned contract is in the treasury to the credit of the East Broadway Street Improvement fund and not appropriated for any other purpose.

On motion of Wilson seconded by Conger the above report of the Judiciary Committee was adopted.

Scott moved that Davis & Caldwell's time for the completion of the East Main street improvement be extended for thirty days seconded by Williams and carried.

Conger moved that the repairing of the Bridge across the run at the rear of P. Scanlon's property be referred to the Street Committee with power to act seconded by Gilson and carried.

On motion of Gabel seconded by Miller the City Solicitor, Civil Engineer and Street Committee was instructed to prepare an Ordinance to regulate the digging up of improved streets in the City of Alliance, Ohio.

On motion of Scott seconded by Wilson the Street Commissioner was instructed to make some necessary repairs in the sixth ward.

Miller moved that the Street Committee be instructed to repair the street at the north end of the East Main St Viaduct with the Brick taken from the street car track, seconded by Gabel and carried.

Conger moved that the Bridge Committee be instructed to make some repairs necessary on the north side of the East Main St Bridge, seconded by Gabel and carried.

A Resolution to Improve North Union Avenue from the North Line of Main Street to the South Line of Ely street in the City of Alliance, Ohio was read as follows:

Resolution to  
improve North  
Union Avenue.

Ohio, That it is hereby declared necessary to improve North Union avenue from the north line of main street to the south line of Ely street by establishing the grade thereon, paving the roadway with bricks or blocks to a width of not less than 34 feet, setting curbs and gutters and constructing the necessary culverts, drains and retaining walls, etc, etc, in accordance with the plans, profiles and specifications on file in the office of the City Civil Engineer; the cost and expense of said improvement shall be paid by an assessment assessed per front foot upon the lands and lots abutting upon said improvement; said assessment shall be payable in seven annual installments, and Bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessment.

And the Clerk is hereby directed to cause this resolution to be published for two weeks in a newspaper published and of general circulation in the corporation, and the City Marshal is hereby appointed to serve notice of the passage of this resolution upon the owners of property abutting upon said improvement who are residents of Stark County, Ohio.

Conger moved that the foregoing resolution be adopted as read, seconded by Miller, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Cable, Katzenstein, Lorr, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 11 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Ordinance to  
regulate Arming &  
Uniforming Police.

An Ordinance to regulate the Arming, Equipping and Uniforming the Police of the City of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio while on duty, was read the first time as follows:

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio:

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Mayor and Police Committee to prescribe the arms, equipments and uniforms of the City Police while on duty.

Section 2. Every Policeman, while on duty, shall bear the arms and equipments, and wear the uniforms prescribed as aforesaid, and failure, refusal or undue neglect to conform to this section, or any part thereof, shall

be cause for suspension and dismissal from the service, such suspension and dismissal to proceed in manner and form as is provided by law and ordinances heretofore enacted.

Section 3. Hats or Caps for uniforming purposes, and police buttons for coats, vests, arms and equipments shall be furnished at the expense of the City by the Council, and remain the property of the City.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

Scott moved that the rules be suspended and the foregoing ordinance be read the second time, seconded by Love the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan, yeas 11 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time, Scott moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance read the third time seconded by Williams the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan, yeas 11 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time. Scott moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by Miller, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan, yeas 11 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

On motion of Wilson seconded by Conger Council adjourned.
