

Alliance Ohio December 19th 1898.

The Alliance City Council met in regular session with President Morgan in the chair and the following members present Conger, Gilson, Gabel, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Present 12 Absent none.

Minutes of the preceding was read and approved. King of the finance committee reported to the Council that Briggs Smith & Co of Cincinnati, O. were the highest bidders for the nine thousand, four per cent, ten year Refunding Bonds, said Firm offering par and a premium of \$245.00. and King moved that said bid of Briggs Smith & Co be accepted and the bonds be awarded to them, seconded by Scott, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gabel, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan, yeas 12 nays none, the bid was declared accepted and the Bonds awarded to Briggs Smith & Co of Cincinnati, Ohio.

An Ordinance to issue Bonds of the City of Alliance, Ohio, for the purpose of paying a portion of the purchase price of the water works plant of The Alliance Water Works Company in accordance with the terms of the contract heretofore executed by and between said company and said City of Alliance, Ohio, was read the first time, and King moved that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance be read the second time seconded by Scott, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gabel, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 12 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time, King moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance be read the third time seconded by Conger, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gabel, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan. yeas 12, nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time, and Conger moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by Scott, the yeas and nays were

Called resulting yeas, Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 12 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Clerk to advertise Sale of Bonds

King moved that when the Ordinance authorizing the issue of Eighty one thousand dollars Water Work Bonds had been published according to law, the City Clerk be instructed to advertise the sale of the same, seconded by Gable the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 12 nays none and the motion was declared passed.

\$270.00 deducted from John Duffys Estimate No 2.

King moved that \$270.00 be deducted from Estimate No 2 of John Duffys on the East Broadway Improvement as liquidated damages, seconded by Scott, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Miller, Scott, Williams, Morgan, nays Gilson, Katzenstein, Love, Wilson, Zimmerman, yeas 7 nays 5 and the motion was declared carried.

Claims Ordinance.

An Ordinance for the Payment of Claims was read to the Council and King moved that the Ordinance be placed on its passage as read seconded by Scott the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 12 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Communication with reference to lights not burning.

A communication from Frank W. Moore was read to the Council stating that the Arc Light at the intersection of Freedom Ave and Cambridge street has not been burning for four consecutive nights.

Conger moved that the light referred to by Mr Moore be referred to the committee on public lights seconded by Wilson and carried.

Change Light on East Main Street Bridge.

Miller moved that the matter of changing the location of the light on the East Main Street Bridge be referred to the committee on public lights with Power to act seconded by Gilson and carried.

Cannonis.

Wilson moved that a committee be appointed to take charge of the two Cannon which are now in possession of the City and place them at some suitable place on the Public Square seconded by Gilson and carried.

Ordinance to
assess special
tax on Main St.

Miller moved that Mr Wilson, Mr Morgan and Mr Lorr
be appointed as the committee to take charge of
selecting a location for the Cannon on Public Square
seconded by Zimmerman and carried.

An Ordinance to assess a special tax upon the
lots and lands abutting upon East Main Street from
the West line of the right of way of the Cleveland &
Pittsburgh Railway Company to the West line of
Arch Street in the City of Alliance, Ohio, was read
to the City Council for the first time, and Scott
moved that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance
be read the second time, seconded by Conger the yeas
and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable,
King, Katzenstein, Lorr, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson,
Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 12 nays none, the rules were
declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second
time, Scott moved that the rules be again suspended
and the Ordinance be read the third time, seconded by
Miller, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas
Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Lorr, Miller,
Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 12
nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the
Ordinance was read the third time, and Scott moved
that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage
seconded by Conger, the yeas and nays were called
resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein,
Lorr, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan,
yeas 12 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Petition to vacate
Cambridge St.

On motion of Scott seconded by Williams the
petition to vacate a portion of Cambridge St and
a part of the streets and alleys intersecting the same
was taken up for hearing.

The Petitioners to vacate Cambridge St were represented
by Attorney David Fording and the various property
owners opposed to vacating said Street were represented
by Attorney Wm Roach, Mr Roach filed a protest
against vacating Cambridge St between Morgan Ave
and the Cleveland & Pittsburgh Railroad, the same
being on file in the Office of the City Clerk.

Gilson moved that the petition to vacate Cambridge
street lying between Morgan Ave and the Cleveland &

Pittsburgh Railroad and part of the Streets and Alleys intersecting the same be accepted seconded by Williams the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Lovv, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, yeas 11 nays none, and the motion was declared passed.

Ordinance to vacate Cambridge street.

An Ordinance To vacate that part of Cambridge street lying between Morgan Avenue and the C. & P. R. R. and the parts of the Streets and Alleys intersecting the same, was read the first time, and Scott moved that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance be read the second time, seconded by Gilson the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Lovv, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman yeas 11 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time, Scott moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance be read the third time seconded by Williams, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Lovv, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, yeas 11 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time, and Scott moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by Conger the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Lovv, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, yeas 11 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Solicitor to employ assistance.

Wilson moved that the City Solicitor be authorized to employ an Attorney to assist in conducting the Gockey cases in the Common Pleas Court seconded by Scott the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Lovv, Miller, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 12 nays none and the motion was declared carried. On motion of King seconded by Conger Council adjourned.
