CallAlliance, Ohio, April 7<sup>th</sup>, 1899

The Alliance City Council met in special session upon the following call.

A special meeting of the Alliance City Council will be held in the City Hall Friday evening April 7<sup>th</sup> 1899 at 7 O'clock sharp. This meeting is called for the purpose of transacting the following business:-  
To pass an Ordinance to improve South Union Avenue from the south line of Main street to the south line of Grant street in the City of Alliance, O; to consider petition of John Eyer and others for a Sanitary sewer; to consider a plat of the proposed 3<sup>rd</sup> addition of John Cull & Sons; to consider the matter of removing stone from City Lot.

The meeting was called to order with president Morgan presiding and the following members answering to roll call Conger, Gilson, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Zimmerman, Absent Gable and Wilson. Present 10 absent 2. (Wilson came in tardy.)

On motion of King seconded by Conger the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting was dispensed with.

An Ordinance to improve South Union Avenue from the south line of Main street to the south line of Grant street in the City of Alliance, Ohio was read to Council the first time as follows:

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, as follows:

Section 1. That the improvement of South Union Avenue from the south line of Main street to the south line of Grant street in the City of Alliance, Ohio, be proceeded with in accordance with the resolution to improve the same adopted on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of March A. D. 1899. by grading the same to the established grade, paving the roadway with Asphalt Block to a width of not less than thirty four feet, setting curbs and gutters and constructing the necessary culverts, drains and retaining walls and in otherwise improving said street as provided in said resolution and in accordance with the plans, profiles and specifications now on file in the office of the City Civil Engineer.

Section 2. That the cost and expense of said improvement shall be assessed per front foot upon the lands and lots abutting upon said improvement from the said south line of Main street to the said south line of Grant street, and said assessment shall be payable in five annual installments and bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessment.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Scott moved that the rules be suspended and the foregoing Ordinance be read the second time seconded by King the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Zimmerman, Morgan yeas 10 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time, Conger moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance be read the third time seconded by Scott the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Zimmerman, Morgan, yeas 10 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time, Conger moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by Scott the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Conger, Gilson, King, Katzenstein, Love, Miller, Scott, Williams, Zimmerman, Morgan, yeas 10 nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

A. Petition was presented and read to Council asking Council to build a Sanitary Sewer in the first alley west of South Liberty street, between the first alley south of Main street and the first alley south of Market street, and on motion of Love seconded by Miller the matter was referred to the Sewer Committee and City Civil Engineer.

A plot of the proposed 3<sup>rd</sup> addition of John Auld & Sons to the City of Alliance, O. was presented to Council and on motion of Love seconded by King the same was referred to the platting committee and City Civil Engineer.

Councilman Wilson at this time came into the Council room and took his chair in Council Chamber. Love moved that Davis and Caldwell be given three weeks time to move the stone pile off the City Lot and if at the expiration of that time they failed to do so, the City Solicitor be instructed to commence action to compel them to move the stone seconded by Wilson and carried.  
On motion of King seconded by Miller Council adjourned.
