

Alliance Ohio March 31st 1899.

The Alliance City Council met in adjourned session with president Morgan in the chair and the following members present Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, & Zimmerman, Absent Wilson, Present 11 absent 1.

Minutes of the preceding meeting read and approved.

King moved that it be and is the sense of this Council, that the privilege given to Mrs Margaret Young at the last meeting of Council to erect an outside stairway for temporary purposes shall be limited to one year seconded by Williams.

Gable moved to amend the above motion by adding that if within the year it should be learned by Council that such stairway was not intended to be temporary but in fact permanent, this Council may at once order the removal of the same, seconded by Love and carried.

The Original motion as amended was then put and ^{declared} carried.

Mayor Dressler's Report for the month of March 1899 was presented and read to Council showing fines collected to the amount of \$66.00 and on motion of Conger seconded by Gilson the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A Petition signed by a large number of the property owners of West Main Street requesting Council not to put a Sanitary Sewer on said street this year was presented and read to Council and on motion of Conger seconded by Gilson the petition was received and ordered placed on file.

An Ordinance for the payment of Claims was presented and read to Council and King moved that the Ordinance be placed on its passage seconded by Scott, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, Gable, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 11 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Scott moved that the City Marshal be instructed to notify Mr Wallace to ^{move} his building off Market Street seconded by Williams and carried.

Councilmen Gabler and Williams retired from the Council Chamber by consent of President Morgan.

A Petition to pave South Union Ave with Brick was presented to Council and on motion of Conger seconded by King the petition was received and referred to the Street Committee.

Light on north approach of Viaduct.

Miller moved that an Arc Light be placed on the north approach to the East Main Street Viaduct and that the light on the south approach be moved farther south seconded by Conger and Carried.

Sidewalk Resolutions

The following sidewalk resolution was read to Council. Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that a Brick sidewalk shall be constructed on the south side of East Roseberry street from the west line of South Arch Avenue to the East line of City Lot number 2062 and also from the west line of City Lot number 2062 to the East line of South Union Avenue in accordance with the laws and Ordinances of said City, regulating the construction of such walks, and the plans and specifications for the same now on file in the office of the City Civil Engineer and within the time limited by law. And the Mayor of said City is hereby required to cause notice of the passage of this resolution to be served upon the owner of each parcel of land abutting upon said sidewalk, in the manner required by law, and the same shall be returned to the Clerk of ^{the} said City to be by him preserved as provided by law.

time limited by law. And the Mayor of said City, is
hereby required to cause notice of the passage of this
resolution to be served upon the owner of each parcel
of land abutting upon said sidewalk, in the manner
required by law, and the same shall be returned to the
Clerk of the said City to be by him preserved as provided
by law.

seconded by Katzenstein, the yeas and nays were called
resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, King, Katzenstein, Love,
Miller, Scott, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 9 nays none
and the Resolution was declared adopted.

and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, King,
Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 9
nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the
Ordinance was read the second time, Conger moved
that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance
be read the third time seconded by Gilson, the yeas
and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, King,
Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Zimmerman, Morgan,
yeas 9 nays none the rules were declared suspended
and the Ordinance was read the third time, Conger

moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final
 passage seconded by King the yeas and nays were
 called resulting yeas Conger, Gibson, King, Katzenstein,
 Lovv, Miller, Scott, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 9, nays
 none and the Ordinance was declared passed.
 On motion of Conger seconded by King Council adjourned.
