

OCTOBER 26, 1914.

The City Council met in adjourned session, pursuant to adjournment, with President Reeves in the chair.

The roll being called, the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Barnard, Cathon, Grubb, Heidman, Knowles, Ryan. Present 6, absent 1.

Discussion as to salary of Superintendent of the Hospital, & matter of clerk.

The discussion arose as to the salary of the superintendent of the City Hospital, and a clerk for the City Hospital. Director of Public Service Troy objected to the raise in the superintendent's salary, and stated that the extra money should be used for a clerk. Auditor Silver explained the accounting system prepared for the Hospital, and said that the work came under his department and he saw no reasons for employing a clerk at the present time. The matter was referred back to the Director of Public Safety to amend the recommendations. The amended recommendations without the clerk for the Hospital, were submitted.

The following proposition was submitted:

Platting of 23rd street from first alley east of Miller Ave. to Miller Property.

In connection with the platting of 23rd Street from the first alley east of Miller Avenue to the east line of my property, I further agree, in addition to putting the said street to grade to be established from my east line to Miller Avenue, if this plat is accepted by the City of Alliance, to grade said street to its full width within six months from the acceptance of said plat to conform to the driveway graded out by me on said street from my east lot line to Union Avenue, and put said portion of said street in as good a condition as it was before I excavated for said drive.
