

Alliance Ohio June 19<sup>th</sup> 1899.

The Alliance City Council met in regular session with President Protem Wilson in the chair and the following members present Gilson, Katgenstein, Love, R. C. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Zimmerman, absent Noble, McDonald, W. H. Morgan, Williams. Present 8, absent 4. Minutes of the preceding meeting read and approved.

Petition from property owners asking for grade.

A. Petition signed by a number of Property owners on South Freedom Avenue, south of Grant Street, asking Council to set grade stakes for sidewalks, was presented to Council, and on motion of Scott seconded by Gilson the Petition was accepted and the Engineer was instructed to set the stakes asked for in the Petition.

Petition asking for dirt on Seneca Avenue.

A. Petition was presented and read to Council requesting that all the surplus dirt on the South Freedom Ave Improvement be placed on Seneca Avenue between Summit and Garwood streets.

Love moved that the Petition with reference to the surplus dirt on South Freedom Ave Improvement be accepted, and the matter be referred to the Street Committee with instruction to have the surplus dirt placed on Seneca Avenue seconded by Gilson and carried.

Rockhill Road.

Scott stated to Council that the Lexington Township Trustees had agreed to take care of the Rockhill road from Main Street north to the Corporation line if the City would take care of the Rockhill road from Main Street south to the Corporation line, and Scott moved that the proposition of the Trustees be accepted seconded by Gilson and carried.

Storm Water Sewers.

On motion of Love seconded by Seranton the condition of the Storm water sewer at the intersection of Main and Arch streets and also the one on Market Street between Linden Ave, and Arch Ave, was referred to the Street Committee and Engineer with power to act.

Broadway Sidewalks.

Love moved that the matter of laying sidewalks on the north side of Broadway between Linden Avenue and Arch Ave be referred to the Street Committee, seconded by Katgenstein and carried.

Club to have dirt moved.

On motion of Scott seconded by Zimmerman the Club was instructed to notify parties to remove the dirt off of Broadway paving

Seranton moved that J. B. Stanley be appointed inspector on the South Union Avenue Improvement seconded by Katzenstein.

Gilson moved that the foregoing motion be layed on the table until the next <sup>regular</sup> meeting seconded by Zimmerman and declared carried.

Inspectors on  
South Freedom  
and North Union  
Avenues.

On motion of Scott seconded by Katzenstein the Civil Engineer was instructed to employ inspectors on the South Freedom Ave and North Union Ave improvements.

New Residence  
at Sewage  
Disposal Works.

Scott moved that the Building & Grounds Com be empowered to contract for the building of a new Residence at the Sewage Disposal, at a cost not to exceed One thousand dollars, seconded by Zimmerman the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas, Gilson, Katzenstein, Lovv, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Wilson, Zimmerman, yeas 8 nays none, and the motion was declared carried.

Transfer of  
funds.

Lovv moved that there be transferred from the Old Water fund, to the Main Sewer fund. One thousand dollars to be used to pay for the building of the new Residence at the Sewage Disposal Plant, seconded by Scott and carried.

Sanitary Sewer  
in Alley west  
of S. Liberty St.

Engineer Pfouts submitted plans for the construction of a Sanitary Sewer in the first Alley west of South Liberty street, from the first Alley south of Main street to the south side of Market street, and on motion of Scott seconded by Zimmerman the same was accepted.

Gilson moved that the Sewer Committee and Civil Engineer be instructed to contract for the building of the Sanitary Sewer in the first Alley west of South Liberty street under conditions that proper legal warrants be signed by the property owners having property abutting on said sewer seconded by Katzenstein the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gilson, Katzenstein, Lovv, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Wilson,

Zimmerman, yeas 8 nays none, and the motion was declared passed.

St Committee  
to contract for  
cleaning E. Main  
street.

On motion of Love seconded by Scott the Street and Alley Committee was authorized to contract with O. Shidler for cleaning the street and Alley intersections on East Main Street from Arch Avenue east to the C & P. R. R. for \$2.00 per week, and to sweep the Public Square and haul the dirt off the same for the privilege of using the City water to sprinkle <sup>said</sup> street.

Goeky damage  
cases.

Gilson moved that the proposition made to Council to settle the Susan and John Goeky damage cases for \$500.00 and the City to pay the costs, be accepted seconded by Scott, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gilson, Katzenstein, Love, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Wilson, Zimmerman, yeas 8 nays none and the motion was declared passed.

Report of  
Platting Committee.

To the City Council of Alliance, Ohio.

Gentlemen:-

Your committee on Platting, to which was referred the matter of opening South Park Avenue to Oxford, by leave to submit the following report:

We have carefully looked into the situation in all its phases with a view to the present and future welfare of the city. During the last few years, that part of the City bounded by Broadway, Oxford, Union Avenue and the Reservoir has been rapidly built up, only four or five vacant lots now remaining open, aside from those on which new houses are already being planned for. The proposed opening of Park Ave south to Oxford will be a convenience to that part of the City, and especially to residents of the immediate neighborhood and is much desired by them. The Reservoir cutting off an outlet to the east, makes this the only desirable route, with Oxford street, to the Park Avenue school building from the South-eastern portion of the Fifth ward, and we desire to call your attention to statement from Supt. of Public Schools giving his views on the matter, which statement is incorporated in, and made a part of, this report.

The proposition of the present owner of the property to dedicate to the uses of the City, 66 feet the necessary

land for said street, in consideration of the City filling up and tiling the lot adjoining, we consider a fair one, and one which it will be to the advantage of the City to accept.

We therefore recommend that the said proposition be accepted by the City, and the street opened in accordance with its provisions, and also, to avoid any cost to the City in the carrying out of said conditions we further recommend that the necessary filling be done from streets now being improved.
