Alliance Ohio January 31st, 1899.

The Alliance City Council met in special session upon the following call

A special meeting will be held of the Alliance City Council at 7 O'clock Tuesday evening January 31st, 1899 in the City Hall.

This meeting is called for the purpose of considering the matter of the sale of Water Works Bonds, the matter of sidewalks, and the matter of the case of Grimes vs City of Alliance now pending in Common Pleas Court at Canton, Ohio.

The meeting was called to Order with President Morgan in the chair and the following members Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Loe, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman Absent, Miller and Gilson.

On motion of Conger seconded by Gable the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting was dispensed with.

Council adjourned to Clerk's Office.

Conger moved that the members of Council, Mayor, City Solicitor, City Engineer and City Clerk adjourn to the Clerk's Office seconded by Scott and carried.

Awarding the Water Works Bonds.

Upon returning to the Council Chamber, King of the Finance Committee reported to Council that W. J. Hayes & Sons of Cleveland, Ohio were the highest bidders on the \$81000, four per cent Water Works Bonds, said firm offering a premium of \$6293.75 and King moved that the bid of W. J. Hayes & Sons of Cleveland, Ohio be accepted and said bonds be awarded to them seconded by Scott the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Loe, Scott, Williams, Wilson, ^{Zimmerman} Morgan yeas 10 nays none and the Bid of W. J. Hayes & Sons was declared accepted and the Bonds awarded to them.

On motion of King seconded by Scott the Bid of Seasongood & Mayer of Cincinnati, Ohio (offering \$86817.00 for the \$81000, four per cent Water Works Bonds) was ordered recorded in the minutes of the Council the same being the second highest bid.

Bids for Printing Water Works Bonds.

Scott moved that the City Clerk and City Treasurer be instructed to receive bids for the printing of the

\$81000, Water Works Bonds seconded by Wilson the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Lorr, Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 10 nays none and the motion was declared passed.

Resolution with
reference to the
vacation of
Cambridge St.

The following Resolution was read to the Council
Whereas Martin E. Grimes, John Boyle and Louis Knam
have brought an action in Common Pleas Court of
Stark County, Ohio to enjoin the City of Alliance
together with other defendants therein named and
made parties defendant, from obstructing, closing up or
fencing in or interfering with the rights of said
plaintiffs to travel on Cambridge street in said
City from where it intersects with Morgan Street to
the Cleveland & Pittsburgh Railroad,

And whereas this Council has heretofore passed an
Ordinance vacating said street between the points named,
Be it resolved that the said City of Alliance by its
Council hereby declares that said City of Alliance
has no intention of closing up, obstructing or fencing
in said street between the points named or between
any other points on said street and that said City at
no time intended or threatened to do more than to
hear the matter of the Petition for the vacation of said
street and to grant such relief as it might determine
upon, which it has now done by the passage of said
Ordinance vacating said street, as aforesaid.

Wilson moved the adoption of the foregoing Resolution
seconded by Scott the yeas and nays were called
resulting yeas Conger, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Lorr,
Scott, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, Morgan, yeas 10
nays none, and the resolution was declared adopted.

nays none and the motion was declared passed.

 by Gable.

 upon and declared carried.

 upon and declared carried as amended.
