

An Ordinance

Providing for and declaring the vacation of certain portions of streets and alleys therein described;

Section 1.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Ohio, That the portion of the street and alleys in Peters, Lamborn & Co's addition to the village of Alliance and described as follows, to wit: That part of Offord street commencing on the east line of Morgan street, thence running east 120 feet; also the first alley south of Offord street running east from Morgan street parallel to Offord street 120 feet; also that part of the alley abutting on the east side of lots 507, 508 509 and 542 be and the same are hereby declared vacated and abandoned.

Section 2.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

An Ordinance

To prevent gaming and gambling.

Section I. Proo

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Ohio, that if any person or persons shall keep in this village a building, room, place or structure of any kind to be used or occupied in whole or in part for gaming or gambling or shall suffer or permit any such building, room, place or structure to be occupied or used in whole or in part for gaming or gambling any such person or persons shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars nor less than ten dollars.

Section II. If any person or persons being the owner or owners of any building, room, place or structure of any kind whatever, knowingly permits the same to be used or occupied in whole or in part for the purpose of gaming or gambling, such person or person shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars nor less than ten dollars.

Section III. If any person or persons shall keep or exhibit for gain in this village any gaming table, bank establishment, instrument or apparatus, device or means for gaming or gambling of any kind, name or description whatever, or shall aid or assist or join with another or others in doing the same, or shall by any statement, device, pretense or representation induce or seek to induce any person or persons to engage in any trick, device or game of any kind whatsoever for money or the property of value such person or persons shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars nor less than ten dollars.

Section IV. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

Prohibiting the Playing of Ball in Certain Places

Sec 1 Be it Ordained and Enacted by the
 Council of the Incorporated Village
 of Alliance Ohio That it shall
 be unlawful for any person or
 persons to play at any game of
 Ball within this Village nearer than
 Two Hundred feet to any Church
 Office, dwelling, public Hall or
 business building or any of the
 Streets of Public Highways.

Sec 2 Any Person violating any of the provisions
 of this Ordinance shall on conviction
 thereof be fined in any sum not less
 than One Dollar nor more than Ten
 Dollars at the discretion of the Court

 elapsed after its passage and due Pub-

Providing for and fixing the rate of taxation and the distribution of same for the year 1884

Section 1st Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance O that there be levied for the year 1884 on the real & personal property, property, in said Corporation Eight Mills on the dollar each and every dollar of said property as it stands valued on the ^{tax} duplicate

Sec 2nd That the Clerk of the Village be and he is authorized hereby Authorized to Certify to the Auditor of Stark County Ohio on or before the first Monday in June 1884 The percentage of the Levy, as Authorized by the first section of this Ordinance

Sec 3rd That the Tax Authorized by the first Section of this Ordinance be and the same is hereby distributed among the general funds of said Village as follows

Section 1st Be it Ordained And Enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance O that the Marshall of the Village shall in addition to his duties prescribed by Law, perform the duties of Street Commissioner.

Sec 2nd For his services as Street Commissioner the Marshall shall be paid the sum of Thirty Seven and one-half cents for each person who performs the two days' labor on the Streets required by Law and fifteen per centum of all the Money Collected in or in Sew of said two days labor.

An Ordinance

To authorize the mayor and clerk to issue the bonds of this village for the purpose of extending the time of payment of its indebtedness.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, N. Y. that the mayor and clerk of this village be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to issue the bonds of the Village amounting in the aggregate to thirty thousand dollars for the purpose of extending the time of payment of the indebtedness of said village.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding six per centum per annum payable semi-annually, the principal and interest to be paid at the office of the village treasurer. said bonds shall have interest coupons attached and be authenticated by the signature of the mayor and village clerk and each bond and coupon shall bear upon its face the imprint of the village seal.

Sec. 3. For the payment of the principal and interest of said bonds at maturity, the real and personal property of and within this village are hereby pledged.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

Whereas, the legislature of the state of Ohio did, by an act passed April 12, 1884, authorize and empower this village to transfer the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (1500.) from the Police Fund and twenty dollars and two cents (20.02) from the Poor Fund to the General Fund, therefore

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the incorporated Village of Alliance Ohio that the sum of fifteen hundred ~~hundred~~ dollars of the Police Fund and the sum of twenty five dollars and two cents of the Poor Fund be and the same hereby are transferred to the General Fund of this Village.

An Ordinance

Establishing the grade of Mount Union Street from Grant Street to South to the Corporation line

Section 1 Be it ordained by the And Enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance Ohio that the grade of Mt Union Street be and it is now hereby established as follows; Beginning at the intersection of Mt Union Street and Grant Streets with the established grade of Grant Street at an Elevation of 151.66 ft (Reference being made to the plane 100 feet below the City Bench Mark) thence South 338 feet to the Stone Culvert, to an Elevation of 150 feet; thence South 150 feet to the South line of Rosenberg Street, to an Elevation of 151 feet; thence South 500 feet to an Elevation of 160 feet; thence South 200 feet to Elevation of 166 feet; thence South 500 feet to Elevation of 188 feet; thence South 145 feet to the Corporation line to an Elevation of 193.50 feet.

Sec 2 All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec 3 This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force when days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

An Ordinance to Prohibit the making or Maintenance of any structure, Embankment or filling which causes water to be Collected on Streets and Alleys.

Sec 1st Be it Ordained and Enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance Ohio, That it shall be unlawful for any person to make, erect, place or maintain any structure Embankment or filling which causes surface water or water from any Stream to be Collected on any Streets or Alley within this Village to the damage or prejudice of others or the public

Sec 2nd Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall on conviction there of be fined in any sum, not less than five Dollars nor more than fifty Dollars, for the first offense and for any subsequent offense shall be fined in any sum not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars at the discretion of the Court

Sec 3 This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication
