Alliance Ohio November 13th 1899.
The Alliance City Council met in adjourned session in the City Hall, President W. H. Morgan and President Protem Thomas Wilson being absent the meeting was called to order by the City Clerk, and on motion of Scott seconded by Williams, Mr A. B. Love was elected president protem of the meeting. Mr Love took the chair and the Roll was called with the following members present, Gable, Katzenstein, Love, W. Donald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Williams, Zimmerman, Absent Gilson, Wilson, W. H. Morgan Present 9, Absent 3.

The Minutes of the preceding meeting was read and approved.

Ordinance to
Improve Columbia
Street.

An Ordinance to improve Columbia Street from the East line of South Union Avenue to the west line of South Arch Avenue in the City of Alliance, Ohio, was read to Council the first time, and Scott moved that the rules be suspended on the Ordinance be read the second time, seconded by Williams, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Love, W. Donald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Williams, Zimmerman, yeas 9 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time. Scott moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance read the third time seconded by Gable, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Love, W. Donald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Williams, Zimmerman, yeas 9 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time. Scott moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by Williams, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Love, W. Donald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Williams, Zimmerman, yeas 9 nays none, and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Sidewalk
Resolution

A Resolution to construct a Sidewalk was read to Council the first time as follows:
Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that a flagstone sidewalk shall be constructed on the north side of East Patterson street

from the East line of City Lot number 2473 to the west line of City Lot number 2475; in accordance with the laws and Ordinances of said City, regulating the construction of such walks, and the plans and specifications for the same now on file in the office of the City Civil Engineer and within the time limited by law. And the Mayor of said City is hereby required to cause notice of the passage of this resolution to be served upon the owner of each parcel of land abutting upon said sidewalk, in the manner required by law, and the same shall be returned to the Clerk of the said City to be by him preserved as provided by law.

R. E. Morgan moved that the rules be suspended and the Resolution be read the second time seconded by Williams the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Love, McDonald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Zimmerman yeas 9 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Resolution was read the second time; Scott moved that the Rules be again suspended and the Resolution read the third time seconded by Gable the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Love, McDonald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Zimmerman yeas 9 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the resolution was read the third time, and Scott moved that the Resolution be placed on its final passage seconded by R. E. Morgan the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Love, McDonald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Scranton, Williams, Zimmerman, yeas 9 nays none and the Resolution was declared passed.

Ordinance to
abolish office of
City Marshal.

An Ordinance to abolish the office of City Marshal was read to Council the first time, and Scott moved that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance be read the second time, seconded by Gable the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Love, McDonald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Williams, Zimmerman, nays Scranton, yeas 8 nays 1, and the motion to suspend the rules was declared lost.

Surplus dirt
on Columbia St.

Scott moved that if there is a surplus of dirt on Columbia street over and above what is wanted by the abutting property owners and the amount it takes to

fill the City Lot on Columbia street, said surplus shall be placed on South Park Avenue near Offord street seconded by Seranton and declared carried.

Ordinance to prohibit the obstructing of Street, Alleys, Sidewalks etc.

An Ordinance to prohibit the obstructing of streets, Alleys, Sidewalks or public grounds, and to repeal certain Ordinances named therein, was read to Council the first time, and Scott moved that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance read the second time, seconded by Gable, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Lorr, McDonald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Williams, Zimmerman, yeas 9 nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the second time; Scott moved that the rules be again suspended and the Ordinance read the third time, seconded by Williams, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Lorr, McDonald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Williams, Zimmerman, yeas 9, nays none, the rules were declared suspended and the Ordinance was read the third time, and Scott moved that the Ordinance be placed on its final passage seconded by Gable, the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Gable, Katzenstein, Lorr, McDonald, R. E. Morgan, Scott, Seranton, Williams, Zimmerman, yeas 9 nays none, and the Ordinance was declared passed.
