

Alliance Ohio November 20<sup>th</sup> 1898.

The Alliance City Council met in regular session in the City Hall, the meeting was called to order by president protom Wilson with the following members present, Gilson, Katzenstein, Love, R. E. Morgan, Seranton, Wilson, Zimmerman, absent Gable, McDonald, Scott, Williams, W. H. Morgan, present 7, absent 5.

The minutes of the preceding meeting was read and approved.

Eng Report

City Engineer Pforte submitted a report on the cost of the South Freedom, South Union and North Union Avenue Improvements and on motion of Gilson seconded by Zimmerman the report was accepted.

State Street.

On motion of Katzenstein seconded by R. E. Morgan the drainage at the intersection of State st and Austman ave was referred to the Street Commissioner.

N. Liberty Ave.

On motion of R. E. Morgan <sup>sec by Seranton</sup> the drainage on North Liberty Ave near the Serance property was referred to the Street Commissioner.

S. Union Ave

On motion of Zimmerman seconded by Seranton the drainage on South Union Ave was referred to the Street Committee and City Engineer.

Marshal to notify parties to remove rubbish.

Gilson moved that the City Marshal be instructed to notify the parties responsible for the rubbish placed in the <sup>first</sup> Alley north of Main street, between Prohibition Alley and Freedom Ave, to remove the same forthwith, seconded by R. E. Morgan and declared carried.

Delinquent taxes

On motion of Love seconded by Gilson the matter of delinquent taxes on the property purchased by the City of Alliance from the Graham sisters, was referred to the City Solicitor for investigation.

Cleaning Main St.

Katzenstein moved that the matter of cleaning Main street during the winter be referred to the Street Committee seconded by Gilson and carried.

Water Pipes in City Building.

Zimmerman moved that the matter with reference to water pipes in the City Hall be referred to the Committee on Buildings & Grounds with power to act, seconded by R. E. Morgan and declared carried.

Ordinance to

An Ordinance to abolish the Office of City Marshal  
was read to Council the second time.
