

Alliance Ohio November 6th 1899

The Alliance City Council met in regular session in the City Hall. The meeting was called to order by President W. H. Morgan with the following members present Gable, Gilson, Katzenstein, Love, McDonald, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, W. H. Morgan, Absent R. B. Morgan, Present 11, Absent 1.

The minutes of the preceding meeting was read and approved.

Mayors Report.

Mayor Russler report for the month of October was read to Council showing fines & Licenses collected to the amount of \$109.00 and on motion of Gable seconded by Scott the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Damage Claim of W. W. Shaffer.

The following claim was presented to Council City of Alliance
D. W. W. Shaffer, Dr.

For Medical attendance, Loss of time, and Damages, on account of accident by falling near corner of Main and Mechanic streets, on Main street, Sept 14th 1899, caused by Water Curb boxes standing in sidewalk three inches above grade of said sidewalk, contrary to rules and Ordinances of the City \$50.00

Proposition to construct & operate Street Railroad,

The following Proposition was presented to Council Alliance Ohio October 31st 1899.

To the Honorable City Council.
Alliance, Ohio.

Gentlemen:

The undersigned hereby make the following proposition for the construction and operation of a Street railway to be constructed on the following route in the City of Alliance, Ohio, to wit: beginning at the east Corporation line of said City, thence west on Patterson Street to the west line of North Arch Avenue.

We will construct and operate a railway on said route in pursuance to the terms and conditions of the Ordinance passed by your City Council October 16th 1899, establishing said route and will sell tickets as follows:-

One single fare cash fare five cents.
Six tickets for twenty five cents.
Twenty five tickets for fifty cents.
Twenty five tickets for One dollar.

Resolution

The following Resolution was read to Council
Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that hereafter all departments of said City be and are hereby forbidden to purchase any supplies whatsoever for or on account of said City, and that in all cases requisitions for such supplies as may be needed by any department shall be prepared upon blanks to be furnished by the Clerk and filed with him. That in cases of Emergency said Clerk shall purchase such supplies forthwith upon the filing of such requisitions; otherwise the same are to be presented to Council for its action.

Scott moved that the foregoing Resolution be adopted seconded by Gilson and declared unanimously adopted.

Young Stairway
to be removed.

On motion of Scott seconded by Gable the City Clerk was instructed to notify Wm J Let Young to remove or cause to be removed within 30 days the stairway built on Prohibition^{Alley} to furnish access to the second floor in the building now occupied by McDonald & Hunt's Shoe Store.

St Commissioner

On motion of Scott seconded by Williams the Street Commissioner was instructed to do some work that is necessary on the South Liberty St hill.

Fill at the
Bridge near the
Water Works.

Love moved that the matter of filling at the Bridge near the Water Works be referred to the Engineer and Street Committee, seconded by Wilson and declared carried.

Council to

Scott moved that when this Council adjourns it be to meet Monday evening November 13th 1899. at the usual hour seconded by Gable and declared carried.

Sewer at intersection

Prospect sts.

On motion of Love seconded by Gilson the Storm Sewer at the intersection of Mechanic and Prospect Streets was referred to the Engineer and St Committee to report the cost of same at the next regular meeting.

Oxford Street
Street Crossing.

Scranton moved that the Street Commissioner be instructed to place Oxford st in proper condition and to also place a crossing at the intersection of Park

and Columbia Street, seconded by Gable and carried.
On motion of Gable seconded by Scott the City Clerk was instructed to notify the County Commissioners of the condition of the Bridge on Hester Avenue.

Cellar drain

On motion of Gilson seconded by Gable the Cellar drain at the Fogg Block on Main St was referred to the Engineer and Street Committee.

Clerk to purchase
Fire Hose.

Scott moved that the City Clerk be instructed to purchase 100 ft of small hose for the Fire Dept seconded by Gilson the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Gilson, Katzenstein, Lovv, McDonald, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, W. H. Morgan yeas 11 nays none and the motion was declared carried.

Sidewalk
Resolution.

A. Resolution to Construct Sidewalks. Read first time.
Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that a Brick sidewalk shall be constructed on the west side of South Arch Avenue from the north line of the property owned by Geo B. Hall to the south line of the property owned by Matilda Arthur in accordance with the laws and Ordinances of said City, regulating the construction of such walks, and the plans and specifications for the same now on file in the office of the City Civil Engineer and within the time limited by law. And the Mayor of said City is hereby required to cause notice of the passage of this resolution to be served upon the owner of each parcel of land abutting upon said sidewalk, in the manner required by law, and the same shall be returned to the Clerk of the said City to be by him preserved as provided by law.

Scott moved that the rules be suspended and the Resolution be read the second time seconded by Wilson the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Gilson, Katzenstein, Lovv, McDonald, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, W. H. Morgan, yeas 11 nays none the rules were declared suspended and the Resolution was read the second time; Scott moved that the rules be again suspended and the Resolution be read the third time seconded by Williams, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Gilson, Katzenstein, Lovv, McDonald, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman,

W. H. Morgan, yeas 11 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Resolution was read the third time, Scott moved that the Resolution be placed on its final passage seconded by Wilson, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Gilson, Katzenstein, Lovv, McDonald, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, W. H. Morgan yeas 11 nays none and the Resolution was declared passed.

Water Pipes in City Hall Basement.

On motion of Wilson seconded by Zimmerman the matter of fixing the water pipes in the Basement of the City Hall so as to prevent the water from freezing, was referred to the Committee on Buildings & Grounds.

City Printing.

The Printing Committee of the City Council of Alliance, Ohio reported favorable to renewing the present contract with the Standard Review Publishing Company for whatever legal advertising the City may find it necessary to do between now and the first of April 1900, the rate to be 60 per cent of the legal rate.

Wilson moved that the foregoing report of the Printing Committee be accepted seconded by Williams and declared carried.

Railroad Crossings.

A Resolution with reference to better protection at Railroad crossings in the City of Alliance, Ohio, was laid over until the next regular meeting on motion of Scranton seconded by Wilson.

Ordinance granting franchise to Alliance, Sebring & Saline Electric Railroad.

An Ordinance Granting to the Alliance, Sebring & Saline Electric Railway Company the right to construct, maintain and operate a street Railway on Patterson Street in the City of Alliance, Ohio, from the East Corporation line of said City to the west line of north Arch Avenue, and prescribing the terms and conditions upon which the same shall be done under said grant was read to Council the first time, and Scott moved that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance read the second time seconded by Gable the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Gilson, Katzenstein, Lovv, McDonald, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, W. H. Morgan, yeas 11, nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time; Scott moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance read

the third time seconded by Gable, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas, Gable, Gilson, Katzenstein, Love, McDonald, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, W. H. Morgan, yeas 11 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time, Scott moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by Gable, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Gilson, Katzenstein, Love, McDonald, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Wilson, Zimmerman, W. H. Morgan, yeas 11, nays none and the Ordinance was declared passed.

On motion of Scott seconded by Gilson Council adjourned.
