

Alliance Ohio October 11th 1898.

City Council met in adjourned session with President Morgan presiding and the following members present Conger, Gable, King, Katenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman. Absent Gulson, Lorr, Williams.

On motion of Conger seconded by King the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting was dispensed with.

The following communication was presented and read to the Council:

To the Honorable Mayor and Council of Alliance.
We the Ladies of Fairmount Literary Club in regular session assembled unanimously protest against the immoral and indecent dance denominated Hooshee Koochee or muscular dance being admitted to the City of Alliance at the coming Carnival.

Wilson moved that the above communication be received and ordered placed on file seconded by King and carried.

The following Ordinance was read the first time as follows:

An Ordinance for the submission to the qualified voters of the City of Alliance, Ohio, of the question of ratifying the contract of the Mayor of said City, executed by him pursuant to a resolution of the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, for the purchase of the water works plant of the Alliance Water Works Company.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, as follows:-

Section 1st That there be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Alliance, Ohio, at the general election to be held in said City on the eighth day of November, A. D. 1898, and at the usual places of voting in said City to be conducted by the same officers who conduct said election, the question of the ratification of the contract entered into by the Mayor of said City with the Alliance Water Works Company for the purchase of its water works plant in accordance with the resolution of the Council heretofore adopted.

Ordinance.

Section 2. That the form of the ticket to be voted be as follows:- For the ratification of the contract for the purchase of the water works plant or Against the ratification of the contract for the purchase of the water works plant.

Section 3.^d That fifteen days notice of the submission of said question to the voters of said City of Alliance, Ohio, be given by the Mayor of said City according to law.

Section 4.th That the Clerk of said City be, and hereby is, instructed to transmit a certified Copy of this Ordinance to the board of deputy state supervisors of election of Stark County, Ohio.

Section 5.th That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.

Scott moved that the rules be suspended and the foregoing Ordinance be read the second time seconded by Gable the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan. Yeas 9 nays none the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time, and Conger moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance read the third time seconded by Scott the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 9 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time, Conger moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by King the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 9 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Conger moved that Wm Augst's proposition to keep the Cities portion of East Main st clean for ten dollars per month, be accepted seconded by Katzenstein.

Wilson moved that the above motion of Mr Conger be amended by referring the matter to the Committee on Street and Alleys with power to act, the price not to exceed the amount mentioned in Conger's motion seconded by King and carried.

The Original motion as amended was then voted upon and carried.

Ordinance to
establish grade
on Milner Street.

An Ordinance to establish the Grade on Milner Street from Union Corner to Webb Corner was read the first time and King moved that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance read the second time seconded by Scott the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan. yeas 9 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time, King moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance read the third time seconded by Zimmerman the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan, yeas 9 nays none the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time, King moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by Katzenstein the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 9 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Ordinance to
regulate conduct
of persons.

An Ordinance to regulate the conduct of Persons upon the Streets, Alleys, Sidewalks and Bridges of the City of Alliance, Ohio was read the first time as follows:
Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, as follows:
Section 1st: It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to loiter about or congregate upon or occupy any of the streets, Alleys, Sidewalks or Bridges or any of the corners of any street or alley of the City ~~of the~~ City of Alliance, Ohio or to loiter about or congregate so as to occupy any of the sidewalks in front of any dwelling or place of business or in front of any place of worship or any place of amusement or entertainment in said City provided that such person or persons have no occupation or business at such place or places.

Section 2: Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not to exceed fifty dollars.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall be in force and take effect on and after its passage and legal publication, Scott moved that the rules be suspended and the foregoing Ordinance be read the second time seconded

by Miller the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 9 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time, and Scott moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance read the third time seconded by Wilson the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 9 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time, Scott moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by Miller the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Miller, Scott, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan, yeas 9 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Fire Dept Roof.

On motion of Conger seconded by Scott the condition of the roof on the fire department building was referred to the Committee on Building and Grounds with power to act.

Culvert near the intersection of Columbia & Mechanic Sts.

On motion of Zimmerman seconded by King the condition of a Culvert near the intersection of Columbia and Mechanic streets was referred to the Committee on Streets and Alleys

Coal for City Hall.

Scott moved that the matter of furnishing Coal for the City Hall for the ensuing year be referred to the Committee on Building & Grounds with power to act seconded by King and carried.

On motion of Conger seconded by King Council adjourned.
